EIGHTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT - 1970/1971

For presentation to the Annual General Meeting of Members to be held in the Theatre, Shell House, Garrington Street, Sydney, New South Wales, on Friday, June 11, 1971, at 7.30 p.m.

Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to present for your consideration and approval the eighty-fourth Annual Report of this Association.

Of course, as I pointed out last year, this Report is the result of the work of many people. While I do not intend to single out individual persons, I must draw to your attention the sterling work that the Honorary Assistant Secretary and Honorary Registrar, Mr. Ray Frith, has put in in respect of the Report. Although Mr. Frith is a retired man, one would never imagine this was so when it is calculated just how many hours per week he spends on Association work. In addition to the greater part of three days per week which he spends in the Office, he also attends innumerable meetings and officiates every Saturday throughout the trackseason and a great many weekends through the winter. The Association is indeed most fortunate to have a person of the calibre and enthusiasm of Ray Frith.

Once again, I would refer to the improvement of our athletic administration and draw the parallel between it and the improvement in our general athletic standards. Administrators will always make mistakes and earn the criticism of all and sundry, some of it informed but most of it highly uninformed. The current Executive Committee which bears the brunt of the day-to-day decision-making that is essential in such a large organisation has really functioned well in its attention to the interest, development and propagation of athletics. A small band of dedicated workers who sacrifice a great deal of their time in the interest of the sport have been well rewarded by the performance of the athletes.

The comment that was made in last year's Report regarding the standard of performance improving is certainly true for the current year. Again, without singling out individual performances, the really first class team effort that was evident in the Australian track and field championships in Brisbane last March had to be seen to be believed. In a really breath-taking finish in the final event (the 4 x 400 metres relay) the final runners, Bill Hooker from Victoria and Boris..... battled out an amazing last lap with Hooker edging to the front with two or three yards to go. On this result hung the fate of the Richard Coombes Shield and although New South Wales still tied with Victoria with six first places, the depth of talent available to our rivals enabled them to retain what was the most closely fought competition ever. So much for some of the pre championship press comments about N.S.W. being "lucky to win more than one gold medal". The N.S.W. team were out to prove otherwise. A really fine performance by all enthused by the inspired leadership of team captain, John Farrington. Congratulations Victoria! Watch out next year!

Mention of John Farrington must include our congratulations to this fine dedicated athlete for his repeated appearances for his country. There is no doubt that in John we have the leading distance runner in Australia and I am sure that this situation will continue for many years.

The Association Officers and members were horrified to hear of the terrible accident that befell Tom Houghton late in February. It is a great relief to us to know that, in the main due to his tremendous physique and strong character and willpower, he is recovering well. We have missed him greatly at Executives' meetings and even more so on the track. His unfailing good humour and desire to do the right thing at all times has gained him the respect of all. We are hoping to see him able to resume at least some of his activities in the near future.

A new system of appointment of Managers and coaches for Australian teams, has now been evolved and came into force on January 1 of this year. Since that date in future, all such appointments will be made by a sub-committee of the Union, a sort of managerial selection committee. This will eliminate all the mail votes and "state voting" for positions which a truly Australian team should not have. The last person appointed under the old system was Dr. Stan Chorlton, who was appointed to manage Derek Clayton when he competed in the Kosciuszko marathon in Czechoslovakia, last year. Our congratulations were extended to Dr. Chorlton on his well merited appointment and excellent report.

It is a great pity that whilst there has been again a marked improvement in the Association administration area, some of the sub committees which could do much to improve things do not function as well as they should. It is to be hoped that persons who nominate for positions on committees this year will be prepared to carry out all their responsibilities.

For the interest of members I once again am recording the attendances, not only of executive committee members but also with all delegates to the management council. Both make interesting reading.

At the 43rd Annual Conference of the Union, the Unions' merit Award was conferred on the Association's oldest life member - Pat Walsh. I believe that Mr. Walsh has been serving the A.A.A. of N.S.W. for 50 years and recognition by the Union of this service is a fitting tribute to him. It is hoped that Mr. Walsh will be present tonight to receive his medallion.

On behalf of the Association I would like to congratulate the St. George D.A.A.C. on attaining their 50th anniversary and to wish them well for the next 50 years.

Finally, again may I offer my grateful thanks to all Officers, Officials and athletes for their continued co-operation and help over the year and my very sincere thanks to our Administrative Secretary, Mrs. Shirley Went for her continued dedication to a job which has earned her the gratitude and respect of all.

