## Chapter 56 of Big Meet History To Be Written Today!

Today California and Stanford track teams meet for the fifty-sixth time in what is generally known as the "Big Meet." That designation for a track and field contest is no idle boast. The "Big Meet" is big because the cold, cut-anddried performances of the meets preceding this one lose some of their significance—dashmen strain for that extra tenth of a second, distance runners find a kick on the last lap they've never

had before, jumpers sail higher and farther through the air, and weightmen hurl their implements for distances surprising even their own coaches.

The athletes who have participated in this meet, either for the Stanford Red or the Blue and Gold, make up a pretty good Hall of Fame in themselves. Stanford, for example, has had two men who've won four events in one meet. Jess Wells did it in 1919, taking both hurdles and both dashes. Gaylord Bryan did it two years ago at Berkeley, taking the low hurdles, high jump and both sprints. Other names? Stanford's "Mr. Track" himself, Dink Templeton, sprinter Clyde Jeffrey, quarter miler Ben Eastman, hurdler Jack Weiershauser, now coaching today's Card team, weightmen John Lyman, Otis Chandler and Pete Zagar.

California's greatest one-man performance was turned in by Harold "Brick" Muller of football note, who won the broad jump, high jump and discus in 1921 to lead the Bears to their most decisive win over the Cards between 1911 and 1941. Other greats wearing the Blue and Gold were sprinters Hal Davis, Bob Kiesel and Don Anderson, pole vaulter Guinn Smith, javelin man Martin Biles. And many from both teams must remain slighted for lack of space.


That includes some of those whose performances never set records, men who were mediocre all year and suddenly blossomed forth to upset the champions in the Big One. Take California's Rod Grant, who two years ago hadn't broad jumped 23 feet all season, then suddenly cleared 24 against Stanford to keep the heralded Gay Bryan from winning an unprecedented five firsts.

In today's meet the Cards are favored to take their 29th win over the Golden Bears. California has 25 victories, while two thrilling affairs have ended up in deadlocks. The Bears, however, have a good margin in total points, 3580 19/28 to 3376 9/28. But no meet between rivals such as these is ever in the bag. Who knows what unknown, unplaced all season, may come forth to take points from some overwhelming dope sheet favorite?

Both teams will depend more than usual on sophomores today, Stanford on such as Bob Mathias and Norm Jiles, California on Jim Plessas, Jim Hutchinson and Sam Adams. With the "youngsters" either rising to this occasion or finding the pressure too demanding, anything may still happen.

And the "side attraction" provided by today's freshman meet will provide a key to the future. Stanford has a good crop of yearlings, but the Papocses are definite underdogs to California's "best-ever" bunch of Cubs, undefeated this year, and outscoring all the combined opposition in every multiple-school meet. Watching these yearlings will provide a key to the 60th Big Meet, and for a couple of years to come.

## **Highlights of Big Meet History**

1893 The Bears won handily in this first of all Big Meets, a spectacular affair held before 15,000 fans on a cold and windy day in San Francisco. California's Mays, star of the team, became ill during the meet and couldn't finish, but the Bears still won, 91 to 35.

1896 Again with adverse weather conditions, this time a wet field included, the Bears and Cards ended in a 63-63 tie. California was behind going into the last event, the then-popular two-mile bicycle race. Squires and Crofts of the Bears took one-two to give the Blue and Gold the deadlock.

1901 Again the spring moistures had softened the track, but that didn't detain the Big Meet trackmen from setting six new Pacific Coast records. California won, toppling the 100, 220, high jump and shot put marks, while a lone Stanford hardy toppled the mile walk standard.

1913 A disagreement among the judges gave Stanford the meet by the closest margin in history. It came in the 220, which was so close the judges decided to hold the race over. Stanford's strong Campbell won the race and Stanford won the meet,  $61\frac{15}{15}$  to  $60\frac{45}{5}$ .

1919 Jess Wells of Stanford single handedly toppled the Bears by scoring 20 points. His four first places gave the Cards a  $73\frac{1}{2}-66\frac{1}{2}$  win over the deeper Bears.

1921 Harold "Brick" Muller, football's all-time All-American, almost duplicated the Well's feat for the Bears. Muller won the high jump, discus and broad jump, and those three blue ribbons were instrumental in an  $85^{2}/_{3}-45^{1}/_{3}$  California win.

1922 This one came right down to the wire. Dalton of California and Howells of Stanford split the point for third place in the high jump, and the meet ended in a surprising  $65\frac{1}{2}-65\frac{1}{2}$  deadlock, the second and last tie in Big Meet history.

1931 Stanford got 12 first places and swept six events to give them a  $102\frac{2}{3}$  to  $29\frac{1}{3}$  decision over California. It was the only time either team has ever scored more than 100 points in a Big Meet.

1941 The Bears partially atoned for the 1931 drubbing with their all-time high over Stanford,  $97\frac{3}{4}$  to  $33\frac{1}{4}$ . Five Californians set meet records in that one, and those marks have endured the past ten years. Dick Peter went the mile in 4:11.5, Clarence Barnes the 880 in 1:52.3, Grover Klemmer the 440 in 47.6, Guinn Smith pole vaulted  $14'3\frac{1}{4}''$  and Martin Biles hurled the javelin 222'10''.

1948 The Bears won their last meet over the Cards, 76 to 55. Kaare Vefling in the distance races and Don Anderson in the dashes were double winners for California.

1949 That was the one in which Gaylord Bryan scored 23 points against California with four firsts and a second in his specialty, the broad jump.

1950 Bryan again participated in five events, and scored 19 points, Stanford's winning margin, 80 to 51. But California had her moments as Donnie Anderson blazed to a twin win in the dashes, including a meet record of 9.5 in the hundred. Paul Mello also won both the mile and 880 for the Bears.
