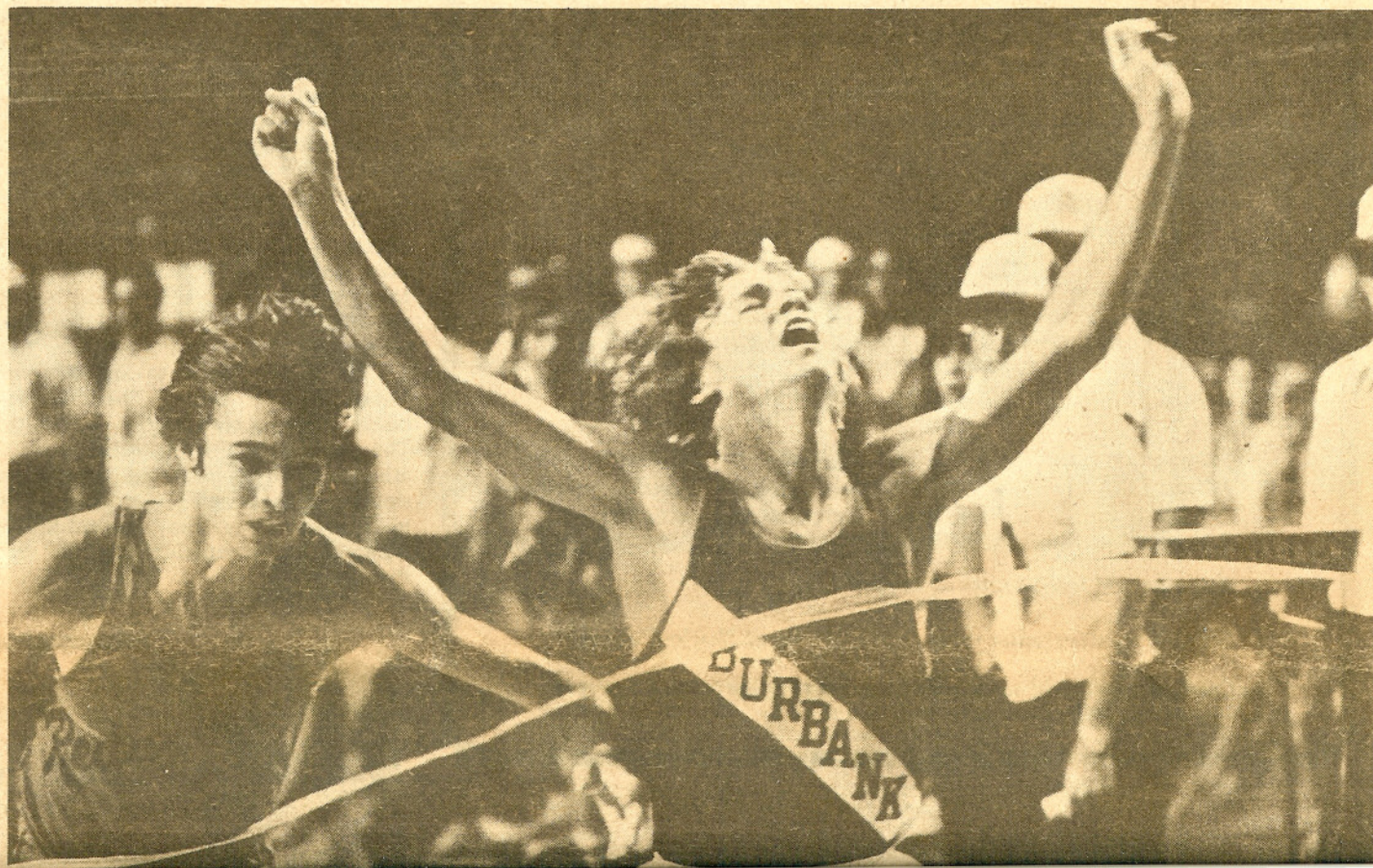

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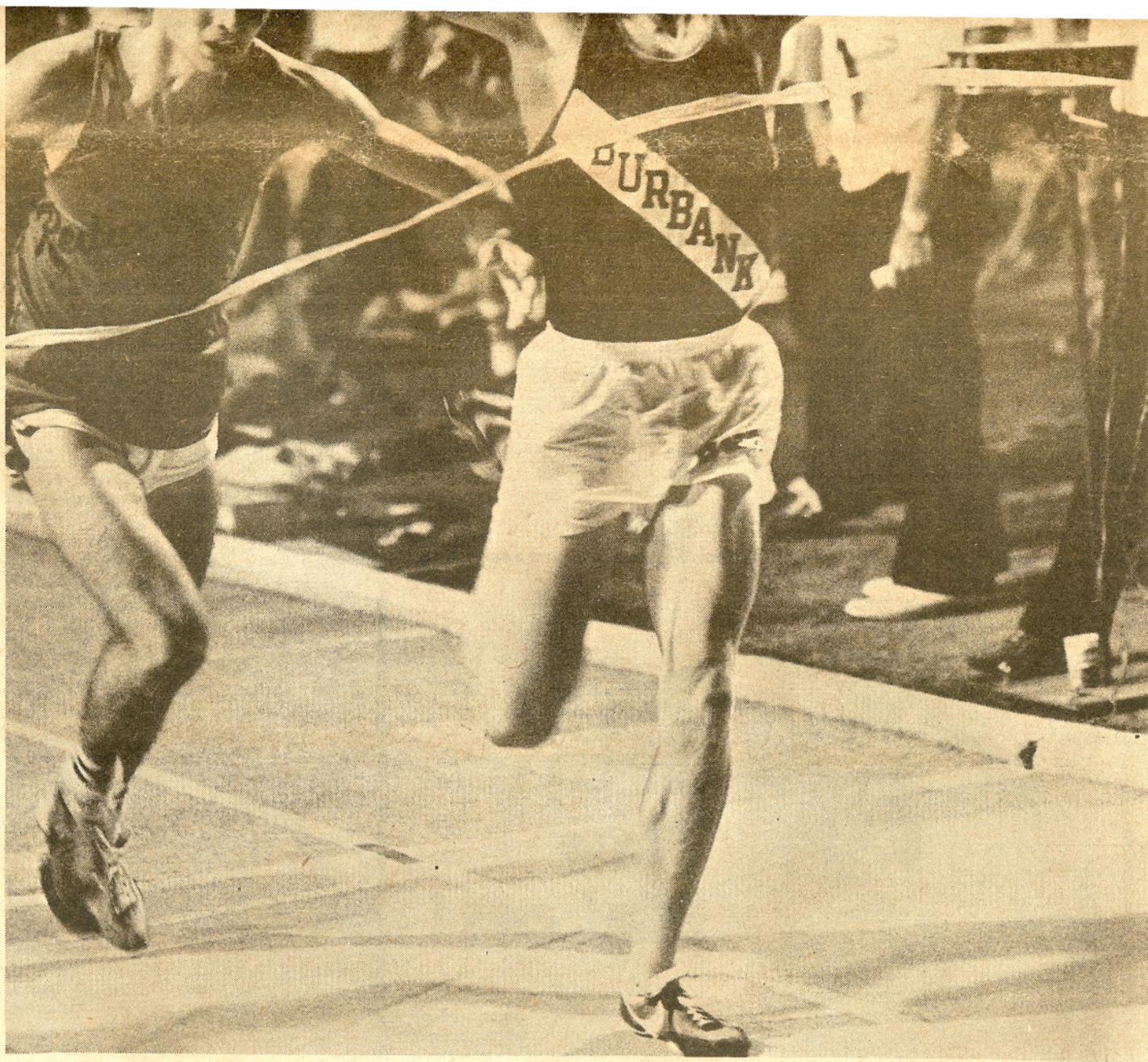

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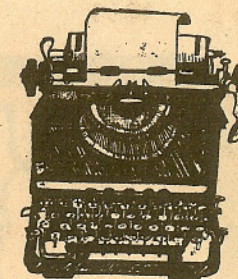

from the editor...



If you've been a regular subscriber you are aware of how I feel about track clubs. I think they are pretty important and feel that they must become increasingly important if the U.S. is to provide adequate opportunity for our athletes to reach their potential.

The track club situation in the U.S. must continue to improve at a rapid rate if American athletes are to keep pace with other nations. It's exciting to see the opportunities being provided by the Athletics West club, Santa Monica Track Club, LA Naturite club and others. Much more can still be done.

Athletes in school have it made, they are provided with: coaches, trainers, managers, facilities, equipment, transportation, part time jobs, time to train, medical facilities, publicity and a solidly structured organization to take care of them. After graduation, what happens? The athlete who had everything working for his athletic development now has nothing. The majority of them retire, then, at age 21. Those who do continue to pursue their track and field pursuits are left to frustratingly fend for themselves.

