

GREEN, CARLOS HEAD SWIFT CENTURY FIELD TODAY

There's more than three hours of exciting track and field competition on tap here today in the third annual San Jose State Invitational, but what may prove to be the highlight of the whole show will require only nine seconds, give or take a few.

The "dream duel" of the season will match Olympic medalist Charlie Greene, former Nebraska flash, against San Jose State's super star sprinter John Carlos in the 100-yard dash.

Don't dare blink, you might miss the whole thing.

Greene is currently a shareholder of the 9.1 century world record along with Bob Hayes ('63), Harry Jerome ('66), and Jim Hines ('67). Charlie added his name to the list on June 15, 1967 at Provo, Utah.

Since that time nobody has been able to equal the feat. But last week at the Mt. San Antonio Relays Carlos blazed to a 9.2 clocking in a race in which he left everyone choking on his afterburners.

Earlier this week at the weekly Northern California Track Writers luncheon, Carlos was asked what goal he was aiming at in the 100. "I would like to get an 8.9 or 8.8," Carlos replied. "I hope to get it before the year is out."

The sportswriters came out the next day stating that Carlos had predicted he would run those fantastic times today against Greene. It made for good copy, but upset John. "I'll be running whatever it takes to win," Carlos reaffirmed. John respects Greene, stating that Charlie has won the majority of the races the two have been involved in over recent years.

Greene won't be the only fella Carlos will have to worry about. Nobody can afford to overlook the rest of the field which includes Ronnie Ray Smith, who shares the world record of 9.9 in the 100 meters with Charlie and Jim Hines; Billy Gaines, who two weeks ago ran a wind-aided 9.2 on this same track; and Jerry Williams, who shares the stadium record of 9.4 with Gaines and Carlos.

Another race which is expected to be a thriller is the 220 where Carlos and quarter-mile star Lee Evans will match up, putting in jeopardy the world record mark of 20 flat, established by former Spartan star Tommie Smith two years ago.
