FITZSIMONS TO MAKE AMERICAN DEBUT AT LONG BEACH

John FitzSimons, British Commonwealth champion and English record holder (261-9) in the javelin, will be making his first meet appearance on American soil when he throws for the Trojans in Saturday's Long Beach Relays.

FitzSimons, whose practice efforts indicate he's already in top form, is expected to face a tough competitive field including Frank Covelli (273-5%), former NCAA and National AAU champion; Larry Stuart (272-%), USC record holder (267-3) and onetime National AAU champ; and Eric Christianson, ex-New Mexico athlete now competing for the 49er Track Club.

TROY, BRUINS TO CLASH IN 440 RELAY

The first of several exciting duels in the sprint relays between USC and UCLA comes up Saturday at Long Beach. Vern Wolfe's Trojans will enter a formidable combination consisting of Earl McCullouch, Fred Kuller, O. J. Simpson and Lennox Miller against the Bruins' probable foursome of Ron Copeland, Harold Busby, Tom Jones and Norm Jackson.

UCLA ran a blazing 39.9 to win the NCAA crown last year with quartermiler Bob Frey on the team, and the addition of 9.4 sprinter Busby figures to make an improvement. Two of the Trojans, Miller and Kuller, have 9.3s to their credit, while Simpson has done 9.6 and McCullouch is a 13.7 high hurdler.

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In the two mile relay, the Trojans will attempt to defend their 1966 title without 880 school record holder Dennis Carr, who is running a 1320 in the distance medley relay and is entered in the open three mile race. Troy's team probably will include three sophomores, Craig Grant, Rich Joyce and Carl Trentadue, and returnee Dave Buck. It faces a tough UCLA combo of Kurt Klein, Bob Goodson, Les Fendia and Arnd Kruger, a 1:48.4 800-meter man.

Discus ace Gary Carlsen, who set a Long Beach meet record of 188-4% last year, will defend his title against such throwers as Bob Humphreys of the Pasadena AA who had a best of 201-0 last year.
