Roberts Runs 20.2 on 'Short' Course

Timers at Friday's opening session of the NCAA college division track and field championships at Veterans Memorial Stadium in Long Beach almost keeled over in a mass faint after the first heat of the 220.

Their watches said that Ed Roberts of North Carolina College, breezing to victory, had done 20.2, thus equalling the world record.

A quick measurement of the course, though, revealed that the distance was only 210 yards.

Excessive Wind

It was a disappointing day for Roberts. He also topped all 100-yard qualifiers with 9.5, only to have that clocking disallowed because of excessive aiding wind. In that same wind-boosted heat, Darrel Newman of Fresno State finished a loping second in 9.6.

Wholesale scratches removed considerable luster from the meet, which concludes today. Starting time for the all-finals program is 12:30 p.m. Among Friday's no-shows was Dick Stebbins of Grambling, whose 9.2 is the fastest 100 in the country this year.

The former Fremont High athlete reportedly suffered minor injuries in a recent auto accident, so the school decided not to spend the travel money for him and his quarter-mile teammate, Don Owens.

Record Falls

One meet record fell when Jim Kemp of Kentucky State romped the 440 in 46.6, apparently without opening up. The former mark was 46.7.

A giant upset occurred in one of the three finals on Friday's menu — the hammer throw. Alex Schulten of Bowdoin, going into action with the nation's fourth best sling of 1965—202 feet 11 inches, fouled on four of his

six tries and wound up with 177-1½. The winner, at 185-10, was Wayne Pangborn of Bates.

Other titles were decided in the discus throw and 6 mile run. Stan McDonald of Lincoln U. won the discus with a toss of 167-10½ while Gene Takle of Luther easily took the six mile in 30:03.8.