It doesn't have to be this way. Things can be better. They must get better. A strong club program can do this. The clubs have the potential to supply athletes with the needed organization similar to that which they experienced in college. They can concentrate on training and competing to best reach their potential.

My employer (yes, I have to work for a living - we like to eat, too), Fresno Pacific College, has awarded me a summer grant of one month's salary to study the feasibility of the college becoming involved in the operation of a track club. Because of the nature of the grant the study will center around curriculum development of the intercollegiate track program at Fresno Pacific and how it might work within the framework of a track club. This study will also, hopefully, lead to an exploration of various models for structuring track clubs.

Things a college might do for a track club are: coaching, office space and secretarial help, facilities, equipment, health center, weight training room, lockers and showers, dorms and cafeteria use, placement center. In effect it could provide all those things that were available to collegians.

What would a track club do for an institution in return? All those same things a college team does for a school: publicity; spirit; recreational, developmental and competitive opportunities for undergraduates and graduates.

The clubs in the U.S. have a long way to go before they are being all they can. I hope the results of my study will give and added push. I'll have a report at the end of the summer.

TEAM SPOTLIGHT

San Jose Cindergals

The San Jose Cindergals track club has been a consistent national level "powerhouse" in both track & field and cross country. The Cindergals have had at least one individual on international teams since 1968. Last season they were represented by Ann Regan in the USA-USSR Junior meet; Kris Costello and Vicky Bray in the USA-Canada-Japan Junior competition. Some of the biggest individual achievements have been Francie Larrieu winning the 1972 Olympic 1500 Meter Trials and Cindy Poor winning the 1976 Olympic 1500 Meter Trials.

The club was started by Augie Argabright in 1967. The purpose of the club has been to give girls the chance to participate beyond the recreation or school level, and to be competitive on a national level. Augie is head coach and director. Assistant coaches are Jim Tisano and Mark Eutenier. All three are

graduates of San Jose State and all now also coach at West Valley College in Saratoga.

All girls in the area who are interested in competing are welcome in the Cindergals. There are usually about 60 at any one time. These are about equally divided between the young age groups and the Jr-Sr division women. 70% of the competitors are distance runners. About 20% are jumpers/hurdlers and about 10% are in weight events. Just some of the more outstanding current members include: Ann Regan, Roxanne Bier, Marquita Belk, Kris Costello, Vicky Bray, Ann Wotherspoon, Karen Taylor, Tracy Weber, Cheri Williams, Pam Bowers, Diane Figliomeni, Cathy Demmelmaier, Kathy Perkins, Maria King, Kerry Brogan, Karla Schweickardt, Joanne Shearer.

To be on the Cindergals team one must practice daily with the team. Coach

Argabright doesn't believe in taking credit for someone that doesn't train with the team. The Cindergals are a very close group and Augie feels the reason for this closeness is because they practice together and don't pick up people from all over the area to join them at the "national meets."

During the track season many of the girls 14 and over compete for their high schools. Although they compete for their high schools they are coached by the Cindergal coaching staff of Augie Argabright—400 meters and up, Jim Tisano—hurdles and jumps, and Mark Eutenier—weight events.

The club's major fund raising activity is a run-a-thon. The major expenditure is usually the cross country nationals. Each girl is obligated to bring in \$100 to the club. Most of this obligation is used for travel expenses to national meets or big invitationals.

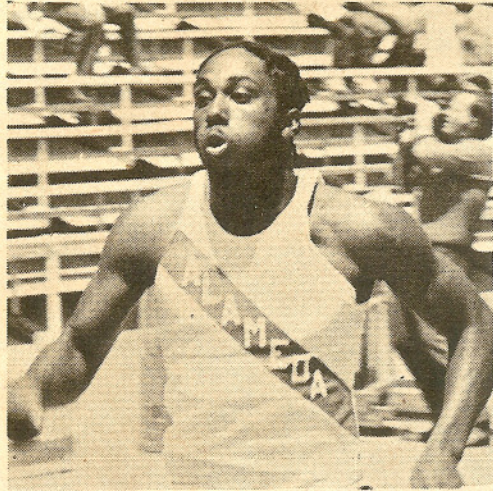

Pasadena City College, with sophomore Kenny Hays winning the long jump at a National JC record-equaling 26-2½, won the team title in the State Community College championships, Saturday, May 27, at Bakersfield College.

