Rodgers Nabs Two Victories

Los Altos stamped itself as the premier prep track team in the Central Coast area Saturday with a hard-earned championship in the massive Blossom Hill Relays at Leigh.

The Knights collected 40 points, 10 of them coming from an outstanding jumping double by senior Denny Rodgers, Watsonville, which equalled the Knights' three first-place finishes, was second with 35.

Andrew Hill took third with 25, followed by Tennyson's 22 and Homestead's 21 among a field of over 50 teams that represented nearly all the top cinder talent the area has to offer.

Rodgers broke Relays records in both the long jump and triple jump.

His long jump mark of 23-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ was his second effort in a six-jump series that had every leap surpassing the meet's second-place distance. Five of the six tries were over 23-0 with the final leap carrying 24-5, but with a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch foul.

Rodgers then turned to the triple jump, capping another successful series with a 47-5 leap, more than three feet past the previous meet standard.

Los Altos' other victory came in the mile relay, where a desperation finishing kick by Bill Chapman provided a come-from-behind victory, as happened in last week's Carlmont Relays.

Chapman, running with a slightly-injured left leg, overtook leading Santa Cruz in the final 60 yards during a 49.7 split that gave the Knights the win in 3:27.1.

Watsonville, as expected, depended on the talents of dashman Mike Williamson and miler Bob Scurich for over half of its points.

Williamson won the star-studded 100-yard dash in a photo-finish 9.9 decision over Ravenswood's Jim Marshall, who currently holds the area's lowest mark of 9.6.

Within minutes the pair hooked up in another neck-and-neck dual on the anchor leg of the 440-yard relay with Williamson again shading Marshall and again with no difference showing on the official clocks. Both teams were credited with 43.9, followed by 40.0 for Los Altos. In a morning heat race, Watsonville shattered the meet record for the event with a 43.2.

Scurich added the third Wildcat triumph with a 4:22.1 mile, running the entire distance virtually alone. His time, though above several other personal efforts this season, was also a meet mark, eclipsing his own 4:24.8 of a year ago.

Two more meet records also tumbled as Buchser's Mike Toler clipped the low hurdles in 19.1 and Mike Louisiana threw the discus 178-10.

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Barely missing a new standard was Campbell's Gary Paske, who accumulated 352 points, one shy of the record, in the five-event pentathlon.

In addition to Watsonville and Los Altos, the only other school to capture more than one first-place was Tennyson, which won the medley and 880-yard relays. In the latter, anchorman Bob Dickhart held on for a .1 victory over on-rushing Watsonville, followed closely by Los Altos.
