

Hillers Cop Track Title With Ease

Even better than advertised were Ed Ruffa's San Diego High School tracksters yesterday as they easily swept to the southern division C.I.F. championship at Glendale Hoover High.

The Hillers were pre-meet favorites but they didn't figure to make the rout they did. They totaled 34 points—the highest amount since Manual Arts made 52½ way back in 1916. Trailing in second place was Glendale Hoover with 16, one-half point better than San Diego Hoover.

There were other news makers beside the Hillers—several of 'em in fact.

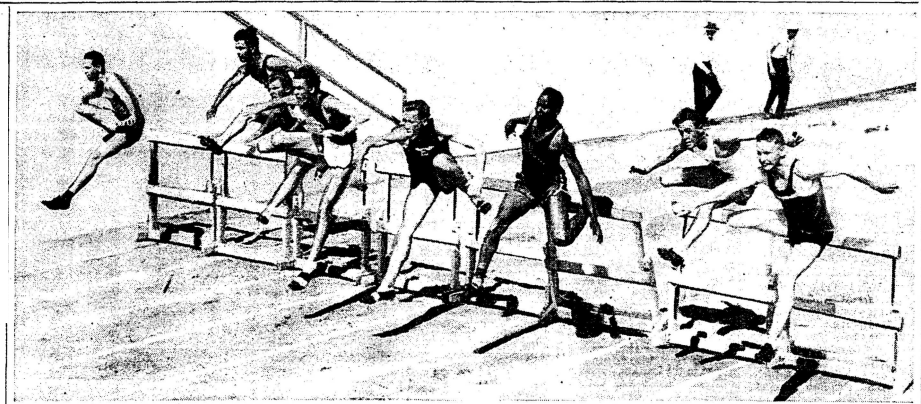
Thelmo Knowles, the lanky colored boy from Santa Monica High, shattered the 880 record he set up last week at Inglewood, leaving the field behind him as he ran a 1m. 55.7s. race. Santa Maria's Ed DeLoach held on gamely until Knowles—a future John Woodruff—began pouring it on in the last 220 yards.

One other varsity standard went by the boards when Willie Steele, San Diego Hoover, got off a 24ft. ¾in. broad jump. This erased Bill Bugbee's 24ft. ¾in. leap, made in 1937.

FLORES VICTOR

An unsung sophomore from Santa Paula amazed the crowd in the day's best race—the mile. Jess Flores is his name and the sprint he uncorked as he went into the last turn made the fans rub their eyes. Flores took the lead at the start of the second lap, and let his foes wear them-

Glen Willis was San Diego's big noise, taking both sprints as well as a fifth in the hop-step-and-jump.