AWARDS

E.S. MARIS MEMORIAL AWARD is awarded to M. McGrath for the outstanding Inter-Club best performance of 54ft 1½in Triple Jump. This was selected as the best single performance during the Track and Field Inter-Club Competition by the Track and Field Selection Committee.

RICHARD COOMBES MEMORIAL MEDAL is once again awarded to G. Knoke who culminated the Season's activities with a very fine Australian Championship win in the 400 metres hurdles with 50.4sec. The Track and Field Selection Committee in judging for this medal, had the report that Gary is an excellent team member who gives of his knowledge and experience to assist the Managers.

J.F. HOLLAND MEMORIAL TROPHY on this occasion is awarded to a Sub-Junior athlete. The recipient is W. Everingham with his Australian Junior Championship winning performance in the 400 metres of 48.2sec. Although the Track and Field Selection Committee were aware that Warwick received the award of the outstanding athlete at the Interstate match in mid-January at Brisbane, they were unanimous that this single record standard performance at the Australian Championships on a rain effected track was the one to win this selection.

G.P.S. PARKE MEMORIAL MEDALLION was awarded by the Harrier Board's Selection Committee to J. Farrington as the best distance runner over the 1970 Winter Season. John's championship winning performances in distance events in both the Winter and Summer speak for the correction of this selection, for they were numerous and of a high class.

SPORTS MEDICINE ASSOCIATION'S AWARDS. The Track and Field Selection Committee has selected P. Lawler and P. Farmer as the recipients of these awards, as the outstanding and most improved Senior and Junior Throwers in championship class, respectively.

This Committee is of the opinion that after full discussion on the correct Type of recorder is made, a report will be made to Council and if possible a suitable sponsor be found.

OFFICIALS ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

The Administrative Officials Committee met regularly on the first Tuesday during the months September to April and on such other occasions between as exigencies demanded.

Before the commencement of the season a circular was sent to some 150 known Officials living in the Metropolitan area, requesting certain information on their availability during the season, but, unfortunately, only about 50 percent replied which left a shortage of Graded Officials for the manning of all grounds.

Due to the unwillingness of some Officials to act incertain capacities and at certain grounds to assist the Association, the task of this Committee was rendered most difficult.

Key Officials were found for pre-season Meets and for many other Meets during the season.

We would like to thank those interested people who came forward though not trained officials, and assisted at the various outer-grounds, and also the Senior athletes themselves who rendered valuable service at the Senior Grounds, and without whose efforts it would not, on many occasions, have been possible to provide competition in many of the events.

To that core of hardworking, dedicated officials who willingly turned up wherever and whenever asked and undertook any and all duties requested of them on behalf of the Association, we say thank you.

HARRIER BOARD REPORT

Highlights of the 1970 Winter season were the performances of John Farrington in winning 3 of the 4 N.S.W. Championships as well as the Australian Marathon Championship and the close second of our State Marathon team in the Australian Championship.

Once again a wide variety of events were conducted under the control of the Harrier Board supplying competition for athletes of all ages and standards. All these events were well supported by Harrier Athletes and over 100 runners started in both the N.S.W. 10 Km C.C. and 20 Km C.C.

The major problem besetting the conduct of events during the season was once more the lack of officials. Every year the same few persons, some of whom are competing athletes, take the responsibility for measuring and marking courses, marshalling starters, timing and recording. Previous approaches to the Technical Committee have met with no response whatever. Full credit for the conduct of last years' events must go to Messrs. Dunn, Fleming and Lee-Archer, who were for some events the only operating officials.

For the future the Harrier Board will continue with its policy of variation in events and whole-hearted support of N.S.W. distance runners so that N.S.W. may again take the forefront in Australia.

INTER-CLUB BOARD REPORT

The Inter-Club Board conducted its competitions in Open Grades and in Age Divisions in three Zones in 1970-71. The Open Grades competitions were conducted on two grounds-- at Sydney Athletic Field and Hensley Athletic Field. Each grade was limited to six teams and the competitions were conducted in 11 grades. 66 teams were entered. Two full rounds concluded at Christmas and finals in all grades were held at Sydney Athletic Field on January 9 and 23. After that a post-Christmas competition was held in which each team entered one competitor in each division of each event instead of the usual team against team arrangement.

The Zones operated again at Chatswood Rotary Field (Northern), Campbell Oval, Canterbury (after four weeks at Henson Park, Marrickville) (Central), and Makepeace Oval, Fairfield (Western). The Zones conducted their own competitions in divisions from Under 16 down to Under 10 until Christmas and the Inter-Zone Finals were held at Sydney Athletic Field on February 20 and 27. In between time a successful series of Inter-Zone matches for Zone representative teams was held for all age groups by alternating between the three grounds.

