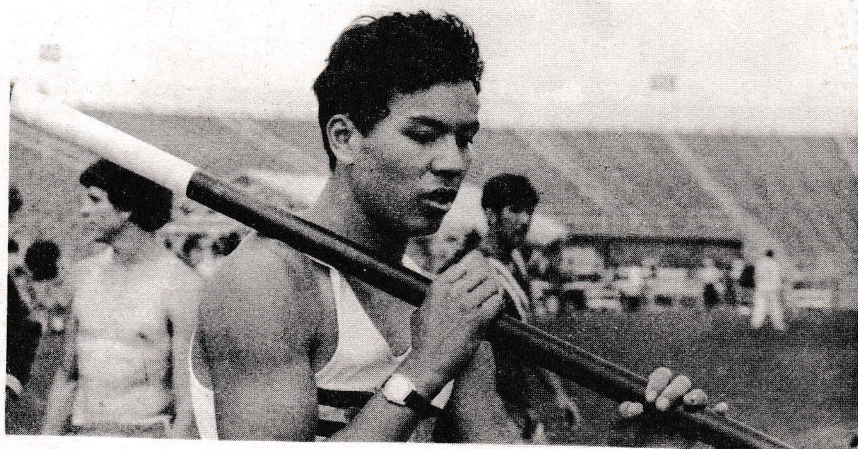

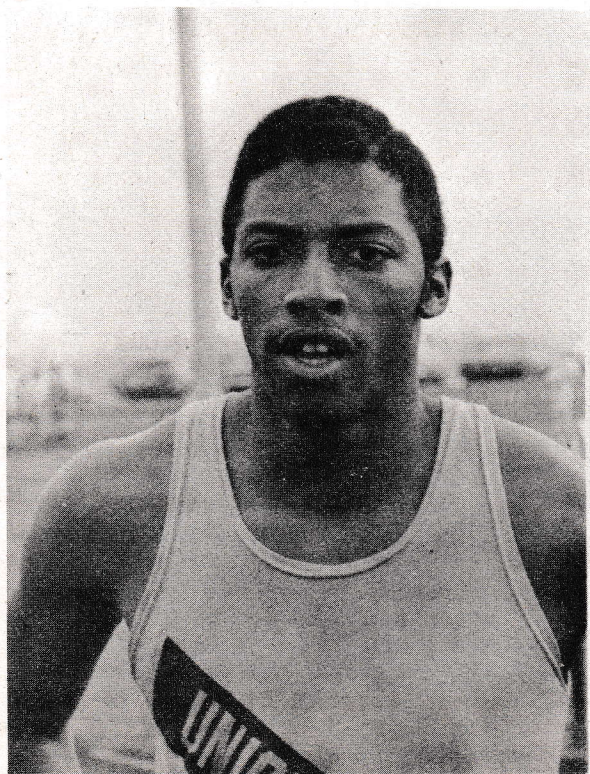

PIAA STATE MEET - 5/23/70

Some months ago Pa. Track and Field Review used on its cover a photograph of Gene White, Bristol. Gene, a soft-spoken young man whose physical size belies his tremendous strengths (5-11, 143 lbs.) came through this meet a triple winner. He captured the Class B high jump (6-6), the triple jump (45-3 1/2), and the long jump (23-3 1/4). Gene will enter Penn State this fall.

Mark Mondschein, Haverford, won the pole vault with a record vault of 14'2 1/2". Mark, who seems to perform better under adversity appeared cool and calm throughout the competition. In fact, papa Mondschein (Field Coach, Univ. of Penna.) looked more nervous than Mark, pacing the sidelines like an expectant father pacing the maternity corridors. Mark's younger brother, Brian, a sophomore at Haverford, placed fourth with a vault of 13'3".

Dennis Red, Mechanicsburg, finished second with a vault of 13'6" and missed three times at 14 feet. Dennis' best this year was 13'9".

The Class B Pole Vault was won by Carlton Huff of Nazareth (13-9). Cliff Brown of Middletown finished second.

Husky Ron Semkiw of Baldwin was the winner in the Class A Shot. Semkiw put the twelve pound ball 58-7, not bad for a sophomore.

The Class A Javelin was won by John Clark, Titusville, with a throw of 222-3. John's best throw prior to the state meet was 199-0. Warren's Ed O'Neil was second.

The Class B Discus was won by Ty Higgins, Lower Moreland, with a heave of 180-7. This mark places Ty as the best discus thrower in the history of PIAA Track and Field. Higgins' old mark was 168-9 1/2. Ty also placed second in the shot put which was won by Union's James Horney.

The Class A High Jump title was snared by Robert Young, Woodrow Wilson, with a leap of 6-6 1/2. We at Pa. Track and Field Review were surprised at the outcome of this event because we did not have Bob's name or performance this past season in our chronological listings.

James Leonard, Perry, won the triple jump with a 47-6 1/2 effort. William Rea, Elizabeth Forward was second.

