

Rally Fells Bells *12/23* By 1 Point

MOUNTAIN VIEW — It's the greatest thing that ever happened to our school," shouted Ravenswood High School basketball coach Tom Crane over the din raised by celebrating Trojans.

They had good reason to celebrate. Trailing 26-18 going into the fourth period of their championship game with Bellarmine in the Mountain View Christmas Basketball Tournament, the Trojans rallied for a 33-32 triumph.

A year ago, the same two teams met in the finals, with the Bells racing to a 59-41 win.

The favored Trojans, successfully slowed down by Bellarmine in the first three quarters, put their pressing defense to work but good in the final period, causing numerous Bellarmine errors and fouls.

Four points by Nate Branch, two on free throws and a pair on a fast break layup after a teammate swiped the ball, narrowed the gap to 26-22 with less than a minute gone in the fourth quarter.

With 5:44 left, Don Hanson put in Bellarmine's lone field goal of the quarter and it was 28-24, but two more free throws by Branch, a jumper by Art Crum, and a free throw and layup by Branch put the Trojans out in front 29-28 with 2:29 left.

All this time, the quick Ravenswood youngsters were harrasing the Bells, causing mistakes that the Trojans used to their advantage.

Bellarmine's Rich Levitt was fouled shooting from under the basket in what may have been the game's crucial play. Levitt missed the field goal and had to settle for two free throws rather than a possible three points.

Nine seconds later, with 2:07 left, Crum put in a jump shot to put Ravenswood back in the lead, 31-30, but, after a Bellarmine time out for a strategy meeting, Levitt tipped one in for a 32-31 Bell lead with 1:36 to go.

Ravenswood also used the time out for strategy, this time with 1:31 to go, and fabulous little Milky Johnson, just one year away from Class D ball, made the shot of the game, a 30-foot jumper that put the Trojans in front to stay with 1:30 left.

Although he had scored well in both previous tourney games, Johnson had been held to a single free throw before his supreme effort last night.

Again the press worked well. A travelling infraction gave the Trojans the ball with 52 seconds left and another time out was called.

Stalling, the Trojans suddenly found Branch under the bucket, but the big junior missed the layup that would have clinched victory, with Bellarmine rebounding.

As before, the press did the trick and another travelling violation let Ravenswood take the ball. Grandy was fouled with :03 left. He missed, but it was too late to do anything about it.

It was a big win for Ravenswood and certainly an outstanding effort on the part of the Bells, who set the pattern that probably will be followed by most Ravenswood foes this year—a slow deliberate game, taking only the good shots and not letting the Trojans run.

Levitt was the game's top scorer with 18 points, while Branch came through with 16 to lead the Trojans. Crum, whose board work was instrumental in all three Ravenswood victories, scored nine.

In other final day action, St. Francis topped Awalt 47-19 for seventh place, Mt. View edged Buchser 65-57 for fifth and the consolation crown, and Los Altos downed Hillsdale 49-38.



STANFORD PAVILION—"They only play as well as they have to," it has been said of Ravenswood High School's basketball players. That ability to rise to the occasion paid off handsomely for Ravenswood's Trojans Saturday night when they battled to a spectacular five-overtime 60-58 victory over St. Elizabeth in the finals of the fourth annual Peninsula Baseball Tournament.

Those who had not been following the Trojans throughout the season had rated the Catholic Athletic League champion Mustangs as a fairly heavy favorite to defeat the South Peninsula Athletic League champions in the finals. Local fans, however, knew full

well that the Trojans couldn't be ruled out that easily.

When Trojan captain Nate Branch, only a junior, hit on a jump shot from the corner with three seconds remaining in the fifth overtime period, the overflow crowd in the 2,800 seat capacity Stanford Pavilion went wild.

With the exception of a few hundred fans from the Oakland school, the crowd was for the Trojans.

Only once in the game did it appear that either team might win handily, and that was for a brief spell in the third period when the Trojans finally got the Mustangs running and built up a 37-31 lead.

But St. Elizabeth was too poised a ball club to fall apart and held

firm, finally creeping up on Ravenswood to tie the count early in the fourth quarter when Pat Furlong hit on a free throw.

The rest of the way, it was anybody's game, with the lead changing hands eight times in the closing 6:08 of play.



Clean Sweep; Trojans Nab Varsity Title

EAST PALO ALTO — Ravenswood High School has made Peninsula prep basketball history today.

The Trojans defeated Woodside 55-41 here yesterday to clinch the South Peninsula Athletic League varsity championship and make Ravenswood the first school in more than 40 years of SPAL and P.A.L. history to win all four basketball crowns, undisputed, in the same school year.

Yesterday's game was moved up from Friday by agreement of coaches.

The victory also qualified Ravenswood as the official SPAL entry in the Peninsula Basketball Tournament.

The Trojans will have a three-week layoff, however, before the PBT, March 15-16-17 at Stanford.

Ravenswood broke yesterday's game open in the last stages of the first quarter, but Woodside closed it again midway in the second period and the outcome remained in doubt until the final minutes.



League bills open with Class B games at 7 o'clock. The varsity contests follow at about 8:45. Admission for all league games is the same—\$1 for adults, 50 cents for student body card holders from other high schools, 25 cents for elementary school students, and no charge for student body card holders from competing schools.

Though Carlmont has the longest current win streak—seven in a row—of any varsity team, either Palo Alto or Menlo-Atherton is favored for the title, depending on whose predictions you like.

The Vikings, defending champions (and co-champs in '59) will have a six-game streak of league victories, dating from last season, when they compiled an 11-1 league and 27-2 season record.

Tonight's action figures to be pretty much first division vs. second division, but the league is so well balanced this winter that few games are rated "breathers."


