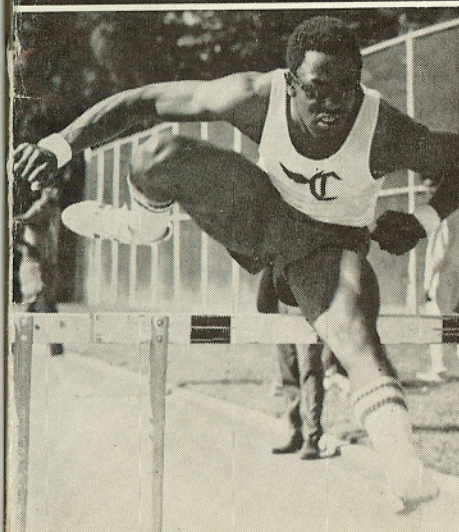

Northern California Schools Present Potent Threat To Southern California's Track Dominance

This year's State Championships find 204 schools sending 470 athletes to vie for honors, but only those teams with exceptional balance and topnotch performers can hope to grab the coveted State title.

From Northern California, Los Altos High School presents such a group of stars: Chris Adams, shot and discus, with a mark in the latter event good enough to be up for consideration as a national standard, 201'; but the athlete upon whose shoulders rests major responsibility for bringing Los Altos its first championship is Rick Brown, senior middle distance man. Brown, with best-in-state marks of 47.1 in the 440, 1:50.7 in the 880, and 3:15.8 in the mile relay team, also a best-of-state mark established when he ran a 46.5 anchor lap, will attempt this amazing triple. Quarter miler Jim Andrews, whose 47.8 qualifying mark is second best in the state, also runs on that relay team, as does Larry Davis, who qualified second in the 880 with a 1:52.7 among the best in the state. Bob Thompson, relay, and Vic Brooks, high hurdler, make up the rest of the Los Altos team.

From Southern California comes Morningside High of Inglewood with a top mile relay team, a sterling half miler in Percell Keeling, and a good high and low hurdler in Alfonso Hall. Santa Ana, with swifty Jackie White in the 100 and 220 and 440 relay (White took second in both sprints in the 1969 State Meet), and good hurdlers, also has the balance to score high.

From the Fresno area, the Hoover team presents a top sprinter in Leman Childress, a fine 440 relay team, and two good pole vaulters. Edison of Stockton, with good sprinters (Frank Roe and Clayton Montgomery), a fine mile relay team, and a top long jumper, Darrell Fultcher (23' 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ "'), might also score high. Pittsburg, El Cerrito, Castlemont, and Berkeley High also have big and well balanced squads, and all could figure.

As to some of the top individual performers, certainly Oceanside's Jerry Culp, a 7-foot high jumper, rates right up there with the best. Castlemont's "mighty mite" hurdler and relay man, Milton Turner, with two best-in-state marks of 18.3 and 13.7 (both tie State Meet records unofficially) will get enough competition to push him to even better marks.

The field in the two mile run is perhaps the fastest high school group ever assembled; the best 10 runners are under 9:17.4, the best six 9:10 and under, and the two toppers, Jim Chaffin, Long Beach Poly and Dave White, El Modena, are running 9:01.0 and 9:01.2! In fact, the 27th (and last) of the group, running 9:47 means that high school two milers are today shooting for the **nine minute** mark, whereas a decade ago when the event began to become popular with the preps, they shot for the **ten minute** mark!

Just how fast El Cerrito's Sammy Burns can run in the 100 and 220 may be established today. Last Saturday, at the Kennedy Games on this selfsame field, Burns, running anchor lap for the Gauchos, must have covered his 110 yards well under 10 flat, coming from five yards behind on a fast field that contained several 9:6 and 9:7 runners. El Cerrito was timed 41.3, under the CIF record. This junior flyer is beginning to round into top form right now.

CIF records go by the boards with great regularity, and this year eight are in danger: discus, low and high hurdles, mile relay, 440, high jump, long jump and perhaps most of all, the 440 relay.