North Allegheny, which ran a fantastic 7:46.3 for the two-mile relay earlier in the season, won the Class A event in an excellent time of 7:47.0. Penn Hills zipped off a 7:44.1 this year, which puts them in first nationally, but finished second to North Allegheny at the PIAA Meet in 7:48.8.

Ron Miller of Unionville tied the Class B - 100 yard dash record in 9.9. Ron's best this year was a 9.7. Miller also placed second in the 220 - won by Freeport's Gary Risch.

The Class A 100 yard dash title went to a powerful speedster, Randy Barnes of Abington. Barnes' time was 9.8 only one-tenth of a second off of his best. Wilson's Wayne Hassler was second, with Mt. Carmel's Gary Dimminick, third.

In the Class A 880 and mile relays it was Abington and Wissahickon respectively, with times of 1:28.6 and 3:16.8. Abington could have lowered its time considerably by executing smoother baton passes, they nonetheless finished a good ten yards ahead of the second place team.

Wissahickon's mile relay victory was perhaps the most exciting race of the day. Challenged early by Mt. Lebanon and William Tennent, the lead see-sawed several times until Wissahickon's runners found high gear and were pushed to new state record of 3:16.8, which is the second fastest in Pa. history.

Other Class A winners were: John Reihner, Washington, (Discus 168-9); Mike Haluszcak, Montour, (Long jump 22-2 1/2); Julius Myers, Pitts Schenley, (180 yard lows - 19.8); Rich Matrunick, Dery Area, (880 yard dash - 1:54.6); Bill Johnson, Chichester, (220 yard dash - 21.7); Ed Marsteller, Baldwin, (440 yard dash - 49.0)½ Bruce McCutcheon, Penncrest, (120 yard highs - 14.6); Jim Koster, Ridley, (2 mile - 9:23.1); a new

state mark and Gary Gittings, Baldwin, (Mile - 4:17.8). Gary also finished second in the 880.

MY LOOK AT TRACK ...by Todd H. Jones

PIAA STATE MEET HAPPENINGS - How about that Class B pole vault?? Four boys cleared 13 feet for a virtual first-place tie but the "winning" height of 12-6 gave the championship to Nazareth's Carlton Huff. It was one of the strangest incidents in PIAA track history. There's not room in this report to explain everything that occurred in the "B" vault but according to the rules Huff and Middletown's Cliff Brown were called upon to vault in a "sudden death" showdown. Neither boy could clear 13-3 so the bar was lowered to 13 feet. Again neither boy was successful. However, at 12-6 Huff was fortunate to clear the bar. Brown missed and the title belonged to Huff who became the first-ever track state champ in Nazareth High history. It was quite an achievement for the Nazareth star because on the Wednesday before the state meet he broke his "Skypole" in practice and suffered a long cut on his stomach (not serious). Huff managed to secure a "Catapole" from LNL rival, Wilson Boro High. The state meet, by the way, was the 13th meet of the season for Huff who obviously isn't superstitious.

.....My choice for "athlete of the year" is Bristol's Gene White who had a rare "off" day but still managed a triple win in the Class B jumps for the second straight year. White has received an invitation to compete in the 11th annual Golden West Invitational at Sacramento, California on June 20. If he has a good day in Sacramento he could place well in the high jump, long jump and triple jump events where he's done 6-9, 24-6 and 48-9 1/4. Penn State coach Harry Groves is a happy man because the Bristol star will be attending the Nittany Lion campus this coming season.

.....Several District XI performers had good days at the PIAA meet. Wilson Boro's Dim Alestas became the first-ever District triple jumper to surpass the 45-foot mark when he leaped 45' 3/4" for a second place behind Gene White. Palmerton's Bruce Koehler high jumped 6'5" for a school record but again Mr. White was just too much as he won the event with a 6-6 effort. Pottsville's Jim Messina put on a great stretch drive to run a 1:57.0 in the Class A 880 - good enough for a 5th place and a new school standard.

.....LEHIGH VALLEY REPORT - The Pole Vault picture this past season was strong with Bethlehem Freedom's Glenn Hauke doing 13-9 and Nazareth's Carlton Huff hitting the 13-0 mark. Several younger vaulters to watch next year are Notre Dame's frosh, Mike Shriver who placed in the PCIAA Class B championships with an 11-0 effort. Catasauqua's soph, Jeff Robbins cleared 12-0 this year but had a best practice mark of 12-6.

.....My Lehigh Valley "Athlete of the Year" is Bruce Koehler of Palmerton - a small school of some 475 students which competes in the Lehigh Valley League. Koehler, a 6-0, 170-pound all-around athlete, is headed to Kutztown State College. This past spring he also starred in the long jump and shot put events. He was in 19-foot range consistently as a horizontal jumper and hit 50'9 1/2" in the shot. Koehler won two straight LVL and District XI high jump titles and came through with a tremendous 6-5 effort at the state meet. His 6-5 is even more amazing when you realize that Koehler was unable to practice all week before the states due to an injury.
