Early spring rains didn't help high school track and field competitors in their conditioning, but that factor probably will not be noticed as North Coast Section Division II athletes vie for honors tonight on the Fremont track.

Salinas figures as a solid threat for the varsity team crown with Menlo-Atherton expected to offer the stiffest competition. The same schools, along with Santa Clara, look strongest for Class B honors.

Many of Northern California's finest prep spikemen will be in action. A goodly number of these top boys rate with the nation's best.

Santa Clara's Larry Guilford, one of the finest hurdlers ever developed in this area, has run 14.5 four times and threatens to go under that figure at any time. He has dropped only one decision in the highs during the season and that was a disputed one in the Fresno Relays last week.

Others rating national attention include Palo Alto's fine mile duo of George Linn and John Northway, discus tossers Ron Owen of Los Gatos and Barry Rothman of Capuchino, pole vaulters Don Beal of Palo Alto and Dick Webster of San Jose, high jumper Dennis Marc of Jefferson, dashman Ernie Stevenson of Cubberley, broad jumper Torry Baker of Menlo-Atherton, half-miler Bruce Logan of Salinas, and hop-step-jumper Bill Turner of James Lick. Turner will be competing in hurdles tonight as the triple-jump is not on the regular program of NCS events.

With so many outstanding competitors on display, fans are guaranteed one of the finest Division II meets in history.

First five finishers in each event tonight qualify for next week's North Coast Section championships to be held on this same fast strip. Top three boys from the NCS varsity trackfest qualify for the state finals May 31 in Long Beach. Judging from past performances, many of the athletes you watch tonight will be competing in the state classic.

While watching the fine varsity performers, it would be wise not to overlook the stiff competition in the lightweight class. Of particular interest should be the 440 relay where Menlo-Atherton boasts a best time of 43.6.

Menlo-Atherton's classy baton foursome is capable of a faster time. It wouldn't take a much better clocking for the Cubs to pencil themselves into the national honor roll. Few teams in California, varsity or otherwise, boast a better time. The team consists of fast starting John Finegold, Jon Peck, Stu Hawley, and Dick Burns, running in that order.

So that everyone may enjoy the meet, officials ask that everyone stay seated during the running of each event. In this way all the fans will be able to watch each event in comfort.

The voice you hear over the public address system will be that of Jim Gallagher, Redwood City sportswriter, who is considered one of the finest track and field announcers in the nation.