Beginning in 1954, whenever the State Meet was held at Edwards Field, more often than not a Northern California team emerged victor; 1954, Alameda; 1957, Berkeley High; 1963, Edison of Fresno; in 1966, Dorsey of Los Angeles, and in 1968, Centennial of Compton, broke the Berkeley tradition. This year it would seem that Los Altos has a chance to start a new string of Northern wins on the Berkeley oval.

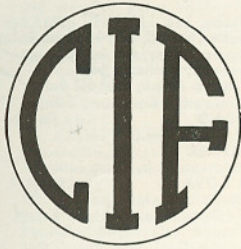

Honorary Referee of 1970 CIF Track Meet George R. Canrinus



George R. Canrinus, an outstanding teacher, administrator, successful coach, and athlete is the Honorary Referee for the 1970 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet.

Born in San Francisco, California, George was an excellent athlete in football, basketball, and track at Mission High School, San Francisco, and Burlingame High School, Burlingame. He enrolled at St. Mary's College, won his letters in football and basketball and made many all-Coast and honorable mention All-American teams playing at end. George graduated from St. Mary's with high academic honors and his A.B. He attended University of California for his California teaching credential and Stanford for his M.A.

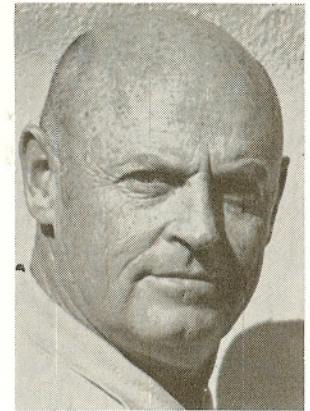
He began his teaching career at St. Mary's College as an assistant football coach under Edward P. 'Slip' Madigan. He spent four years, 1937-1940, coaching football and teaching at John Swett High School, Crockett, and then on to Abraham Lincoln High School, San Francisco, where he was that school's first varsity football coach and where he also coached track and basketball.

George was appointed Supervisor of Athletics for the San Francisco Unified School District in 1946; in 1951 he was appointed as the Coordinator of Health, Physical Education, Athletics, and Recreation for the district. During this time he helped found the Basketball Tournament of Champions. George served as San Francisco Section Secretary to the California Interscholastic Federation for many years and is active in many civic and fraternal organizations too numerous to mention.

He retired in February, 1970 and his designation as Honorary Referee of this year's State C.I.F. Meet, which is being co-hosted by the San Francisco City Schools, could not be more appropriate.

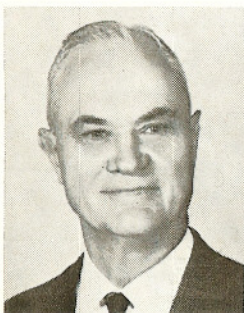

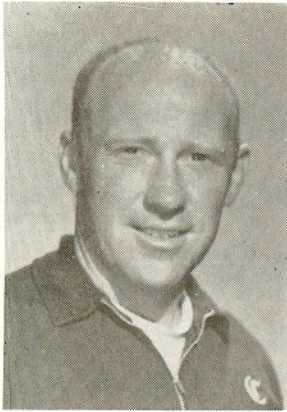
Del officiated basketball and football for some 15 years, and served as the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section representative to the State CIF Federated Council for 12 years.

