

Hot (9.3) Kemp paces assault

Perhaps meet director Dr. Jack Rose should change the name of the Long Beach Invitational to The Record Invitational.

An invigorating breeze, swift track and all-star cast parlayed into nine meet records and a dead-heat in another Saturday at Cal State Long Beach.

One of the oldest men on the track was clearly best man on the track.

Jim Kemp, winner of both the college and university quartermiles while at Kentucky State in 1965, turned in a blistering sprint double.

He won the 100 in 9.3, a meet and field record; he came back to win the 220 in 20.9.

"I can hardly believe that 9.3," puffed the 26-year-old Strider. "I was just using the meet as a workout. As we approached the finish I looked to my right, and was surprised no one was there. I'm sure I could have run faster if someone had pushed me."

Kemp's previous pinnacles were 9.5, 20.9. He'll be pointing for an Olympic Games berth in the 440, which he's run in 45.2.

"If you make a mistake, you've got time to correct it in the 440," he chuckled.

Chuck Smith of the California Track and Field Assn. also was impressive in the dashes, winning his races in 9.5, 21.1.

Wayne Jensen of Wyoming turned in a sizzling final 440 to rout two sticky challengers in the mile. Jensen was third at the 1,320 in 3:14.0. He won in 4:07.7 — a final quarter-mile of 53.7.

"I was boxed in; when I saw my chance to get out,

I opened up," explained Jensen, who doubles as a 47.5 quartermiler.

The 221-2 hammer throw by big George Frenn of the Pacific Coast Club is No. 1 in the U.S. this year, while the 264-7 throw of teammate John FitzSimons in the javelin ranks No. 2.

Sparklers for Cal State Long Beach were Bill Chew, who raised the school pole vault record three-quarters of an inch to 15-1½, and Clarence Palmer, who ran on the winning (40.7) 440-relay team, winning mile relay team (decisive anchor lap of 47.6), and was second in the 440 by a tick at 48.4.

"This does a lot for my confidence," said Palmer, who is returning following surgery to repair a football ligament injury.

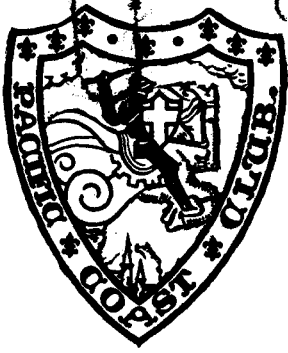
