Press Room (Men Only)

The Press Room will be in Marsten Hall, Rickey's Hyatt House, 4219 El Camino Real, Palo Alto, three miles south of Stanford Stadium. This room will be open daily, Sunday, July 15, through Sunday, July 22, and will have Western Union facilities available after 5 p.m. each day. The bar will be open Sunday, July 15, through Thursday, July 19, from 5 to 7 p.m. It will be closed on Friday because of the barbecue at the Elks Club. The days of the meet it will be open from 7 to 9 p.m. Each day there will be a release on the day's activities, by athletes, available at approximately 6 p.m. in the Press Room. This sheet will include such information as arrivals, practice marks, injuries, etc. Members of the coaching staffs and Track and Field Committees of both nations will also be present.

Steak Barbecue, Friday, July 20

Working press, radio, and television men, and coaching staffs are invited to attend a steak barbecue from 6 to 8 p.m., Friday, July 20, at the Palo Alto Elks Club, 4249 El Camino Real (100 yards south of Rickey's Hyatt House). Ladies are included in the invitation. Immediately following the barbecue, an aquacade will be presented in the Elks Club Pool.

Press Courtesy Cars

Courtesy cars will be available for transportation during the week. Details will be posted in the press room.

Special Ceremonies

Austin Mosher will sing the national anthems of both nations as the feature of opening ceremonies each day. Additional music will be provided by a United States Marine Corps Band. A parade of athletes will take place at both the opening ceremonies, Saturday, at 3 p.m., and the closing ceremonies following the meet on Sunday.

Press Boxes

Both press boxes in Stanford Stadium will be utilized for the meet. The trackside area is located on the east floor of the stadium adjacent to the track. The other area is the main box located on the rim. Both will be serviced with statistical information throughout the meet. A corps of press stewards will be on duty at the meet to serve members of the working press.

Interview Area

Immediately adjacent to the south side of the trackside press box, an interview area has been set up where athletes will be brought as soon as possible after the completion of their events.

Stanford University

The University was founded in 1885, as a memorial to Leland Stanford, Jr., by his parents, Senator and Mrs. Leland Stanford. First classes were held in 1891. Present enrollment is 9,500.

Stanford Stadium

Built in 1921, it originally had a seating capacity of 60,000. Subsequent additions have increased the seats to 90,000. East side of the stadium is the side next to El Camino Real and closest to Palo Alto. The stadium has been the site of the 1932 and 1960 United States Olympic Track and Field Trials and the 1941 National Collegiate Championships.

Workouts

The first two days after the arrival of the Soviet Union team, the stadium will be available for practice. The remaining days prior to the meet, workouts will be on Angell Field, 200 yards from Stanford Stadium. The United States women's team may work out at the Palo Alto High School field across El Camino Real from Stanford Stadium.

Housing

All athletes of both countries will be housed and fed in Stern Hall, modern dormitory on the Stanford campus.

Miscellaneous

American Broadcasting System will televise the meet nationally. The telecast will be blacked out locally. Radio will be handled by Station KCBS in San Francisco with special outlets on the Pacific Coast. Stanford Golf Course, on the campus, is open to play, with green fees waived for working newspaper, radio, and television men, Monday through Friday (except Tuesday morning).

Attendance for the two-day meet is expected to approach 150,000. Sales at press time were 90,000.

Ticket prices—Reserved, two days, \$6.00; one day, \$3.50. Non-reserved, two days, \$3.00; one day, \$2.00.