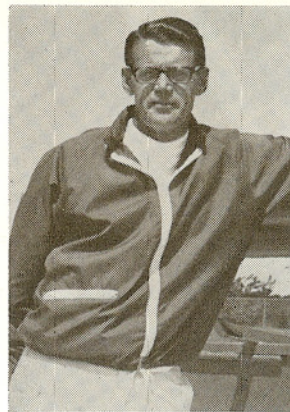

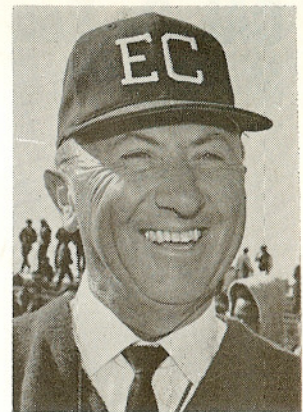

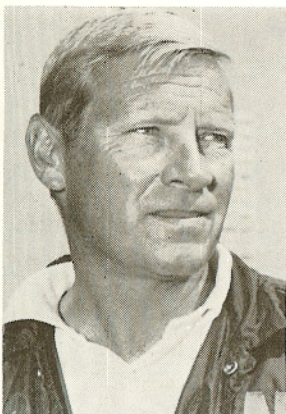

His 19-year record (varsity only) is 80 wins, 23 losses, 5 city championships, 5 league championships, 2 Valley Championships, and the '63 State Meet title. He has also coached cross country for 17 years, with 4 league and 3 Valley Championships.

HALE ROACH, North Coast Section, is one of the deans of track coaching in the United States. He has been at El Cerrito High School as track coach since 1944, has won the formidable ACAL title 5 times, 8 North Coast Section championships, and has won 27 relays victories. His current 440-yard relay team has a State best of 41.2, and his 1969 two-mile relay team ran a spectacular 7:44 at the Kennedy Games (U.C.). He twice managed the State Meet, 1954 and 1966, was president of California Coaches Association, 1965, and 1967 Northern California Coach of the Year. His dual meet record for the past 10 years is a spectacular 80 wins and 5 losses.

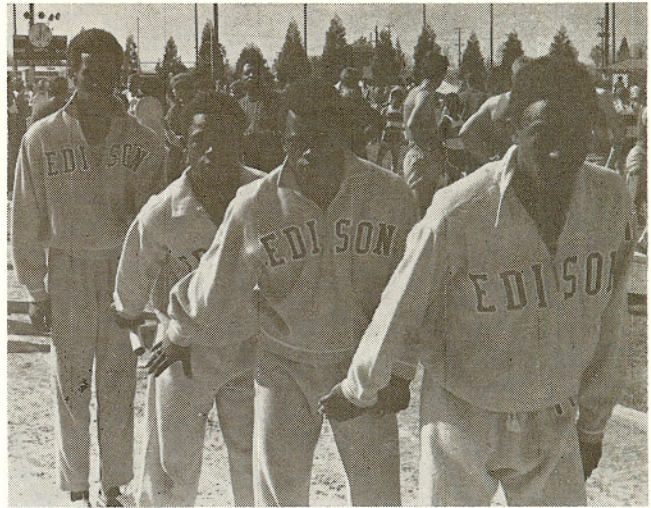

440 Relay Record Threatened

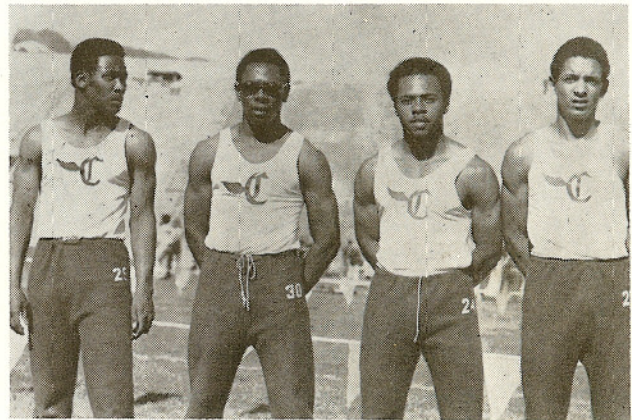
Two entries in the 1970 quarter-mile relay competition have bettered the State and CIF record of :41.5, while a third that also bettered the time during the preliminaries, Berkeley, failed to qualify in the North Coast finals when the leadoff runner tripped over a stone. With Berkeley High's fine quartet out of the picture, Castlemont and El Cerrito, each with :41.2 as their best 1970 times, will be prepared to fight it out for the State title against several swift entries from Southern California and from Edison of Stockton. El Cerrito, with :9.5 man Sammy Burns running anchor lap, can do a lot of catching up in the final 110 yards, but Castlemont has been very consistent in hitting below the state record. With Knight anchor man, Charles Gibson, healthy and loose, the Castlemonters may repeat their 1969 State Meet win; the same four men are running again this year, and in the same order.

