

ARMY WINS TRACK MEET

Takes 12 Of 20 Firsts In Interservice Event

Quantico, Va., June 17 (AP)—The Army's track and field team wound up its domination of the Inter-service Championships today by winning seven of

the 13 final events on the program.

All told, in two days of competition at the Marine Corps Schools' Butler Stadium here, Army contestants captured 12 of 20 events. The host Marine Corps took four, the Air Force three, the Navy only one.

Clark Wins Again

The Marines' Bill Clark, who had won the 5,000-meter run yesterday, added the 10,000-meter title today with a 31.05.8 clocking.

The two-day meet's only other double winner was the Army's

Bob Stoecker, who won the discuss yesterday and took the shotput today with a heave of 50 feet, 5 inches.

Five runners qualified for the National A.A.U. Championships in the 800-meter run today, led by winner John Perry of the Marine Corps, who was timed in 1.48.4. The other qualifiers were Tom Farrell of the Army, Rex Garvin of the Marines, Barry Sugden of the Army and Morgan Groth of the Marines.
