West Valley's most recent addition was on Nigeria's 1968 Olympic team at Mexico City. He is Martins Ande, currently attending Occidental College in Los Angeles. He plans to continue his education and do graduate work, probably in the Bay Area. Ande is 23 years old and has run two very good marathons in the past year. At Boston he ran 2:26 in April and then only about a month later he placed 2nd in the rugged Palos Verdes Marathon with a personal best of 2:24:02. He was only a minute behind Santa Barbara's stellar Chuck Smead. Ande now becomes West Valley's second Olympian. Alvaro Mejia ran in both the 1964 and 1968 Olympic Games for Colombia, finishing 10th in the 10,000 meters in 1968.

A helpful hint to avoid blisters: Recently Chris Miller of the San Francisco Olympic Club gave me a helpful hint that I have found to work. I had always been hesitant to use Tiger Marathon shoes in any race over 10 miles because I would develop an acute case of blisters. Chris told me to buy some Dr. Scholl's Moleskin and apply it to my feet the night before a race. Moleskin is strongly adhesive but is very soft on one side. It stretches easily to mold with your feet. By morning it adheres to your feet so closely that it's like a second skin. I first tried Chris suggestion at the Culver City marathon and got no blisters at all where I had applied the Moleskin. However, I did get several blisters on the tips of my toes where I did not put it. I also ran the race in Tiger marathon flats. The week after I tried it again in the Petaluma marathon with similar results. I highly recommend this preventive measure against blisters. (Jack Leydig)

WEST VALLEY'S EDDIE SILVA WINS SALINAS 20 MILER

(December 6): Running superbly over a 20 mile course, West Valley's and Watsonville High School's Eddie Silva ran away from the field of some 30 runners to win by 14 minutes in the Salinas Bicentennial Cross Country Road Run (from the Monterey Fairgrounds to Hartnell College). The course was rolling with only one hill about 12 miles out. The last eight miles were flat. The weather was perfect, cloudy most of the time, with the sun coming through at the right spots to warm up the runners. No accurate times were available but Silva ran an excellent 1:45. Second place went to Jeff Berryessa of Hartnell JC in 1:59. He was followed by Dan Dills (M.P.C.) in 2:04 and team mate Phil Garcia in 2:05. Hartnell easily took the JC division in the team standings with 2-4-14. Alisal took the high school division by placing 7-8-22. There are no results in the team standings in the open race.

BILL SCOBEY RUNS AWAY WITH SAC 20 MILE RACE

(December 6): Humboldt State's Bill Scobey took a decisive victory over the Clympic Club's Chris Miller and Sacramento State's Steve Dean, who made it a close battle for second place. Only the first three runners broke 1:50 over the flat course, but 16 broke 2 hours. No team scores are available.

WEST VALLEY'S JACK LEYDIG RUNS SECOND IN WESTERN HEMISPHERE MARATHON

(December 7): Ex-Minnesota star Tom Heinonen ran off with the 22nd Annual Western Hemisphere Marathon and 1969 National A.A.U. Sr. Marathon Championships at Culver City in a time of 2:24:43. Surprise second place finisher and only other runner to break 2:30 was West Valley Track Club's Jack Leydig in 2:28:52. But the tragic thing about the race was the fact that the three leaders (Fred Ritcherson - So. Cal. Striders, Byron Lowry -SF Olympic Club, and Chuck Smead - Santa Barbara A.A.) were running around a 2:20 pace at 21 miles when they came to a confusing and unpoliced "Y" intersection and made a wrong turn. They went miles out of their way before realizing that they had made a wrong turn and only Chuck Smead finished the race in a poor 2:46:01 (but actually a very good time considering all the extra mileage he ran). By the time Heinonen reached the intersection, the others were out of sight (luckily) and he had to make a decision also. He chose right (luckily for Leydig and those following) and ran on to a four minute victory as Leydig faded over the last 5 miles with stomach trou-Santa Barbara still won the team title over the San Diego TC and Souble. thern California Striders, despite Smead's wrong turn. The scores were: 18-23-24. The only Northern California team was Marin AC who finished 10th with 88 points. Another Northern California runner who ran into trouble was Bob Deines who was running with Heinonen and Leydig at 14 miles when he had to pull up with leg trouble. He later dropped out at about 20 miles. STEVE DEAN WINS PACIFIC ASSOCIATION MARATHON IN 2:29:59

(December 14): Running a come-from-behind race until he took command with only 4 miles to go, Sacramento State's Steve Dean won the PA-AAU marathon championship race at Petaluma over a tough course with many rolling hills. Starting fast off last week's second place finish in the Culver City Marathon, West Valley's Jack Leydig took the lead and began to pull away from the pack at 3 miles. Passing 5 miles in 27:20 and 10 miles in 53:57, he lost the lead at 12 miles to the Olympic Club's Richard Delgado who held the lead until about 17 miles when Leydig again took over after coming from 200 yards behind at 15 miles. Delgado dropped out at 20 miles and then fastclosing Dean caught tiring Leydig with only 4 miles left. Marin's Darryl Beardall also closed fast to take third, only 45 seconds behind. Marin AC easily took team honors over West Valley and the Redwood City Striders by running 3-4-7. Marin also had the first high school runner in Ron Elijah, who finished an excellent 4th. At press time we had not received complete results of this race, but we do have the top 10 placers and their times:


EXAMINER GAMES TRIALS



WEST VALLEY RELAY TEAM INVITATED TO COMPETE IN ATHENS INDOOR MEET.

A relay team consisting of the four Mackey brothers; Jim, John, Bob and Bill will compete in the Senior relay at the Athens Invitational Track and Field Meet Feb.6. in the Oakland Coliseum.