The Lancers were locked in a close team battle with San Jose and Laney but the difference was in the long jump and triple jump. Hays, in addition to equaling the 10 year old record of Sacramento's Henry Hines in the long jump, also set a meet record of 51-7½ in winning the triple jump.

Pasadena was also second in the long jump with Sidney Mitchell at 25-7¼ and the triple jump with Gary Williams at 50-2½.

Thirty-six of Pasadena's 64 points came in two horizontal jumps. San Jose's total of 59 points was good enough for second and Alameda landed third with 48.

Houston McTear of Cerritos won as he pleased in the 100 meters. After getting off to his customary good start, he saw that he had the race well in hand at 80 meters and eased into the tape with a time of 10.32 in warm windless conditions. Derald Harris of Alameda, second in 10.47, came back to win the 200 in 20.81.

Ronny Ray Williams of Pierce got off to a good lead in the 400 and won easily in 45.7.

In the 3,000 meter steeplechase, Glendale's Mark Lewis, a freshman from Eagle Rock, was leading until the final water jump when he tripped and tumbled headfirst into the water. After remaining submerged for two or three seconds he got up but by that time Tim Ferrell of American River had sprinted away to win in 8:58.2. Lewis was second in 9:02.8.

As for his immediate plans? Dokie says, "Become a member of the USA Jr. Mens National Team during this summer.

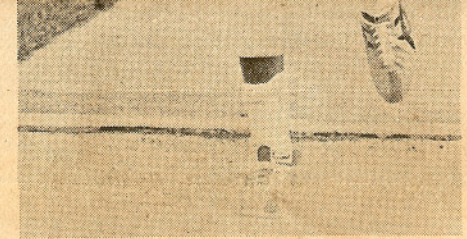

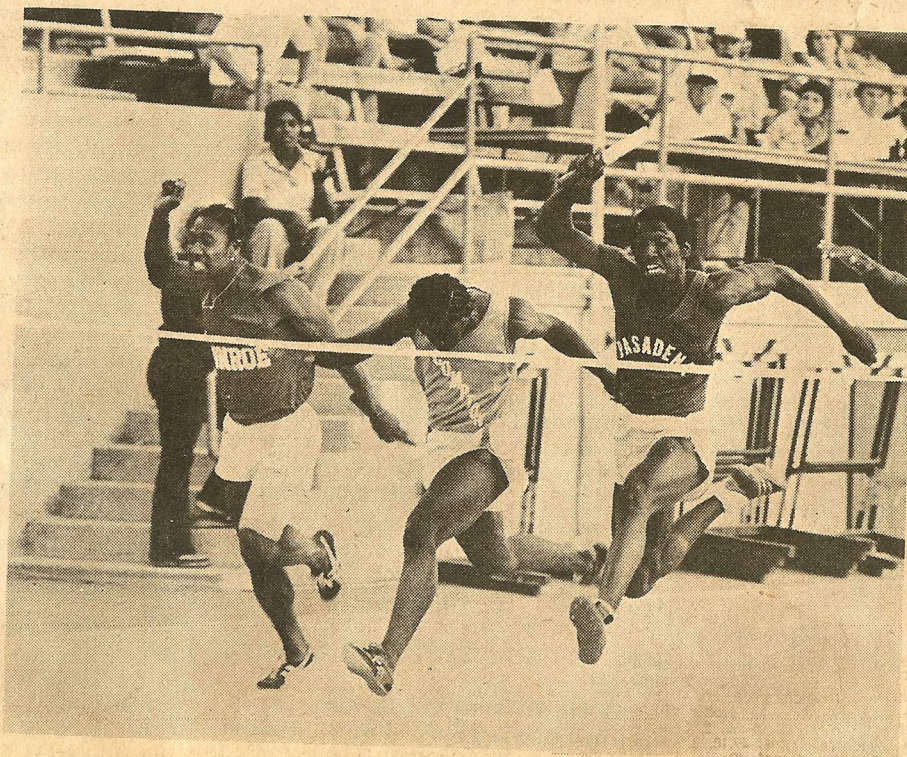

The 60th Annual California State Meet at Bakersfield Memorial Stadium will go down in history as one of the finest high school meets ever. There were many remarkable performances, but the four new national records set the tone for this the greatest high school meet in America as witnessed by 11,500 spectators.

