# Gamez 2-Miler Rips Prep Mark

A brilliant 2-0:2 two mile by Berkeley's smooth-running Ralph Gamez and a laluted trio from Montgomery High of Santa Rosa provided the major share of highlights in the 12nd annual North Coast Section track and field championships at UC's Edwards Stadium yesterday.

Scoring almost solely on the efforts of Mel Gray, Stan Wise and Bob Walden, Montgomery's Vikings ran away with the team title by registering 30 points compared with runner-up El Cerrito's 25.

**BUT, THERE** was little doubt in anyone's mind that Gamez was the star of the show in this qualifying meet that will send the first four finishers in each event to next weekend's State CIF championships at the same Edwards Stadium.

The defending State two mile champion, who certainly now must rate the one to beat in next week's finale, made countless of what was supposed to be a close three-man battle.

**HOLDING OFF** his charge in second position while Montgomery's Walden set the pace for the first three laps,

Gamez suddenly sprinted to the front on the back stretch of the 6th revolution and gradually left the rest of the field in the dust.

Powering it on by spending most of the way on his right's and final lap, Gamez tagged a finishing 0:27 seconds 44 to his best-ever two mile time and shattered the North Coast record of 0:30.5 he set last year by a whopping 11.3 seconds.

**HE PUT TOGETHER** miles of 4:34.5 and 4:30.7 to account for the second best prep two mile mark this season. The best mark is held by Chula Vista's Tim Dunsicker, who will be running the mile at Berkeley and week.

Gamez was a good 45 yards in front of ME Eden's Ernie Lindley (0:16.6) and third place Lindeber Walden (0:16.1). All three behind the North Coast record, Dunsicker's sophomore sensation, Jim Tracy, came through with his best-ever mark, 1:20.5, for a fifth place.

Two other North Coast section records tumbled in the varsity division.

**ERRA'S JERRY TALLON**—who made the meet on a hardship case after influenza

kept him out of his sophomore last week—clocked a swift 1:04.2 half mile.

Preseason's Jim Peters accounted for the other record when he beat the distance 2:02.4 in the morning trials.

Montgomery's Gray was a one-man gang. He took a third in the 100 behind surprise winner Dave Masters of El Cerrito and Drake's Dean Lussatelli, won the long jump with a best-ever 24 foot 2 inch, and by victory in the 220 in 2:7 seconds and anchored the Viking half mile relay team to first place by passing Richmond's Clarence Johnson in the final 40 yards.

**WISE CHIPPED** in a fourth in the 120 yard high hurdles, named in an relay 15.4 win in the 100 low hurdles and got the relay team off to a good start.

Other top performances on the cloudy but warm afternoon included a 4:17.1 mile by DeAnza's Debra Barber and a 3:47 shot put by Castro Valley's undrafted C. S. C. Vandegriff.

The best 11 performance was a stinging 2:07.4 1200 by George Adams, a sixth grader at Pittsburg's Central Junior High.

# Gamez Streaks 2 Miles In 9:00

## Peters Takes Discus

A sensational 9:00.2 favorite by Ralph Gamez, the first 2-mile defeat for Mike Louwman and an 800 in which the top three runners were under 2:10 highlighted the 2nd North Coast Section track and field championships at Edwards Stadium yesterday.

Gamez, the defending state champion from Berkeley High, held off Kris Lindley of Mt. Eden by 0.2 seconds to set one of three records in the qualifying meet for the California Interscholastic Federation championships next weekend at the same site.

Pedagog's Jim Peters, who had finished behind Louisiana, the league star, in three previous state meetings, finally came out on top with a record-breaking throw of 130-4 and Gerry Taylor of Serra accounted for the third mark with a 121.5 triumph in the ball field.

Montgomery of Santa Rosa, winning four events and placing in three others, scored 46 points in assistance El Cerrito by 21 for the team championship.

DeAnza, with center Deane Barley posting a career best of

4:17.1 and hurdler Larry Rosenberger taking a pair of seconds, nipped Northwood for third place with 18 points.

A 24-2 effort by Montgomery double winner Mel Gray topped a long jump field in which all five placers were over 22 feet. Oscar Carrasco Taylor's 49-foot pumet a 4th that saw four runners break 40 seconds.

Gamez, leader by Lindley in the Division I last last week, ran a much smarter race yesterday. He stayed off the pace for the first four legs, contenting himself with 4:22 for the mile.

Then he poured on the coals and opened up a lead of as much as 25 yards with leg

times of 61, 58 and 56, and charged around the final leg in 44 seconds.

Gamez' time was over six seconds under his lifetime best in the Alameda County Athletic League championships last year, and 11 seconds better than his NCC record.

Lindley gradually moved from fourth to second, but despite a strong finish couldn't catch the determined Yellowjackets. The November 8-11.4 was more than nine seconds faster than his previous best.

Don Walden of Montgomery was third at 8:15.1 in also better the former standard, and Tracyson's Ray Ortega finished fourth with a seasonal peak of 8:21.8.

Peters, who lost to Louisiana at the El Cerrito Relays, Castro Valley Invitational and Fresno Relays, got off what proved to be the winning throw during the morning trials.

"I'll get him this afternoon," promised Louisiana, who was third at the time with a 140-foot-er. But although he improved to 175-1 in the final, it wasn't enough.

In the 80 Bob Bloog of Miramonte came from back in the pack during the final 200 yards and California School for Deaf Junior Ken Pedersen moved up setting out of the last turn to finish behind Taylor in 1:04.3 and 1:04.8 respectively.

Craig Norris of San Ramon got the last State Meet qualify-

ing berth by finishing fourth in 1:08.8. Both Norris and Taylor had previous bests of 1:07.4, while Nooy's was 1:08:02.

Barley lowered his time by 2.4 seconds in a mile that saw John Hunslein of Berkeley, second most of the way, run out of gas on the last turn and Pittsburg's Sherman Carter run right out of the stadium half-way through the race.

Trailing the field after 14 legs, Carter evidently decided he'd had enough track competition for the season. He ran up the grass on the east side of the stadium and disappeared.

It just wasn't the Fresno/Day Sprinter Ed Hart, Division II winner in 8.8 and 21.3, failed to make the final, a dropped

baton snatched by FHS relay team and high jumper Jim Peters just as useless to San Ramon coach Ken Barwick.

El Cerrito's Marvin Anderson was the early long jump leader with 23-04 in the trials, but he failed to improve enough to unseat Gray's come-from-behind effort.

Russ Valle led the 400 until Taylor started into high coming out of the turn. The Astoria star held on to take second in 1:07, with Tracyson's Bob Dehbert and Deane Gault of Granada's trailing him in seasonal bests of 48.8 and 49.8.

Mike Nash of Ygnacio Valley fouled on a 30-foot shot put and had to settle for second at 36 feet. The 17-inch behind Castro

Valley junior Chuck Vandagriff. Officials may have missed Gray's throw of practice in the high jump. Many press box observers fell forward, who was unseated, finished as high as third.
