

LOSSES IN THIS EVENT: No significant losses.

- DONN FORBES A sophomore from Leavenworth, Kansas (Leavenworth High School). Donn was the top sprinter on the 1964 Frosh squad. An unknown quantity for varsity competition, Donn is in thick going this season. He is a good competitor and should improve over last year's marks of 10.0 and 22.1. Missed early practice sessions as he was a student the past two quarters at the Stanford campus in Florence, Italy. Won the 100 in last year's Little Big Meet. Majoring in General Engineering.
- KEN FRASER A senior from Pasadena (Muir High School). A big, powerful runner, Ken has a 220 best of 21.7. Primarily will run the quarter where he has turned in a 47.9. Majoring in History.
- ERIC FRISCHE A senior from Glen Head, New York (Choate School). Veteran campaigner who is expected to have his best year in 1965. Last year he was the number one sprinter and at the season's end was named the Most Competitive Point Winner. A tough little guy who can be a crowd pleaser, as evidenced by his upset 100-yard dash victory in the Big Meet last year. Has top marks of 9.5 and 21.1, both recorded in 1963 while running with bone chips in his ankle. Placed sixth in the N.C.A.A. 220-yard dash in 1964. Majoring in Biology.
- BOB McINTYRE A senior from Medford, Oregon (Medford High School). The Iron Man of the 1964 team, Bob will be pressed into sprinting duty only when necessary. For the most part, his efforts here will consist of running a leg on the 440-relay team. Top events are the Long Jump and the 440, but his versatility makes him a key man in Coach Payton Jordan's 1965 plans. Co-Captain of the team. Majoring in Biology.

LARRY QUESTAD - A junior from Livingston, Montana (Park County High School). Currently wears the title of the fastest man in Stanford track and field history. As a sophomore two seasons ago, Questad sped to 9.3 and 20.6 clockings for a pair of Indian records. Larry also captured the N.C.A.A. 100-yard dash title and gained a second in the 220. Then recognized as one of the nation's top sprinters, Larry may have to prove himself again this year after laying out most of the 1964 campaign with a slight leg injury. Gained international experience during 1963 when he competed in the Zhamensky Brothers meet in Moscow, Russia, and toured Finland and England. Besides sprinting duties, he will also run a leg on the 440-relay team and could see action in the 440 and mile relay. Majoring in Mechanical Engineering.

DALE RUBIN - A junior from Oakland (McClymonds High School). A welcome addition to the Stanford team. Dale is expected to add depth to an already strong sprinting corps. Came to the Farm from Oakland City College where he raced to times of 9.6 and 20.6. A front line sprinter with great spirit, Dale will push the others and could end up as the best of the bunch. A member of the varsity football team. Majoring in Psychology.

DICK BARDIN - A sophomore from Arcadia (Arcadia High School). Dick has a bright future ahead, but needs plenty

of preparation before realizing his full potential. Should be a fine runner before his undergraduate days are over. As a member of the Frosh squad, Dick had a best of 50.5. Majoring in Civil Engineering.

KEN FRASER - Ken is one of the most powerful 440 runners in the A.A.W.U. Injuries handicapped him until last season, and now with a solid year of competition behind him, he is expected to have an outstanding season. Has good speed and strength, and also will run a leg on the Mile Relay team in addition to possible use in the 220. Had a best last year of 47.9.

- TERRY FREDRICKSON A sophomore from Northfield, Minnesota (Northfield High School). After seeing duty in events ranging from the 100 to 880 as a freshman, Terry will concentrate on the half-mile this year. Coach Payton Jordan also has plans to use him some in the 440 and relays. Has fine potential in both the quarter and the half. Majoring in History.
- GLENN HAVSKJOLD A sophomore from Havre, Montana (Havre High School). Will be a regular in the 440 and Mile Relay in his initial year of varsity competition. Is strong and has good speed. Glenn was one of the top point getters on the Frosh team as he competed in the 100, 220, 440, and Long Jump. Best quarter time is 48.8. Majoring in Mechanical Engineering.
- BOB McINTYRE Bob's race this year will be the 440. He is a team performer who will go in any direction to help the squad. Last year, his all-around efforts gained Bob the Iron Man award.
- ART MILLER A junior from Pacheco (College Park High School). Transfer from Diablo Valley College, where he was coached by ex-Indian track great Gay Bryan. Art is a coach's delight. The biggest problem posed by this youngster is where to utilize him most effectively. Probably will specialize in the 330 Hurdles and the Triple Jump, but could run the quarter where he has a 49.3 mark. Majoring in English.
- JACK O'BRIEN A sophomore from Ventura (Ventura High School). A gutty performer up from the Frosh. Fine team man who will make the veterans hustle. No one slows down with Jack around. In addition to fine competitive spirit, he has good speed and will be a key performer at this distance. Top mark is 49.5. Majoring in Biology.