Banning of Wilmington in the Los Angeles Section with the team of Darryl Davis(49.3), Sam Caesar(48.1), Chris Blaylock(47.4), and Devin Lewis(46.8) set a new national record in the boys mile relay with a sensational 3:11.57 electronic timing, which is rounded up to 3:11.6. The old record of 3:11.8 was set by Spring Branch Memorial, Houston, Texas, on April 1, 1967. It was tied twice by Killian, Miami, Florida on May 10, 1969, and Madison, Houston, Texas on May 1, 1976. The Killian team was anchored by future Olympian Larry Black in 46.2. Rod Bethany of Fontana anchored his team to third place behind Banning with a sizzling split of 45.9. In the qualifying heats, Sacramento ran 3:16.77, but failed to qualify.

Anthony Curran(Crespi, Encino) set a new national pole vault record of 17-5¼. The bar at one end came off the peg it was resting on and came to rest on top of the standard. The commissioner of the C.I.F., Bill Russell, decided to submit it as a national record, as there is no rule in the high school rule book covering this occurrence. The old national record was 16-10 set by Randy Hall (Port Lavaca, Texas) in 1977. Curran's mark is also the best ever by a prep in any competition. Olympian Casey Carrigan(Orting, Washington) vaulted 17-4¾

at the Golden West Invitational on June 14, 1969, in Sacramento. Curran opened at 15-2, missed once at 16-3, then made 16-9 and 17-0½ on his first attempt. His record vault came on his third attempt. He failed to improve when the bar was moved to 17-7. The vaulters encountered a problem with water in the pit. They got soaked everytime they landed.

Ann Regan(Camden, San Jose) broke her own national record of 2:08.0 set at last year's meet with an easy 2:07.93. Ann came through the quarter in 62.8. Linda Goen(North, Bakersfield) was not able to provide the competition she did last year, so Ann had this race to herself. Michelle Bush(Rolling Hills) closed quickly to capture second in 2:10.46.

Kris Costello(Lynbrook, Cupertino), who is going to attend the University of Oregon, tied the national record of Laverne Palmer(Dillard, Ft. Lauderdale) in the girls 110 yard low hurdles with 13.83, while defending her title.

Cheri Williams(Livermore), who is also going to Oregon, set a new state record in the girls two mile run with 10:17.71. She has a pending national record of 10:09.8, which she set in qualifying for the State Meet a week earlier. But in contrast to her lonely race at the North Coast Section, she had the company of Susie Meek(Palos Verdes) this night. Meek led the first four laps in 73, 2:30, 3:49, and 5:08. Then during the fifth lap Williams took command with splits of 6:27, 7:49, and 9:09. The old state record was set last year by Roxanne Bier(Independence, San Jose) in 10:37.7. Bier finished third in 10:44, while Meek also broke the old mark with a fine 10:23.54.

Williams came back to set another state record in the girls mile run—4:44.95. It broke the old record of 4:47.8 set by Linda Goen(North, Bakersfield) in the 1977 state meet. Williams'

mile is the second fastest in the United States in 1978. Cheryl Flowers(Valhalla, El Cahon) led the first two laps in 69.3 and 2:24.6. Then Williams took over the third lap in 3:40.1. Susie Meek was again second in 4:49.65.

Fremont(Los Angeles) with the team of Joanna Harper(57.5), Vanessa Frazier(58.5), Brenda Cole(58.6), and Glenda Beshears(56.7) set a new state record in the girls mile relay at 3:51.29. Crawford(San Diego) at 3:51.93, also went under the old standard of 3:52.1 set by Locke(Los Angeles) last year. The fastest split of 55.8 was recorded by Valerie Brisco(Locke) in anchoring her team to a 5th place finish. The pre-meet favorite Berkeley failed to qualify.

Sophomore Sue McNeal(Carlsbad) set a new state record in the girls high jump with 5-10¼. The old record(5-10) was set by Kari Gosswiller(Upland) in 1976. McNeal's jump was equal to the 4th best jump of all time.

Arlise Emerson(Westminister) set a new state record of 54.3 in the girls 440 yard dash. Emerson also broke the old record in the heats. Valerie Brisco, the favorite from Locke, went out too fast and faded in the stretch.

Jordan of Los Angeles was the upset winner in the girls 440 relay. Crawford(San Diego) dropped the baton at the second exchange, which was the same location that pre-meet favorite Berkeley dropped theirs in the trials.

