Dear Bert:

At our Women's Track and Field Meeting last Friday evening, the Committee discussed women's events for inclusion on indoor meet programs. We felt it might be helpful to those planning the Golden Gate Meet if we produced a priority list from which to choose, keeping in mind those events in which our girls rank high nationally. Here it is:

1. 50 Yard Hurdles - We had three of the six finalists in the Olympic Try-outs (Sherrard, Griffith, Paschal). Cherrie Sherrard represented the U.S. on both the Olympic and USSR-USA Teams. *3rd Goal*
2. High Jump - Pat Winslow (Olympic Team member in Pentathlon) was third at Nationals with 5' 6". Denise Paschal won the Junior Nats. with a new record 5' 3½". Regina Wilson won the Age Group Nats. with 5' 1". Other jumpers at 5 feet or better are: Cherrie Sherrard, Sally Griffith, Fran Parham. *7K*
3. Medley Relay - Oakettes AC of Oakland are National Champs and record holders. Laurel Track Club of SF came second in the National 440 relay. Other top teams are San Mateo Co. GAA, Will's Spikettes of Sacramento (National Cross-Country Champions), and Santa Clara Valley GTT.
4. 60 Yard Dash - Our weak spot nationally in open competition. However, Lynda Bradshaw of Oakland won the Girls' 14-17 National 50 and 100 dashes. You have at hand the results of last Saturday's run-off for places at the Examiner Meet.
5. 4-Kilo Shot Put - Nationally we ranked 3rd, 5th and 6th (Winslow, Blanck and Sutton). However, there are others who may have improved enough to catch up or pass the last two.
6. 880 Yard Run - San Mateo GAA and Will's Spikettes always come up with National finalists in this event. However, some of the 440 and Cross-Country girls might turn out to be better than current favorites in a run-off!

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

PERMIT FOR OUT-OF-DISTRICT COMPETITION

An athlete who desires to compete in the territory of any Association other than the Association in which he is registered must receive a permit made out in triplicate so to do from the Chairman of the Registration Committee of the Association in which the athlete is registered, who shall keep a record of the same, and upon the failure of the athlete to file, immediately upon his return home a statement as to the manner in which his expenses were paid he shall be considered to have suspended himself and he will be ineligible to compete at any games until reinstated. Such permit shall state the dates and places when and where the athlete is allowed to compete. All negotiations for the appearance of such athlete shall be conducted with the club to which the athlete is affiliated or, in the case of an unattached athlete, with the registration committee of his local district, and such permit shall be filed with the registration committee of the district in which the games are held. The original shall be furnished to the athlete, who shall present it to the Chairman of the Committee in charge of the event, who will fill in the information asked on the blank and attach his signature thereto. The athlete must return the form to the Registration Committee which issued same within ten days following the competition for which the permit was issued. A duplicate copy shall be mailed to the Registration Committee of the district wherein the competition is to be held, and the triplicate is retained in the files of the issuing Registration Committee.