LOSSES IN THIS EVENT: Bill Pratt, one of the finest middle distance runners in Stanford history. Pratt was the 1964 A.A.W.U. champ in the 880. Bob Miltz, the 1963 A.A.W.U. champion. Both are big losses.

- DAVE DEUBNER A junior from Orinda (North Eugene, Oregon, High School). Currently the number one half-miler, but is being pressed for that position. However, Jordan is not anticipating too much use of Dave in this event. The two-mile and mile will be Dave's main events. As a high school performer at North Eugene, Dave broke all of Dyrol Burleson's Oregon prep records. As a freshman at Stanford he cracked the school three-mile mark at 13:57.7. A top student majoring in Physics.
- TERRY FREDRICKSON A new event for Terry, but he is a fast learner and should be able to utilize his strength and speed to do a good job.
- RANDY HYVONEN A sophomore from Red Lodge, Montana (Red Lodge High School). Randy has the potential to become one of Stanford's finest half-milers. Is one of the top prospects off the Frosh squad, where he had a best of 1:55.1 last year. The boy is strong, dedicated, and very coachable. Has a 4:11.2 mile to his credit and will be used in the longer run if needed. The half will be his key event. Majoring in German.

LOSSES IN THIS EVENT: Harry McCalla, two-time Cross-Country All-American and Stanford record holder in the 3000-meter steeplechase, 8:59.6.

- HARLAN ANDREWS A senior from Eugene, Oregon (North Eugene High School). Harlan and Paul Schlicke form the backbone of the Indian mile corps. A veteran with experience, strength, and fine conditioning, Jordan expects Andrews to start running with authority this season. Has best of 4:07.0 in the event, but has the ability to double in the 880 or two-mile. Was one of the top performers on the unbeaten Stanford cross-country team. Majoring in Electrical Engineering.
- DAVE DEUBNER Dave will be available in this event. He has a best of 4:09.5.
- MARTIN HILL A junior from San Joaquin (Tranquillity High School). Rapidly developing distance runner whose best race right now is the two-mile. Has clocked 4:25.5 for the mile and could be used here as a depth factor. Majoring in Chemistry.
- RANDY HYVONEN Another who will run here if needed. Best time is 4:11.2.
- WEYM KIRKLAND A senior from Winnetka, Illinois (New Trier High School). Weym is a gifted runner who, through continued application and dedication, could develop into one of the best distance performers in the country. Is a tough competitor, with a lot of pride, and can handle anything from the 880 to the 5000 meters. In 1963 he placed fourth in the N.C.A.A. three-mile at Albuquerque. He has been one of the top cross-country performers for the past four years, and during the past two seasons shared the Most Valuable award with Harry McCalla. Best marks are 4:11.8 and 8:58.2. Majoring in English.

# 1965 STANFORD TRACK AND FIELD COACHING STAFF

# PAYTON JORDAN, HEAD COACH (Ninth Year)

A champion sprinter as a competitor, Payton Jordan is now widely known as a developer of champions as a coach.

In his nine years as the head track and field coach at Stanford, he has repeatedly demonstrated ability to inspire championship calibre performers and teams. Payt's athletes have demolished more than twenty world, national, and all-time Stanford records in that period.

His most recent triumph at Stanford was in coaching sprinter Larry Questad and discus thrower Dave Weill to national collegiate titles, and in guiding the Indians to a surprising second place finish in the 1963 NCAA finals at Albuquerque.

Off the Farm, Jordan's success has not gone unnoticed. The United States Olympic Committee paid him a supreme compliment by naming him first assistant coach for the U.S. men's track and field delegation at the 1964 Olympic Games in Tokyo. In addition, Stanford's personable, dynamic, and technically wise coach headed the AAU team which triumphed over the U.S.S.R., Poland, Germany, and Great Britain two summers ago.