El Cerrito upset Gardena in the boys 440 yard relay despite starting in lane 9. It was a pleasant surprise as El Cerrito didn't have a sprint superstar, but good coaching and a positive attitude pulled it off.

Dave Mack (Locke, L.A.) a last minute substitution in the 880 led from start to finish. His first quarter was 53.8. The pre-meet favorite, Mike White (Richmond) started too slowly and only finished fourth, after being third last

year. Big surprise was fast improving sophomore Pete Quinones(Tulare Union) who pulled in second.

Kelia Bolton(Andrew Hill, San Jose) dominated the girls sprints and led her team to the girls championship. She is going to Cal Berkeley, and is interested in studying law. Freida Cobbs(Berkeley) didn't qualify for the finals of the 100 because five of the top nine girls were placed in the third heat. The electronic times were not converted to hand times when the heat assignments were made.

Dokie Williams(El Camino, Ocean-side) led his team to the boys title with his victories in the triple jump(50-4¼) and long jump(25-1¼).

Giant Dave Porath(Atwater), who is going to Cal Berkeley, doubled in the discus(199-5) and shot put(65-10¾) as expected. His Brian Oldfield spin technique in the shot put has proven very effective.

Junior Mike Sanford of Pasadena doubled in the 100 and 220 despite experiencing some leg difficulties in the stretch of the 220.

Milan Stewart(West Covina) upset Philip Johnson(Gardena) in the 120 highs, as Philip hit the first hurdle.

Junior Jeff Nelson(Burbank) out-kicked veteran internationalist Rod Berry (Redwood, Larkspur), who wore his USA sweats to the meet. Carmelo Rios (Lennox) led the first lap in 67.4. Nelson took over the second lap in 2:15.4. Junior Tom Downs(Skyline, Oakland) led the third lap in 3:23.9. Nelson hit the mile in 4:32.7 and the 1¼ in 5:41.4. Then Berry challenged at 1½ miles in 6:49.3 and 1¾ in 7:56.3, with Nelson on his shoulder. It was reminiscent of the super battle between Eric Hulst and Ralph Serna in San Diego during the 1975 meet.

Junior Bill Green(Cubberley, Palo Also) ran away from a fine 440 field in 46.77. He looks like a great prospect.

However, he did have difficulty in the 220 finishing ninth with insufficient rest (less than 20 minutes). The meet officials should allow more time between the 440 and 220.

Gary Lee (Poly, Long Beach) came from nowhere to surprise the 330 low hurdle field in 36.58. Willie Curran (Crespi, Encino) failed to qualify for the final.

Paul Medvin (University, Los Angeles) ran a fine 4:08.91 to win the mile. Most of the runners showed the strain of running so fast the night before in the fastest qualifying ever. Burt Shirley (Notre Dame) was the fastest non-qualifier in state meet history at 4:11.26.

TUTTLE'S TRACK TOPICS

Much has been written concerning pre-marathon training. By now nearly every runner has a basic idea of how to prepare for a long race. We've been told of carbohydrate loading, tapering off the miles, drinking of fluids, and how to train for the race. The runner is adequately educated concerning the upcoming race, and usually gets through the ordeal with a tolerable amount of stress and pain.

Every book takes the runner right up to "the race." However, where is the next chapter, concerning the day after?

It's not there - the book ends. Yet the days after a race are very important in a runner's life.

It's a fact that a tremendous percentage of injuries occur 1-14 days after a long, hard race. Very few of these injuries are caused by the actual marathon. They are caused by the effects of the marathon on the body, and a too quick return to training.

In order to get through this period of time injury-free, there are several rules that a knowledgeable runner should follow.

First of all, consider the period after a long race as a running vacation — your reward for running so far. If it hurts to jog, don't. Give your body and your mind the rest they need and deserve. Don't feel guilty for cutting down the mileage and the time being spent; that's your reward for the effort.

