

Knights scared, but take c

Castlemont has its record-equaling 11th straight consecutive Oakland City Athletic League track and field championships today, but it was by no means an easy conquest.

"We're thankful," was the only comment by relieved coach Nick Gavrikas after the Knights came from behind in the final event in the cool and windy City Meet yesterday to top last Skyline 14½ points.

Paul Berger's Tiburon led by incomparable LaMarr Haywood and the record-breaking performances of track stars Bruce Edwards and pole vaulter Jim Mack, were ahead by 1½ points with only the long jump to be completed.

Bat-Bearcat Blackshear, Fred Jackson and Joe Ror-

lock second, third and fourth behind Haywood's blister in give Castlemont 40 points to Skyline's 32.

The Knights thus moved up with 400 points, despite winning just three events, to equal the five straight titles by McClymonds from 1960 through 1964.

It was also Castlemont's seventh crown in eight years and its ninth overall.

Skyline, with Haywood accounting for 80 points, finished with 421½ to force the narrowest Knight win since a 10-point victory over Marin in 1962.

Led by sprint double winner Mickey Matthews and record-breaking pole vaulter Tim Saunders, Fremont was a distant third with 340 points.

It is interesting to note that

had the meet been limited to a 10-8-6-4-3-1 basis, as is dictated by National Alliance track and field rules, Skyline would have won the Class A competition 123-118.

Besides the two record-breakers and Haywood's two victories, Skyline earned a total of seven berths in next week's State Meet when Scott Williams took the 100, Bob Thayer the shot put and Andy Way the two-mile.

Castlemont's three entries are A. C. Harrel, who ran a strong in the final 40 yards to take the 440 in a seasonal best of 48.7, Jackson in the high jump and the relay team.

McClymonds placed junior Eric Barfield in the low hurdles.

"It's about time," he said a few words. "This is the fourth time I've tried for that record."

Mathis cleared 13-4 on his second try, Saunders on his third. They'll share the record, according to Oakland physical education director Dave Snyder.

Mathis was over on his second attempt at 13-4, but his pole knocked the bar off. Saunders was close on his third try, but knocked the bar off with his chest.

After a false start in the 100, Mathis was restored to the race, leading his last leg. Trailing halfway through after a bad start, he came on for a clean-cut victory.

off the mile record with his 4:15.1. With only the short to heat when he pulled away


from Mack's Frank Rivera after two laps, he was right on schedule with top times of