N.S.W. RACE WALKING CLUB

The Club was again made responsible for the conduct and control of all New South Wales Winter road race walking championships which included the following events:

10,000 Metres
30 Kilo
Schoolboys
20 Kilo
50 Kilo

In addition officials from the Club act as technical officials at all walking events held in the Metropolitan area including the N.S.W. track walking championships. A comprehensive list of Club events was held throughout the year at various venues and the enthusiasm and keenness of Club members always ensured a good entry and high standard of competition. Club officers, assisted by making sure that the social as well as the technical side of the sport was properly developed.

THROWERS CLUB REPORT

The Throwers Club has continued with another active year. Our competitions are still held on a regular fortnightly basis at the E.S. Marks Field, and interest and participation is increasing.

There is no doubt now that this competition, with the added ready availability of experienced coaches, has assisted in the improvement in standards of throwing in both men's and women's events in New South Wales.

We Throwers thank our supporters and office bearers for their assistance to us individually and to the sport in general.

BIRUBI TRACK CLUB

The Birubi Track Club has completed its first full year of activity and has fulfilled its aims to provide specialised coaching, training and competition for its members in Track and Jumping events.

Early in the year activity was centred on providing support for N.S.W. representatives in the Australian Commonwealth Games Team. Two Decathlons held at Hensley Field, a visit to Coolah and time trials at Sydney for Tony Manning, and training assistance to Cheryl Peasley were contributive.

Two more Decathlons were held in September and November, whilst regular 5 event competitions in Distance, Middle distance, sprints and jumps were held at Hensley Field and Sydney Uni. Oval as "competition training". The Club co-operated fully with the N.S.W. Throwers Clubs.

Due to the unsatisfactory state of Sydney Uni. Oval, only one open meet was held during the Summer.

On the personal side, the Club was represented in Edinburgh by Geoff Smith who took the Gold Medal in the Decathlon, Sig Kosciak and Jack Pross as Asst. Track coach. John Farrington became No. 1 Australian Marathoner and 10,000 Metres man during the year. He won the Australian Marathon Championship in Victoria in 2-15-27, then ran a personal best 2-12-58.4, in Japan in December 1970.

In the National Championships in Brisbane in March 1971 the following BIRUBI's won titles - John Farrington 10,000 in 29.57.0, Graeme Rootham 800M in 1:40.8, Gary Knoke 400M.H. 50.4, Gordon Windeyer Junior H.J. 6' 4", Steve Hausfeld Junior 3Km. Walk 13.37.6.

Coaching advice, commentary and results are communicated to club members through the monthly Newsletter Birubi which also goes to coaches and athletes in America, New Guinea, Nauru, South Africa and United Kingdom.

As at 31st March, 1971 there were 44 Registered Athletes in N.S.W. holding BIRUBI Membership.

The only sombre note in the year was the serious accident to Tom Houghton. All wish him well in his recovery.

REPORT OF TRACK AND FIELD SELECTION COMMITTEE

The main teams selected by the Track and Field Selectors were the teams for the Australian Championships, Brisbane, the team for Sub-Junior Shell East Coast Meet in Brisbane and the team for the Senior Inter-State Match in Sydney against Queensland.

With the improved performances of our teams we could be excused if we felt rather pleased, but I do feel we lack depth of top performers in most events.

Having to achieve the standards for the Australian Championships in the 3 months prior to these Championships causes some difficulty for the athletes. The team is picked 3 to 4 weeks prior to the Australian Championships and we have a limited competition in January thus many of our athletes have little chance to reach the standards. This is also highlighted if weather conditions are unfavourable.

Our result service did not work as well as we had hoped during the latter part of the season and the usual complaint of lack of results from country areas helped to make team selection a little more difficult.

Some of our athletes chose to only compete on a limited basis, giving the selectors very limited performances for their selection.

We did try to get athletes on achieving the standard for events to notify the selectors their desire to compete at the Australian Championships. While this new idea did not really work as well as we had hoped, we should try this again.

In closing might I again ask all those clubs, Branches Etc. who conduct carnivals to let the selectors have a copy of your results. It is only with all these results that we can truly select our best teams.

PUBLIC RELATIONS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The communications media involving press, television and radio have been extremely active and co-operative during the past twelve months and sincere thanks must be extended to them.

Their assistance has not only been of tremendous public relations value but also has ensured that the utmost was achieved in endeavouring to present editorial and news to the general and sports minded public.

During the early months in my term of office, excellent press and TV coverage was gained for the pre-Games carnival held in Sydney prior to the Australian team's departure for Edinburgh.

