Southern California, land of the run, jump and throw, has bounced into a commanding lead in State track and field bests. The Los An-geles area boys have six top per-formances to two by Northern Cal-ifornia and three by the Central section.

The latest prep startler was turned in by Fernando Ledesma of Compton, who sped the mile in 4:23.9. That is only two-tenths off the State record of 4:23.7 by Ron Bauer of San Francisco's Washing-ton High. Pittsburg's Briggs, second in the State half last year, came through with a 1:58.2 for a best-in-State. The other top mark of :09.7 in the 100 was accomplished by Alameda's Turner. Luttrell's times of :19.4 and :14.8 have been shaded by Jerr Watson of Santa Maria, (:19.3 and :14.7). Coach R. J. Mangin of McCly-monds challenges any team in Northern California or any combina-tion of TWO teams, to a dual track meet. The Macks have some real goodies.
