

'Sprinter' Adams Jolts CCS List

With most area track and field contingents preparing for the Central Coast Section meet, as well as the region and State meets, little change took place in the CSS's top times and distances during the week.

Los Altos' Chris Adams, who already tops the Section in the shot put (61-9½) and discus (198-0), plus holding the second best time in the 180-yard low hurdles, added his name to the list of outstanding sprinters.

The muscular Adams ran the century in 10.0 during Friday's meet with Mountain View to move into a six-way

tie for fifth spot in the Section.

In addition, Adams runs the first leg on the Knight's 440 relay team which ranks fourth in the Section with a 43.9.

Joe Wyrick of Mount Pleasant jumped 6-4¼ in Saturday's Blossom Hill Relays to move into a tie for the CCS top spot with Mills' Bill Kahn.

Another Section season best was recorded by Cupertino's 440 relay squad. The Pioneer foursome, anchored by sprint whiz Jeff Fowler (9.9 season best), romped to a 43.3 clocking in the quarter mile Saturday in the Blossom.

Track Sweeps 3

M-A's varsity track got off to a flying start with victories over Campbell, Oak Grove, and Lowell of San Francisco.

The victories over Campbell and Oak Grove came at a triangular meet between the three schools on M-A's home track. The rain-soaked meet against Lowell was held Monday in San Francisco.

There were quite a number of standouts during the two meets, however. Two that should not go without special mention are Ken Murphy and Ernie Reese. On Friday, Ken won the long jump, 180-yard low hurdles, finished second to teammate Dan Meub in the triple jump, and ran a leg on the victorious 440-yard relay team. Reese won the 100 and the 440, and placed in the shot put. Meub also was quite impressive in a second in the 880 and second in the 220.

Other standouts in Friday's meet were Jeff Jennings, 11'3" in the pole vault; Ron Schloss, 10:15 in the two mile; Mike Rountree, 4:47 in the mile; and Conrad Everhardt in the high hurdles.

M-A's JV track team met with equal success in downing the same three teams. Some of the winners in the two meets included Randy Rivers in the 120 low hurdles, Reginald Turner in the long jump, Cam Miller in the 440, Steve Garvey in the mile, and two-miler Harry Wong.

The M-A frosh, however, have not met with great success. They have dropped all three pre-season decisions. Despite a discouraging team record, however, good performances have been turned in by Steve Ogburn, Ralph Brown, and Dave Lewis.

No More F's in P.E.

The Sequoia Board of Trustees voted two weeks ago in favor of a "no-failure" physical education course. The 3-2 vote will affect the six district schools. 3/13/70

Under the new policy, which will go into effect next fall, the student gets an "A," "B," "C," or "D" grade (no "F") and receives full credit for the course. Behavior problems--cutting, failure to participate etc.--will be grounds for detention, suspension, and/or expulsion.

The present system requires the student who fails P.E. to enroll in two classes for the following year. A senior may not graduate with an "F" in P.E. until it is made up.

Another proposal which had been considered would have given the student the option of making up P.E. or taking another course in order to make up lost credits due to failure in the previous year. At a meeting last July, a spokesman for the women's P.E. teachers spoke in favor of the above policy and against "no-failure." A spokesman for the men's P.E. teachers spoke against both proposals and urged the continuance of the district's present policy.

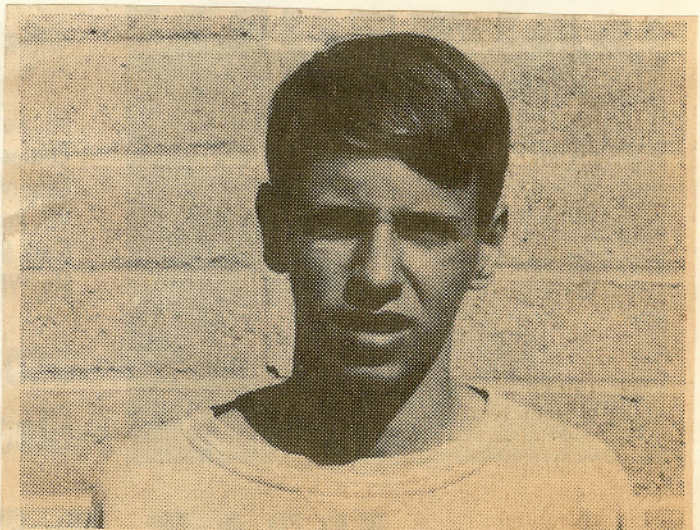
In the world of athletics, some performers jump off to quick starts and some take their time.

The thing that counts is the clutch performances for the big test, and if Thursday was any indication of the performances to come, the Bear track team is in business.

I am speaking of the Bears' top sprinter, Ernie Reese, and the top weight man, Bill Long. Reese won the 100, 220, and ran a leg on the winning 440 relay team. The point is, Reese has been doing his thing all year, but he lays it all on the line against Woodside.
