

# 1963 All-American High School Football Squad

**J**UST as the proof of the pudding lies in the eating, so does the validity of *Scholastic Coach's* All-American teams lie in the success achieved by the boys afterward.

All right, then, feast your eyes on the all-pro teams below. Every one of these players is a former *Scholastic Coach* All-American! And this is just a sampling of the number that has achieved national stardom. (Because we limited our selections to just one man for each position, we were forced to omit such titans as John David Crow, Roman Gabriel, Jon Arnett, Dick Bass, Terry Baker, ad infinitum.)

The 13th annual All-American H. S. Squad consists of 90 boys from 37 states and the District of Columbia. Texas, with eight selectees, incubated the most all-stars, closely followed by the other traditional hotbeds of schoolboy football — Ohio and Pennsylvania, with six choices each, Michigan and California, with five apiece, and Illinois with

four.

Four schools placed two men apiece, namely: Princess Anne H. S. of Virginia Beach, Va., which placed end Charles Carr and quarterback Buster O'Brien; Welch (W. Va.) H. S., which placed tackle Donald Roberts and halfback James Smithberger; Rippowam H. S. of Stamford, Conn., which placed end Ron Kopec and quarterback David Thomas; and McKeesport (Pa.) H. S., which placed end James Beirne and quarterback Bob Bazylak.

**Bob Bazylak** amassed 2,067 yards total offense, with 69 of his passes going to his All-American buddy, **Jim Beirne**, for 1,075 yards and seven tds.

Another great combination was Virginia Beach's **Buster O'Brien** and **Charles Carr**. Carr received 13 td. passes, kicked five field goals, and scored 119 points. O'Brien, the passer, amassed 5,435 yards in three years. In one game he connected on 35 of 53 passes for 538 yards, with Carr catching







**Dave Thomas** and **Ron Kopec** of Stamford (Conn.) Rippowam were equally as impressive, though playing for a team that usually stayed on the ground. Thomas completed 75 of 142 passes for 1,295 yards and 18 tallies. Kopec, also a great defensive player, scored 70 points, including runs of 55, 67, and 70 yards with passes, and doubled as a fullback and end. He also had a 40-yard punting average.

The other school with dual representation (Welch, W. Va.) did not rely on a passing attack. Halfback **Jim Smithberger** rushed 1,302 yards for an 11.5 average, while **Don Roberts** was a 230-pound tower of strength at tackle.

**Bruce Newell** may be the next great quarterback to follow Jake Gibbs, Charley Conerly, Glynn Griffing, et al, at the U. of Mississippi. At Meridian High, he ran for 771 yards, passed for 621, punted for a 40.6 average, and completed just under 50% of his tosses.

**Ray Calcagno** of San Francisco was the bellweather of St. Ignatius's superb team, completing 75 of 117 passes for 1,290 yards and sparkling on defense.

**Jim Bugar** of little Lindsay High was considered the top back in Oklahoma, accounting for over 2,500 yards on offense. He completed 70 of 137 passes for 1,570 yards and 21 touchdowns. He also rushed 143 times for 953 yards and 19 scores, and added 27 extra points.

Among the outstanding running backs were **Bill Rettig** of Butler, Pa., who rushed for 1,112 yards and was voted the outstanding back in Western Pennsylvania; **Jim Oliver**, a powerful two-year all-stater at East Orange, New Jersey champions, who was actually rated better on defense; and **Ron Bess** of Bloomington, Ill., with career credential showing 4,164 rushing yards.

**Herbie Phelps** of Bardstown, Ky., playing for little Old Kentucky Home, amassed 2,833 yards and 313 points—giving him a 615-point total for the past two years! Another small school boy, **Jimmy Lisk** of South Stanly, N. C., chalked up 63 touchdowns and passed for 14 others in four seasons. He gained 2,492 yards the past fall.

**Warren McVea**, sprinter, defensive ace, and all-everything in Texas, scored 40 tds. and 37 extra points, 277 points in all, for Brackenridge. He gained 1,117 yards in 106 rushes against the best in Texas.

**Linus Baer** of Lee High in the same city racked up 45 tds. and gained 1,334 yards.

Big, powerful 220-pound **Ted Sweets** of Butler, Mo., scored 91 touchdowns and gained over 5,000 yards in a fabulous career. **Levi Lee**, from nearby Topeka, Kan., anchored two state championships relay teams though weighing a solid 195 pounds.

**Dave Babbs** of East Denver gained 1,300 yards for a city record; while **James Dugan** of Flagstaff, Ariz., an all-stater in both football and basketball, scored 155 points as one of the greatest schoolboy backs ever to come out of the Southwest.
