

New Jump Mark Set

Home Town Boy Breaks Record At Fresno

FRESNO, May 12—Home-towners had their chance to cheer today as Bernard Allard of Fresno High established a new West Coast Remark in the high school high jump. Allard leaped 6 feet 4½ inches, one-half inch above the 1929 performance of another Fresnan, Walter Marty.

Allard himself was a judge and selector as his 22-year-old standard was tipped. In 1933, Marty high jumped 6 feet 8⅝ inches as a Fresno mark that became a short-world record.

Allard's prep meet mark went to Leon Patterson of Taft in the shot-put, 56 feet 6 inches, with the shot ball, surpassed Elmer Wilcox's 56 feet 2⅝ inches, when Wilcox was a USC man, was competed at Fresno High.

Allard also won the discus throw with a 165 foot 3⅝ inch toss. This was the first time the high school discus has been used, and Allard's throw it was a new record. His mark was 148 feet 6¼ inches.

Sam Inness of Tulare in Fresno High won the meet with 33 points. Others were East Hanford 24, Washington, S.F., 17, Delano 12 3-5, Delano 11 3-5, Hanford 9 2-3.

King, sensational 15-16 year old Delano freshman, won the 100 yard dash in :09.9. Al Jones, of San Francisco, was the winner of the race.

In the distance medley (880-440-440-440 mile), Kent Reno of Washington High, San Francisco, started his race 12 yards behind. He managed to gain the lead, and clung to it until 25 yards from the finish. In the space, Luis Valdes of East Hanford and Vern Lawrence of East Hanford skipped by him. Reno ran the approximate 4:35 mile. East Hanford's winning time for the medley was 10:59.1.

Washington High School's sprint team of Al Jones, Dick Fox, J. C. Morris and Bob Lualhati overtook East Hanford to win in 1:32.7. Little Morris circled a lead runner in order to find racing room, then gave Lualhati a one yard lead. Lualhati stretched it to five at the finish.
