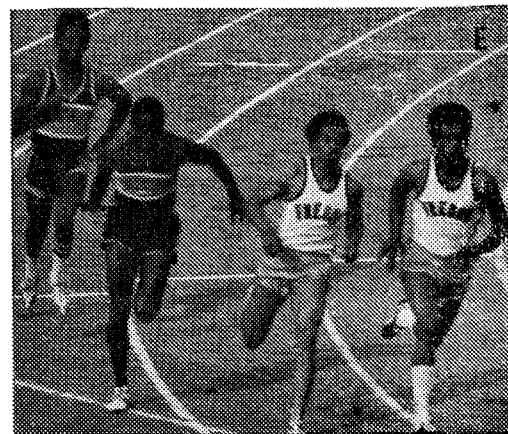
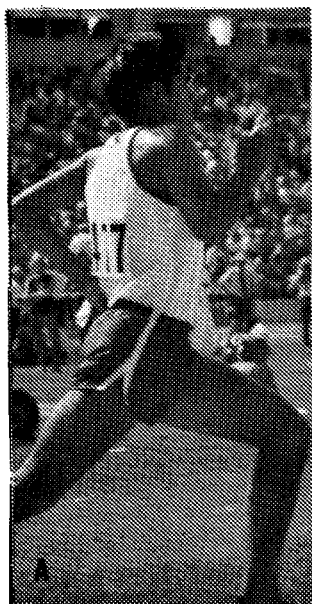

## MEET VALLEY COACH

BLANCH I. 'BIB' BRENNER: How many girl's and women's track coaches do you know in the Valley? Well, there's Dale Knox of the Wasco Wildcats, Brad Tomasini and Jim Arriaga of the Valley Bells and Jim Kaprelian in Clovis. There's Jean Snyder at Reedley High School and Mary Brown at San Joaquin Memorial and the other various secondary programs. But one coach has had particular success in coaching young ladies from the Valley, especially in the difficult weight events, and that is Blanche "Bib" Brenner; founder and coach of the Fresno Elans Track Club.

The FETC won the Central California AAU Girl's Division Championships in 1972 and the 12-13 Division in 1968. Each year several team members receive national ranking status. Last year Lynn Graham was third best U. S. shot putter; Iva Wright was 9th and Yvette Brownlee was 10th. In the discus Wright was ranked seventh and Brownlee 17th. So far this year the Elans have won Starting Line's girl's shot put postal competition with a total distance of 129-8 1/2 (Iva Wright 47-11 1/2, Yvette Brownlee 42-8 3/4, Debra Haynes 39-0 1/4); and placed second in the discus with 397-7 (Wright 153-5, Brownlee 136-9, Haynes 107-5).

Blanche Brenner, the workhorse behind the Fresno Elans T. C., was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania where she attended West Philadelphia High School and participated in women's softball, tennis and basketball. She then completed her formal education at West Chester State Teachers College in Pennsylvania.

"Bib," as she's known to her friends, has coached Junior High track and field at Irwin Junior High eleven years and Cooper Junior High one year. She organized the West Fresno T. C. in 1969 which became the Fresno Elans Track Club in 1970 and is presently the head coach of the Elans. Most evenings find Coach Brenner and her many promising athletes working out at Einstein Playground. It is "Bib" who does the organizing, work, and fund raising that keeps the Elans going.

Her ideas and philosophies have been developed over the years working with all levels of girl's track and field; including national caliber athletes. "I believe in weight training for girls. It does not make for a muscle-bound group, but does develop needed strength. We have found that the girls are less susceptible to muscle injuries, too.

"I feel that the girls, ages 11-20 should compete against themselves. They should be trying to improve their marks every time they compete. We try not to over emphasize winning. Each girl should be trying her best to win, but if she is beaten, it should be because the other girl was better, not because she didn't do her best. Sure, we want the girls to win, but not at any cost. I feel that the true champions in any sport must have the desire and dedication to be the very best in what they do.

"My feelings about the method of choosing members of the Olympic Team are very strong. I don't think that having one meet to determine team members is a good method. In my opinion they should be chosen according to their performance during the year of the Olympics. This method is used in several countries. It is a much fairer way to choose the team, because we all know that most athletes have a "bad day" or suffer injuries. If they have that day during the trials, they are eliminated even though they may be the best performer in the country.

"Someday I hope to see the United States Olympic Committee and the AAU stop their politicking and begin to consider the athlete as a first priority."

Ed began running track at Washington Junior High in Bakersfield. At East Bakersfield High School he was the Valley Cross Country Champion three times(67-frosh-soph, 68 and 69). \* = those races which count in the Central California Long Distance Point Race. These runs will be used to determine the "All Valley" Long Distance Teams, both Open and Senior. The top seven in each division will be awarded "All Valley" status at the end of the year. Here's how it works: Divide your average placing in these distance runs by the number of races you ran in to obtain your long distance point rating. As you will see not only your placings will be important but also participation.

# RESULTS:

## LATON - KINGSTON RUN

February 24, Kingston Regional Park: After disposing of early threats by senior winner Len Thornton and host "Ironman" Rich Petersen, Dave Bronzan and Bill Cockerham held off Jim Hartig for three miles before breezing to a 32:34 tie over the 6.2 mile run. Hartig was third in 33:25 while former FCC standout Cliff Reese brought home fourth in 34:10. Len Thornton matched Reese's time to take the over 40 division, followed by Sid Toabe (37:29) and Bob Reynaga (38:07).

The course starting and finishing at the historic site of one of the last great robberies in the Valley had it's own misfortune as it turned out to be 1/4 mile longer than intended. However most enjoyed the varied if difficult route.

In the elementary mile, Scott Thornton, taking a cue from his dad turned in a sparkling 5:20 followed by Laton's Carl Domingos (5:54) and Ronnie Bisi (6:01).
