Palo Alto ahead of the game in class, too

SURE, they're talented on the court, but members of the undefeated Palo Alto boys' basketball team also are on the ball in the classroom.

Palo Alto, which takes a 23-0 record into the Central Coast Section playoffs Thursday, is the CCS's 1992-'93 boys' basketball scholastic championship team with a cumulative 3.71 grade-point average on a 4.0 scale.

"This is a special group of kids," Coach **John Barrette** said. "Their record in basketball and the classroom speak for themselves, but they also have great senses of humor and are down-to-earth people."

The Palo Alto girls' basketball team didn't fare as well on the court this season as the boys, finishing 5-16, but its players were slightly better in the classroom, finishing as the CCS scholastic team champion with a 3.76 GPA.

The section's scholastic team champions in soccer are the Los Altos girls (3.8) and Bellarmine (3.49). Bellarmine entered the CCS playoffs as the No. 1 seed in boys' Division I, and Los Altos was seeded third in girls' Division II. . . . Aptos won the scholastic team award in wrestling (3.6).

DOUBLE SUCCESS: Barrette not only coached the Palo Alto boys' varsity basketball team to

an unbeaten regular season, he also coached the school's frosh-soph boys' basketball team to a 17-2 finish. The Vikings lost to St. Francis 50-44 and Milpitas 36-34. They also beat Milpitas 38-29 as the teams tied for the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League title.

Once his varsity basketball team completes its season, Barrette will take over from assistant **Ron Skillikorn** as the school's varsity baseball coach. His baseball teams have been in the CCS tournament the last four years.

UNHAPPY ENDING: This marks the first year in the 17-season history of the girls' CCS basketball tournament that a **Kathy Harris**-coached Piedmont Hills' team has not qualified for the post-season party. Her team finished 8-13, the first time Harris has had a losing record in her 23 seasons as the Pirates'

coach. Harris' 1990, '89 and '84 teams won CCS titles.

The primary reason for the Pirates' disappointing finish was a season-ending knee injury suffered by the coach's talented daughter, 5-foot-10½ junior **Kristin Harris**, in December.

Kristin Harris, who underwent surgery to repair cartilage damage in her left knee, was an all-Santa Clara County first-team player in volleyball the last two years, and an all-county second team basketball player last season. Kathy Harris said her daughter should be back playing club volleyball by summer.

BRAZIL-BOUND: Pioneer boys' soccer coach **Luiz Manzo**, 35, who said he was known as Luizinho during an 11-season career as a professional player for Ponte Preta in Brazil, is heading for his native land Sunday to learn from former Brazilian greats **Pelé** and **Carlos Alberto** at a one-week coaching clinic. He said he also hopes to take in a match between Brazil and Uruguay. Manzo, who in his first season as Pioneer's varsity coach guided the team to the CCS playoffs, said he began playing professional soccer in Brazil when he was 16½ years old.
