

## JOHN ELLIOTT MEMORIAL TROPHY



JOHN ELLIOTT MEMORIAL TROPHY

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The grand old man of track and field on the Pacific Coast is gone, but his memory will live long in the hearts and minds of California and Stanford men who love the sport for which John Elliott did so much.

John came into the California-Stanford track picture early for he was an official at the first meet between these old rivals just forty-five years ago yesterday— April 22, 1893. From that time until last year, when he became ill just before the Big Meet, John was a prominent figure on the field at every clash between the Bears and Indians. He was named referee of a great many Big Meets.

Hundreds of athletes all over the Pacific Coast remember John Elliott for his kindly advice and splendid influence, for he inspired many to better their marks and at the same time remember the principles of good sportsmanship.

In 1930, with fourteen other men who had been out of active athletic competition for at least thirty years, John Elliott formed "The Old Time Athletes" Association". He was president of this organization until his passing. At the time of John's death, a committee of four was selected by this organization to secure the John Elliott Memorial Trophy, to be awarded annually to the winner of the California-

Stanford Track and Field Meet. This committee was composed of Wm. A. Magee, California, '87; Wm. F. Humphrey, President of the Olympic Club; Charles M. Yates of the "Old Time Athletes' Association"; and D. E. Brown, Stanford, '97. The beautiful trophy pictured here is the result of the work of that committee.

John Elliott's many friends contributed and student bodies of California and Stanford accepted the perpetual trophy officially. It will be awarded to the winner of today's meet for the first time. There is space on the base of the trophy for 300 plates with the winner and score for each year.

Dr. Robert Gordon Sproull, President of the University of California, and Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, President of Stanford University, will participate in the dedication ceremonies today. Max L. Rosenfeld, of the "Old Time Athletes' Association", will make the presentation speech.