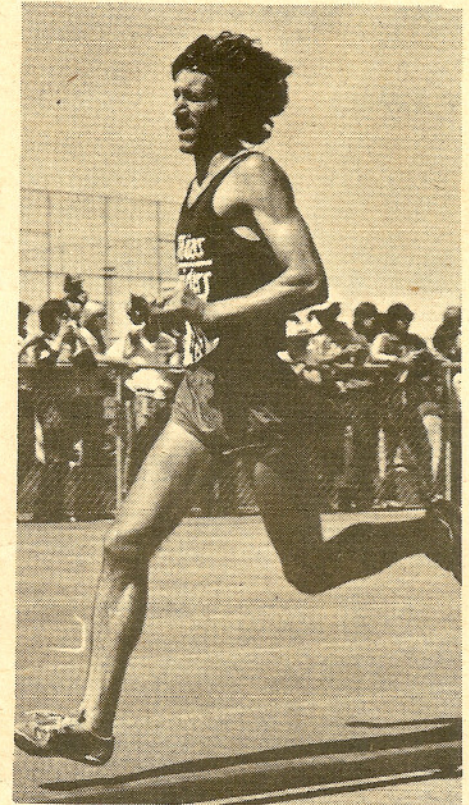
Sooner or later, however, you must get back into a running program. In order to come back gently, you might try this program:

On the first day, do not run. On the second and third days, run easy — one-tenth of your average daily mileage. On the fourth and fifth days, run two-

tenths and on the sixth and seventh days run three-tenths. Continue this pattern until you are running full mileage on the 19th and 20th days. This slow recovery should ensure a healthy return to running.

In addition, there are several important points to remember during the immediate days after a race. First, you should religiously do flexibility stretching of the legs to help gain back the muscle tone. Second, you should concentrate on eating protein foods for a couple of days in order to rebuild the muscle tissues that have been destroyed. Third, you should mentally detach yourself from running competitively. Don't plan on running any race within 30 days after a long race of you'll find yourself pushing too early to get back into shape. A three month period between actual marathons seems to be ideal.

Fourth, the soreness in the legs felt immediately after the race can be eased considerably with warm baths, saunas, jacuzzis, hot tubs, and massages. Also, while resting, keep the legs elevated to drain the lactic acid out of the leg muscles. The lactic acid build-up is what causes most of the stiffness. And don't forget to stretch!



After a race run on a warm day, many fluids should be taken. For at least 24 hours after the race, you should make a strong effort to replenish the lost fluids and minerals. The best fluids are fruit drinks, ERG, Body Punch, water, mineral water, and beer.

Just keep in mind that no matter how good you may feel, the week after a long race is a potentially dangerous period and should be treated with respect.

The 68th Bay-to-Breakers Race was record size with approximately 14,000 running, of which 9,738 were officially entered.

This is truly the biggest and wildest footrace in the nation. It seems this year's race had many starting lines. The official starting line, which is located on Howard Road between Spear and Main, was literally jam-packed and many runners were unable to reach

the line because of the huge crowd. There were thousands of people starting the race from the official line to various points along the course.

Any serious runner who has run this race knows that getting a good start is almost impossible. The starting area is much too small to handle the number of competitors, and with people lining up hours before the race, there isn't any room for serious runners to find a good spot after their pre-race warm-up.

It seems a better plan could be made for the start, perhaps changing the course or seeding runners into sections using previously acquired times. Another suggestion would be to have the better runners start one block over at the same time and then feed back onto the course after paralleling it for several blocks.

This year's winner was Gerard Barrett of Australia. He broke the course record of 37:03 set in 1977 by Paul Geis. Barrett clocked 35:17, smashing the record.

Many runners and spectators feel Barrett's time should not be allowed as a record because he started approximately 200 yards ahead of the start. In fact, many of the top finishers did not start on the official starting line.

Second place finisher, Charlie Gray of Houston, was over a minute behind Barrett in 36:25. Third place went to West Valley Track Club's Mike Pinocci in 37:17. Fourth place was Aussie Rob de Castella in 37:38 and rounding out the top five was Tony Ramirez of the Fresno Pacific Track Club, clocking 37:41.

The first woman to cross the finish line was San Carlos Junior High teacher Skip Swannack of the Woodside Striders. She timed 47:00, finishing 280th overall.

As usual, many zany characters were seen running in the race from coneheads to a 26-legged centipede.