His flare for organization and progressive coaching ideas also have been recognized by his brothers in the coaching fraternity. Payton currently serves as Vice President of the International Track and Field Coaches Association, and was president of the National Collegiate Track Coaches Association in 1958. He was directly responsible for bringing to Stanford and directing two of the most successful meets ever staged in the United States: the 1960 U.S. Olympic Trials and the U.S.-U.S.S.R. dual meet in 1962.

Jordan's success as a top flight coach spans twenty-five years. After several years at the high school level, he became coach at Occidental College in 1946; and in one decade brought Oxy's track program into the national spotlight. His squads won ten straight conference titles, never lost a league dual meet, placed fourth in the 1951 NCAA meet, and won two NAIA crowns. Among the best known of his Occidental athletes are the late Bob Gutowski, former world record holder in the pole vault and 1956 U.S. Olympic Team member; John Barnes and Bob McMillen, members of the 1952 U.S. Olympic team; and George Roubanis, 1956 Greek Olympic team member.

Since Jordan came to Stanford in September, 1957, Indian track fortunes have steadily risen. His best known athletes at Stanford are Ernie Cunliffe, member of the 1960 U.S. Olympic team and holder of Stanford records in the 880, 1:47.3, and Mile, 4:00.4, and a world record of 2:07.3 for 1000 yards; Dave Weill, bronze medalist in the 1964 Olym-

pic discus throw; and Larry Questad, school record holder in the 100 and 220 dashes. Other top athletes who came under Jordan's influence are Jerry Winters, shot put; Art Batchelder, javelin; Chuck Cobb, hurdles; Dan Moore, long jump; and Phil White, pole vault.

Jordan, who was born in Whittier on March 19, 1917, was raised in Pasadena where he started setting records in high school. As a prep, his best marks were 10.0 in the 100 and 21.9 in the 220.

He spent one year, 1935, at Santa Monica Junior College, running a 9.6 in the 100 and 21.1 in the 220--a national record. In 1936 he enrolled at the University of Southern California, where he blossomed into an all-around performer, participating in football and rugby and as captain of the 1939 track team.

Payton's greatest achievements in track and field were still ahead when he received his diploma in 1939. He ran the 100 in 9.3, and had other top marks of 20.4 (220), 48.0 (440), and 23-11 (long jump).

Payton is married, has two daughters, and lives in  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Los}}$  Altos.

# JEROME K. (JERRY) BARLAND, ASSISTANT COACH (First Year)

In his first year at Stanford, Jerry has already established himself as a mighty handy man to have around. Appointed to the position only last summer, Jerry handled the cross-country program while Coach Payton Jordan was in Tokyo, and led the team to an unbeaten season and the best record in Stanford history.

Before coming to the Farm, Jerry coached cross-country and track and field for four years at Bishop Amat High School in La Puente. A graduate of the University of Kansas where he received his Bachelor of Science and Master's degrees, Jerry competed in track and field as an undergraduate, and was later an assistant freshman football coach and head varsity soccer coach at the school. He attended University of Norway in the summer of 1958.

In addition to teaching physical education at his Alma Mater, the Indian assistant coached basketball and track and field at high schools in Kansas and Missouri. He had been at Bishop Amat since 1961, where his track and cross-country teams were league co-champions and compiled marks of 17-7-1 and 12-5, respectively. In 1963 Jerry inaugurated the Bishop Amat Metric Distance Invitational Relays.

Jerry was born in Damar, Kansas, on September 20, 1930.

### STANFORD STADIUM

Nearly all of Stanford's home track and field meets are held on the campus in Stanford Stadium, one of the largest and finest arenas of its kind in the country. Built in 1921, the stadium had a seating capacity of 60,000 which, through subsequent additions, has since been raised to 90,000.

Home of the Stanford football team in the fall, the stadium has also gained a wide reputation for its track and field facilities. A 440-yard running track of decomposed granite completely encircles the turfed area where the field events are contested. The runways for all field events are grass.

Since its construction, the stadium has been the site of several national and international meets--the most recent having been the 1960 Final United States Olympic Trials and the 1962 dual meet between the Soviet Union and the United States. These two events broke all records for attendance, caliber of competition, color and drama.

