'jackets division champs

Given a tremendous boost by muscleman Dan Mosley's 181-foot discus throw and sprinter Ernie Boston's double victory, Berkeley High scored 61 points to upset Pittsburg in the North Coast Sub-Section I track and field championships on the Pirate oval yesterday.

Six varsity records were broken and one tied as coach Rich Hacker's Yellowjackets also got come - through non-winning efforts from hurdler Tony Newsom, quarter-miler Jim Ellis and miler Jon Heinstein to hand the defending champion Pirates their first loss of the season.

Pittsburg, which failed to come up to expectations in the high hurdles, 440 and long jump, finished second by six points. Richmond was a dis-

tant third with 24.

Berkeley accounted for four of the new marks with Mosley's astounding toss; Vern McCalla's narrow 1:54.9 triumph in the 880; the fleet Boston's 21.7 for the 220 around a turn and a sub-par 9:13.3 by Ralph Gamez in the

The 181-foot discus throw by Mosley is the best prep effort in the state this year and two inches short of the Eastbay's best ever by state champ Bill Satley of Las Lomas last year. The big senior's previous longest heave was 169-8

in the Alameda County Athletic League trials.

Pittsburg junior Don Pierce scaled 6-5½ to break the high jump record and Robert Redditt of Ells went out 23-4 to

topple the long jump standard.
The Bucs' Larry Lawson, leading all the way, surprised Jim Lockard of Arroyo to tie the low hurdles record of 19.2. Lockard had the same time.

Pittsburg's title hopes received a jolt in the first race when Greg McKinney of El Cerrito skimmed to a 14.5 high hurdle victory to beat out Lawson and Jessie Currie. The Gaucho pulled back in front to stay after Lawson caught him at the sixth hurdle.

McCalla took the 880 lead from George Coon of Miramonte coming out of the last turn. The latter held off Berkeley's Darryl Bartlow but couldn't catch McCalla in the sprint for the tape. Both Coon and Bartlow clocked 1:55 flat.

Boston led from the blocks enroute to a 9.9 win in the 100, and took the lead midway the turn in the 220. His curve time missed by only a 10th of a second tying the straight-

away record.

Gamez, who posted a 9:11.5 a week ago, missed a hoped-for 9:05 because of fifth and sixth-lap times of 71.3 and

Sherman Carter, Pittsburg's fine miler, built up a 15-yard lead which Jon Heinstein of Berkeley closed to four in the final straightaway before the Pirate kicked away to a 4:22.5 victory.

Ike Gayfield was the Pirates' fourth winner with a

49.2 in the 440.

Jim Peters of Piedmont and Mike Johnston of Mt. Diablo both surpassed 170 feet behind Mosley in the discus, and Miramonte's Tom Gilmore pole vaulted 13-6 but had more misses than Alan Balmforth

of El Cerrito.

Mosley took second in the shot put behind the 57-10 effort by Mickey Wharton of Clay-

ton Valley.

A 6-41/4 high jump by Marion Anderson of victorious El Cerrito, which would have taken second in the varsity meet, was one of five records broken or tied in the class B competition.