Likewise an appearance for team member Peter Norman was achieved on Ron Casey's Channel Nine "World of Sport" and an interview for Ralph Doubell and Laurie Peckham on Rex Mossop's "Club Show" on Channel Seven.

The Commonwealth Games uniform was given the maximum in press and TV publicity and, early in November, a fashion parade was conducted at the Randwick-Botany Club in conjunction with the officials' Annual Dinner.

This parade gained photographic coverage in the Sunday Mirror.

With the commencement of Interclub interest displayed by the press media was extremely high with regular editorial appearing in all Sunday papers throughout the season.

Early this year The Sun made an approach for a recommendation for a winner of David Lord's Weekly Encouragement Award on Channel Seven and Western Suburbs athlete, Michael Aiken duly emerged as the victor for the week commencing 15th February.

The State Championships offered scope for television coverage with Channels Two, Nine and Ten attending the first day and Channel Ten televising the highlights of the following Saturday.

Relevant news items were given to Channel Ten during February and March for inclusion in the Saturday evening news broadcast.

Likewise editorial and news features relating to the State Championships appeared in both daily and Sunday press media.

Regular press releases have been given to all radio stations throughout the season and it is felt that a close affiliation has been established with radio staff, particularly the ABC.

Throughout all associations with press, television and radio the personal approach has been favoured which has served to strengthen the relationships between members of the Publicity Committee and the communications media.

Sincere thanks therefore must be extended to Mr. E. White, Sporting Editor of the Sunday Mirror who has ensured at all times that athletics has received the maximum coverage which amounted to thirty one news items.

Thanks must also go to the sporting editors and journalists of the following media who assisted in gaining a vast number of releases for athletics:-

Daily Mirror (13), The Sun (11), Sun-Herald (11), Sydney Morning Herald (11), Daily Telegraph (12), Sunday Telegraph (8), Australian (2), Australian Soccer Magazine (3), St. George Leader (1), Port Macquarie News (1).

A special note of thanks must surely be offered to Mr. J. O'Reilly, Mr. G. Reynolds, Mr. N. May and staff of ABN Channel Two for their co-operation in re-screening the Australian Championships in Brisbane at Gore Hill Studios on April 22nd.

A large attendance amounting to twenty six interested athletes attended this evening.

Mr. J. Shepherd, formerly of Channel Ten, has always displayed co-operation since the commencement of the season and although his connections are now severed with that Channel he is endeavouring, more than ever, to assist athletics in every way, therefore my thanks to him.

With the forthcoming season fast approaching and which culminates in the selection of the team for the 1972 Olympics in Munich, I cannot stress enough the importance of valuable publicity, therefore I request the co-operation of all athletes, coaches and officials in ensuring that I, and the Publicity Committee, are informed at all times of news items.

Publicity in most cases can be gained, however information must be forthcoming for only in that manner will athletics be able to gain valuable space and/or time in communications media.

AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION OF AUSTRALIA
43rd ANNUAL CONFERENCE, 1971
Delegates Report

The Union Conference of 1971 was held in Brisbane during the days immediately preceeding the conducting of the Australian Championships, New South Wales being represented at the Conference by Messrs. Ray Durie and Arthur Graves.

The Conference, lasting two full days, proved to be a most interesting one, with harmony and co-operation being the keynote in delegates deliberations on the many important subjects under discussion.

At the opening of the Conference, the President of the Union, Mr. C.R. Aitken, was congratulated on his award of the C.B.E.

In his Presidential opening address Mr. Aitken stressed some of the problems confronting the Union, amongst these being the unfair criticism of the Hon. Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. A. Hodsdon, by sections of the Press; the work caused by bodies not observing the Rules of the Union; and the decline in Registrations by all States with the exception of Tasmania.

New South Wales submitted a great many proposed amendments to both the Union and I.A.A.F. Rules. These were carefully considered by the Union Committees concerned, and their recommendations discussed by Conference delegates at some length. Quite a number of these proposals were adopted, whilst others were referred to the I.A.A.F. for consideration.

Possibly the most important of these submissions - from the point of view of the athletes at least - was the alteration, subsequently approved by conference, to General Rule 214, this relating to the eligibility of athletes to qualify to represent the State at Australian Championships. It is considered that athletes should be made conversant with these changes prior to the commencement of the forthcoming Track & Field Season.

The application by N.S.W. for the reconsideration of the record application on behalf of the Randwick Botany A.A.C. for the 4 x 1500 metres Relay record was discussed at length, it being finally resolved that the President of the Union should seek clarification from the President of the I.A.A.F. on the necessity for lap score sheets for all events over 1500 metres.