### STANFORD TRACK AND FIELD HISTORY IN BRIEF

Stanford track and field athletes have been breaking countless world, national, regional, and event standards for nearly three-quarters of a century. Many participants have been members of Uncle Sam's Olympic Games squads and a number have won Gold, Silver, or Bronze medals. From a team standpoint, the Indians have won national, conference, and relay titles. The school's record over the years is one of the finest in the country.

The Indians' track and field history can roughly be broken into three great eras -The "Dink" Templeton Regime of 1918 and 1921-1939, <u>The Jack Weiershauser Regime</u> of 1946-56, and <u>The Payton Jordan Regime</u> of 1957 to the present.

The late Robert Lyman (Dink) Templeton was one of the greatest coaches the sport has known. His record speaks for itself. His teams won the then blue ribbon ICAAA Meet four times, the NCAA thrice, and turned in a dozen world record performances.

Although Templeton's star pupils were legion, the name of <u>Ben Eastman</u> stands out above them all. Under Dink's guidance, Ben revolutionized middle distance running in the short space of two weeks. The world mark in the 440-yard dash of 47.4 had been set in 1916, and it was fairly generally accepted that this mark was quite safe. And it was, for 16 years, until March 26, 1932. That day at Angell Field, Eastman travelled the first 220 in 21.3 (faster than the flat 220 was run in the meet that afternoon) and broke the tape nearly 20 yards in front of the second-place man in the time of 46.4, a full second ahead of the old mark.

But Ben wasn't through rewriting the record books. Two weeks later, on April 9, he set out to break the half-mile mark of 1:51.6, set by the great German runner, Dr. Otto Peltzer in 1926. Lack of experience in the longer race caused him to run his first lap too slowly, but the second was a masterpiece and Ben broke the tape in 1:51.3.

Templeton always had great weight men. Never to be forgotten was the tremendous 1-2 punch of <u>Harlow Rothert</u> and the late <u>Eric Krenz</u>, 1928-30. The former set a world record of 52-1 5/8 in the shot put and the latter did likewise in the discus, 167-5 3/8, and each was close behind the other in his specialty. John Lyman was the first man in the world to put the shot 54 feet (54-1) in 1934.

The pole vaulters were headed by <u>Bill Miller</u>, 1932 Olympic Champion at 14-17/8, and <u>Bud Deacon</u> who cleared 14-23/4 in the University Championships in 1934. There were plenty of fine sprinters including <u>Clyde Jeffrey</u>, who held the school record, 9.4, for 24 years. The high jumpers, of course, were headed by 1928 Champion <u>Bob King</u> (6-65/8).

Another of Dink's prize pupils was "Iron Man" Jack Weiershauser, a star in the sprints, 440- and 220-yard low hurdles. He teamed with Jim Kneubuhl, <u>Ray Malott</u>, and <u>Stan Hiserman</u> (present coach at the University of Washington) to set a new world record in the 880-yard relay.

Later as head coach himself, Weiershauser - the "Iron Man" of the Dink Templeton era - coached two of the greatest all-around track and field athletes ever: <u>Bob Mathias</u>, 1948 and 1952 Olympic Decathlon Champion and former world record holder, and <u>Gay</u> Bryan.

Mathias' efforts in the Olympic games are well known. In dual meets, he often entered five events, winning three and placing second or third in the other two. He still holds the All-Time Stanford record in the 110-meter hurdles at 13.8.

Bryan, on April 29, 1950, had the greatest afternoon ever turned in by a Redskin in a dual track and field meet. Against UCLA, Gay entered and won five events: high jump (6-4 3/8), 100 (10 flat); high hurdles (14.7), 220 (21.9); and long jump (23-1 1/2). In the Big Meet of May 7, 1949, he won four events: the 100 (9.8), high jump (6-4), 220 (21.1), and low hurdles (23.8), and placed second in the long jump by an inch.

The Weiershauser era also saw the greatest group of javelin throwers in Stanford history, including Bud Held, John Bugge, Bob Kimball, Leo Long, Kirk Nieland, Chuck Harlow Jr., Chuck Coker and Hank Roldan.

The Payton Jordan era is highlighted elsewhere in the book.

It is impossible, of course, to list all of the outstanding athletes who have competed in track and field at Stanford in such a short space. Many more names can be found in the records below.
