THE BIG MEET SERIES IS CLOSE!

JACK WEIERSHAUSER Stanford Coach Today is the day the young men wearing the Red and their rivals clad in the Blue and Gold turn in their top track efforts of the season. It's Big Meet time, and if the 53 past classics are any criteria, it's the time 22-foot broad jumpers suddenly leap 24 feet and 4:30 milers stop the clocks in something like 4:20.

The Big Meet seems to bring out the very best in Stanford and California trackmen, which

makes it the colorful, crazy, unpredictable athletic event that it is. An indication of all this is borne out in the series standings. To date—and the Indians and Bears have been running, jumping and throwing against each other since 1893—Stanford has been victorious 26 times and California has come home triumphant on 25 occasions. Twice this classic has ended in a deadlock.

Behind those cold statistics lie many spectacular stories. Take the 1896 meet, for instance. In that one Squires and Craft of the Bears finished one-two in the now extinct two-mile bicycle race to tie the Indians, 63 to 63. The 1922 classic also ended in a deadlock, when Howell of the Stanfords and Dalton of California split the third place point in the high jump to make it $65 \frac{1}{2}$ to $65 \frac{1}{2}$.


Scores of individual stars have basked in glory after sterling performances in this meet. As good an example as any is the 1919 affair, when Jess Wells of Stanford amazed everyone by taking four first-place ribbons in the 100 and 220 and both hurdle races. Those 20 points represent the most any one athlete has ever scored in the Big Meet. Along came 1921 and California had its great ace, Harold "Brick" Muller. The All-American footballer topped the field in the high jump, discus and broad jump to lead the Blue and Gold to victory.

Only slightly less prodigious have been the achievements of other athletes. Some, while not quite the all-around performers of a Wells or a Muller, have accomplished almost unbelievable things in the Big Meet.

Two of the greatest sprinters of all-time, Clyde Jeffrey of the Cards and Hal Davis of the Bears, left the crowds gasping in their days. Jeffrey is co-holder with California's Bob Kiesel of the meet century mark at :09.6, and he and Davis share the meet furlong record of :20.8. The Indian ace performed his feats in 1939, and Davis came along three years later. Another pair who added no little to making the Big Meet such a great spectacle were Ben Eastman of Stanford and California's Grover Klemmer, two of the finest quarter-milers to ever come down the pike. Until Illinois' Herb McKenley came along, Eastman and Klemmer shared the world 440 mark at :46.4. The Stanford star did his stint in the early thirties and Klemmer came along a decade later.

Stanford is favored today. But the Indians are no cinch, as no team ever is in the Big Meet. This is the day when a Mr. Everyman becomes a Mr. Superman.







Highlights of Big Meet History

KLEMMER

1893 On a windy, cloudy day in San Francisco, 1500 spectators watched the inaugural track and field meet between Stanford and California. Despite the hard luck that befell their star, Mays, who became ill and and was unable to finish the meet, the Bears won handily, 91-35.

1896 On a wet field and with adverse wind conditions, Stanford and California ended in a deadlock, 63-all. California was behind with one event, the 2-mile bicycle race (then included on the program), still to be held. Squires and Craft of the Bears finished one-two to give their team a tie.

1901 Despite poor track conditions six new Pacific Coast records were set. California men set new marks in the 100, 220, mile, high jump, and shot put. A Stanford man set a new mark in the mile walk..

1913 This was the closest victory in Big Meet history. The judges could not decide the winner of the 220 and decide to hold the race again. Stanford sprinter Campbell won, giving the Indians the meet by two-fifths of a point, 61 1/5 to 60 4/5.

1919 Wells of Stanford wrote his name in the all-time Big Meet Hall of Fame by winning four firsts, a feat that stands today as the best performance by a single man. He won both sprints and both hurdle races for 20 points.

fornia's great football star, Harold (Brick) Muller captured three blue ribthe Bears to an $85 \ 2/3 - 45 \ 1/3$ triumph in the 28th annual Big Meet. Druck which jump, the discus, and the broad jump.

Like the 1896 meet, this one, too, resulted in a tie, $65 \frac{1}{2}$ to $65 \frac{1}{2}$. Dalton of California and Howell of Stanford split the one point awarded for third place in the causing the deadlock.

1931 Lading twelve of the fifteen places, Stanford scored the most decisive Big Meet victory, 101 2/3 to 29 1/3. The Indians swept all three places in six events.

1941 California's great '41 track team made Big Meet history by walloping the Indians 97³/₄ to 33¹/₄ for the Bears' most decisive triumph of the annual classic, winning all events, and setting five new meet marks. Clarence Barnes raced the 880 in 1:52.3: Dick Peter went a mile in 4:11.5; Grover Klemmer galloped the 440 in :47.6; Guinn Smith vaulted 14 feet, 3¹/₄ inches, and Martin Biles hurled the javelin 222 feet, 10 inches for a record-smashing spree.

1948 California had a considerably easier time than was expected as the Bears whipped the Indians, 76 to 55. Stars of the meet were Donnie Anderson, who swept to victory in both dashes, and Kaare Vefling, who copped both the mile and two-mile. Shining light for the Cards was Darrell Kreitz, who set a new mark in the 120-yard high hurdles. Kreitz triumphed in :14.4.