Special mention was made at the conference of the invaluable work of Messrs. V.J. Chalwin and H.G. Carruthers in connection with the Captain Cook Bi-Centenary Celebrations Relay held in N.S.W. in 1970.

It is also pleasing to record that N.S.W. nominee, Mr. Harold Ralph, was elected as an Australian selector for one year term.

Whilst the Financial position of the Union is reasonably satisfactory, as always there is little money available for the meeting of additional necessities. In order to cover the cost of our Council Member attending the I.A.A.F. Council meeting, a levy was imposed on all Member States.

The 1973 Track & Field Championships of Australia were allocated to N.S.W., as was the 20 Kilo Walk Commonwealth Games Trial. The allocation of the 1973 Championships offers to us a challenge, particularly in view of the mistakes we made in the conducting of the 1968 Championships in Sydney.

A most significant aspect of the discussion on the National Championships was the decision to hold the 1972 Championships (Perth) as a combined venture with the Australian Women's A.A.U., and the support to be given by W.D. & H.O. Wills and Qantas in sponsoring a tour by a party of World class athletes.

Another, and indeed most welcome, innovation adopted by Conference was the acceptance of the C.R. Aitken Cup for Interstate competition at the Australian Championships, and the Rules governing the awarding of the Cup. Intended as a competition amongst States as distinct from the Richard Coombes Shield, it is felt that this competition, through its scoring system, will provide more incentive to the smaller States.

Finally, it is with great pleasure that we report the granting of a Merit Award to Mr. Pat Walsh, our Hon. Surveyor. As is widely known, Mr. Walsh has diligently served N.S.W. athletics for a very long period of time, and it is indeed fitting that this honour should be conferred upon him in recognition of his contributions to our sport.

CONGRATULATIONS AND THANKS TO COMMITTEES

Firstly I make reference to a very fine Job done by the Championships organising Committee, this committee worked hard and co-operation between members left nothing to be desired. The results achieved by them speaks for itself.

The second Committee that I refer to has for the past ten years to my knowledge been the centre of attack from some members of council together with some individuals who do not face up to council. This committee is the Executive Committee whose members sacrifice every Monday night to attend their meeting except the week that council meeting is held. Members also attend club, branch and other necessary meetings as required from time to time. The Executive Committee consists of a mere (8) eight members and a quorum being (5) five, the manner and the Democratic methods adopted by them can best be expressed by quoting the words of one of our Life Members at the Constitution Special General Meeting held on Thursday the 22nd April 1971 in which Mr. Corish stated, and I quote "The Executive Committee is only 5 (5) members and with this small number of members and even with a full committee they do not decide even matters of urgency or other matters on a unanimous vote" this quotation shows just how democratic this committee is and ensures all that because it is a small committee it does not block vote but abides by majority rule.

In conclusion so far as the Executive is concerned I personally thank them for the privilege I have had over the past two years to serve on such a democratic, honest and vigorous group and to say the least I have learnt much from their knowledge and their attitude.

I would be lacking if I failed to thank and once again this should be the echo of every member of the Association to our Secretary Mr. Clive Lee and our Administrative Secretary Mrs. Shirley Went for a job extremely well done.

FINANCE

Gentlemen,

The Accounts disclose that Administrative Costs exceeded Income from Registration and Affiliation Fees Etc. by \$3307.26.

Up to a year or so ago it was general accepted practice that Income from Registration and Affiliation Fees should totally offset Administrative Costs and the result therefore must be deemed disappointing. Although Annual Subscriptions have been increased each year by Management Council when reviewing the expenditure likely to be incurred for the following 12 months, these increases have been far too conservative and much lower proportionally than the increases in the costs which have taken place.

It should also be noted that the Association's Kiosk at the Sydney Athletic Field showed a small loss due to lack of attendance during both the Football and Athletic Track and Field Seasons, also due to vandalism and the resultant theft of stock in trade.

Obviously, these large losses must not be allowed to continue and an early and urgent review is needed to correct what must be regarded as a most unsatisfactory situation.

The financial result of Sports Promotions is a loss of \$184.24. Although poor attendances possibly influenced by lack of spectator appeal, must be partly responsible for the adverse result, the main factor appears to have been that too many grounds were used during the Interclub Competition and the Gate takings from Competitors were unsatisfactory compared to the expenses incurred for Rent and hire of Public Address System etc. In addition there have been substantial increases in the cost of the lease at the Sydney Athletic Field and in the Rent of the Rotary Field, Chatswood.

These points should not be overlooked when deciding venues for the 1971/72 Track and Field Season, particularly the Interclub Competition.