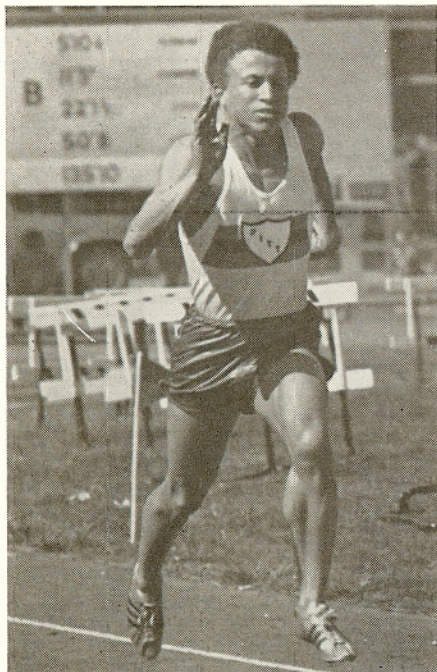

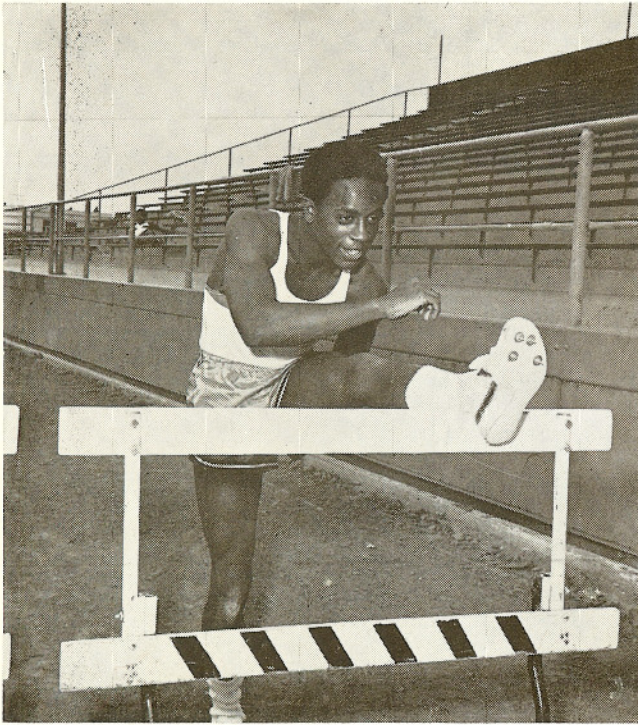

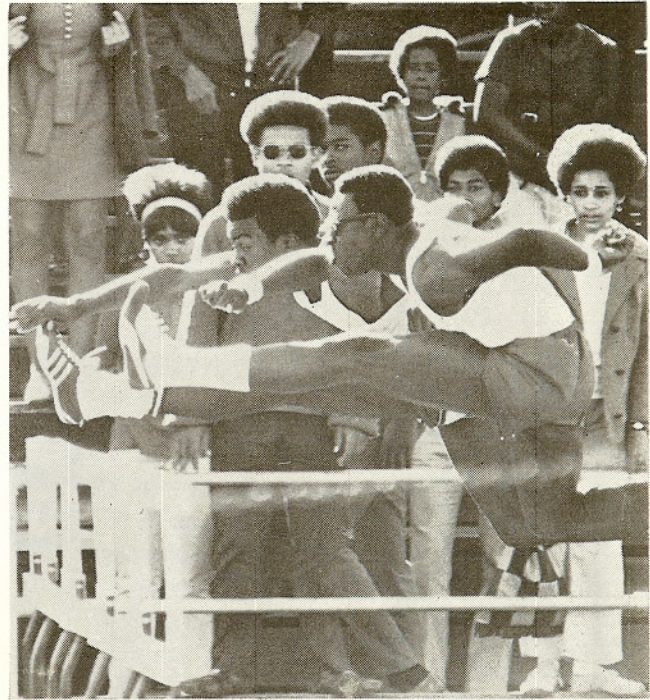

Keep your eyes on a duo of hurdlers from Pittsburg, Jared Butler and Lee Busby, and a "mighty mite" from Castlemont, Milton Turner, with the best times in both the high and low hurdles in Northern California. Top Southern California mark is :47.7, jointly held by Bill Hicks, Morningside of Inglewood, and Myron Mitchell of Lincoln, San Diego. Los Altos has two other runners, Jim Andrew and Larry Davis, both under :49.0, and both also members of the mile relay team. Any of the top three or four could be a threat to the 1969 State and CIF record set by Lemoore's Larence Jones, :46.6, if too much competition in other events doesn't cut down on speed and stamina. Thirteen Northern California runners bettered :49.0 this year one or more times!

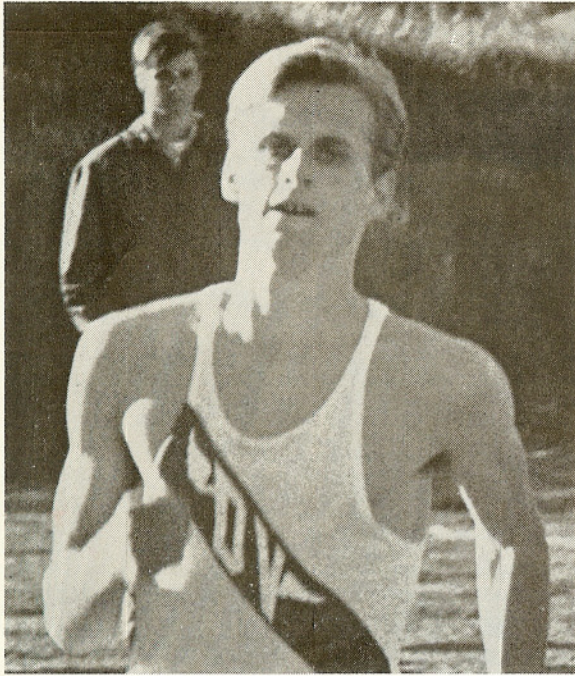

Of all the races in the 1970 State Meet, the low hurdles, run this year on a straightaway, gives promise of establishing a new record. 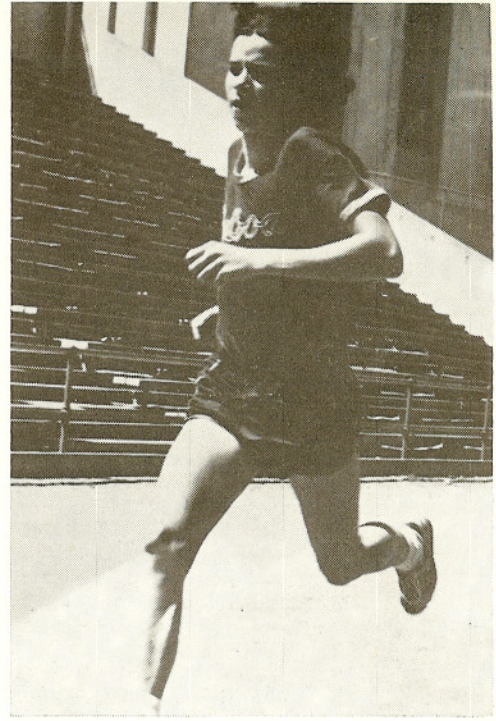