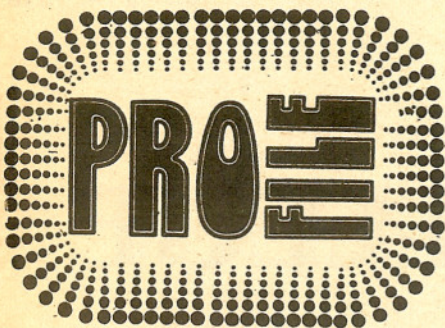

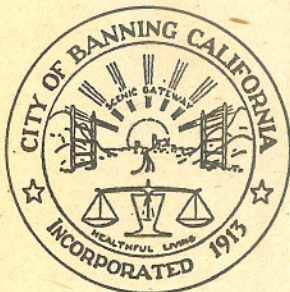

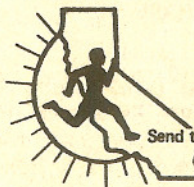

PRE! is a book for them, and for anyone who marvelled, during that special era, at the accomplishments of this magnificent athlete.

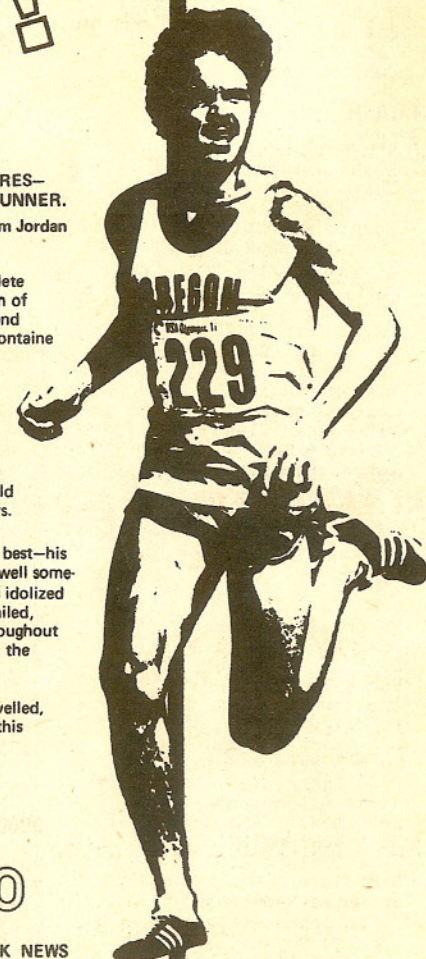

Like other big track meets held on dirt running surfaces, the West Coast Relays are experiencing difficulties in attracting both big name athletes and the large crowds that come with them. 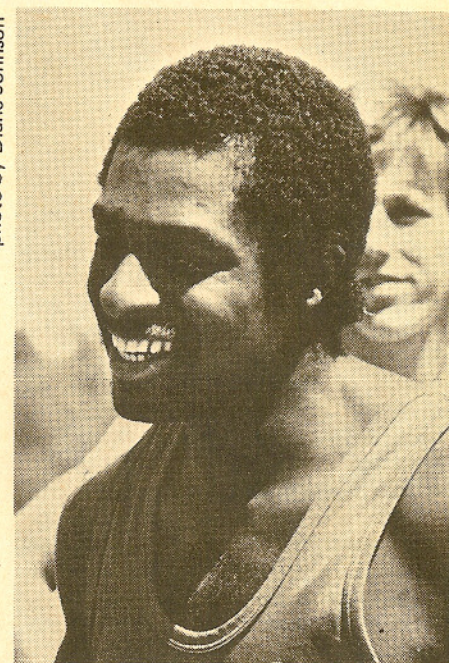
first lap. Cheri Williams of Livermore ran a state best 4:53.3 mile in the high school girls mile in Friday's very windy conditions.

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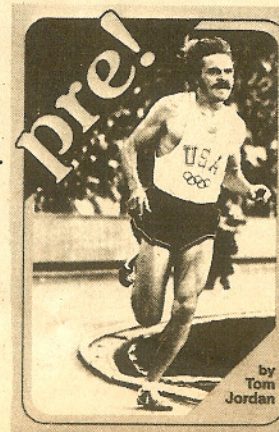

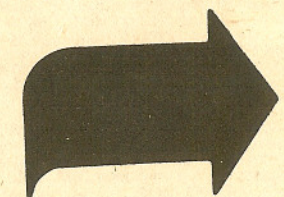

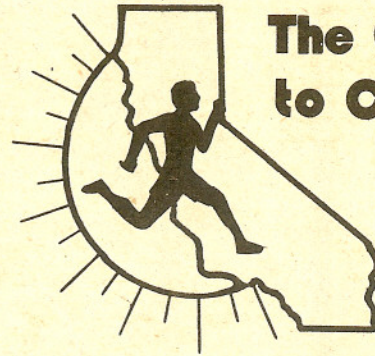
