SAN DIEGO MESA CONTINUES RELAY RECORD STREAK

The San Diego Mesa mile relay team bettered the unofficial national JC record in each of the three indoor meets in which it competed this winter.

That includes back to back efforts this month at San Diego and Los Angeles.

At the Feb. 4 San Diego Indoor Games, Mesa ran 3:22.5 to better its 3:23.4 mark set in January at the Los Angeles Invitational. Bill Millar led off with a 51.4 quarter, followed by Jay Elbel (49.9), Harold Moore (50.7), and Wesley Williams (50.5).

Last Saturday (Feb. 11) in the Los Angeles Times Indoor, Mesa was third at the first pass behind Fullerton JC and LA Pierce after Millar's 51.4 leg. Elbel put Mesa in first place for good with a 49.4 second leg and Pierce took over second place. Moore ran 50.2 and Williams 49.9 to cinch the win.

TRACK NOTES...Pasadena CC has not lost a dual meet since 1964 and has 17 straight victories going into the season opener with El Camino on Feb. 17. PCC has 14 lettermen back from last year and picked up last year's top prep pole vaulter, Paul Heglar from Muir High, and his hurdling teammate Tony Caruthers. Ted Banks, PCC cross country coach and for two years assistant to head track coach Mickey Anderson, will join Anderson this year as co-coach of the Lancer spike team.
