

LOS ALTOS HILLS—The setting will be different, but the results of the SPAL Track and Field finals tonight at Foothill College may be just a rerun of last week's Sequoia District meet.

The same teams, Carlmont, Menlo-Atherton and Se-

quoia who topped the district event, are favored to capture the team title when the nine SPAL schools and the three Palo Alto junior highs gather at 6:30 on the allweather oval.

The first varsity running event, the 440-yard relay, will get under way at 7 o'clock, according to meet director Ross Presley of Palo Alto High. The lightweight two-mile and an outstanding array of field athletes will start at 6:30.

Carlmont has the manpower to be labeled as the favorite in five of the 15 varsity events. The likes of Jim Penrose, Chris and Pat Carey and Eric Reich give coach Loren Lansberry sure-fire strength in five events.

Menlo-Atherton should be the closest team to Carlmont when the final points are tallied, thanks to sprinter Bill Hatcher.

Hatcher is a good bet to win the 100 and 220 and anchor the 440-yard relay team to victory, but Sequoia's Tim O'Connor has been gaining on the Bear sprinter and could pull an upset or two in the sprints.

Sequoia's bid for third spot depends mainly on second and third places, although it has the cindermen to capture the open 440 (Darryl White) and 880 re-

It should be a tossup for fourth spot between Palo Alto and Woodside. The Vikings might have a slight edge due to the likes of high jumper Mark Daley and middle-distance man Bill Respini.

Woodside should sweep the hurdles with Frazier Leslie, the league's best, and Chan Warden should be a point-getter in the long jump, 220 and 440.

Five meet records are in danger with Penrose the only athlete who has a better mark than the present record. His best of 180-31/2 in the discus is five feet better than the existing meet record.
