NEILL DUGGAN AND SAN DIEGO MESA POST NEW JC INDOOR MARKS

Neill Duggan and the San Diego Mesa mile relay team are the newest additions to the working list of unofficial junior college indoor track and field records.

JC TRACK & FIELD is attempting to complete this list (compiled by Jack Shepard and Fred Baer) and would appreciate the assistance of all JC track followers in providing information on any marks that qualify for this list--or come close to the standards on this list; also performances in other events for which we do not yet list a mark.

Duggan, Allan Hancock sophomore from England, ran a 4:08.2 mile at Albuquerque, Jan. 28, lowering his own mark or 4:11.2 set earlier at Saskatoon.

At the L.A. Invitational Jan. 21, San Diego Mesa upset favored L.A. Pierce in the first section of the JC mile relay, running 3:23.4 to better Orange Coast's year old meet mark of 3:26.0. The 3:23.4 is the best we have on record for a JC indoor mile relay, topping Mt. San Antonio's 3:24.5 in 1961. Our data is not complete, however.

Running for Mesa were sophomores Bill Millar (51.3), Jay Elbel (50.5) and Harold Moore (50.5), plus freshman anchorman Wesley Williams (51.1).

Pierce was also under OCC's meet mark with a 3:25.6 for second. Orange Coast won its section in 3:30.1.
