Wayne Collett, anchor UCLA - 1st place:

"I thought we had them coming into the third handoff, because ~~was~~ USC had a bad handoff. When I got the baton, I sort of eased up and caught Deckard out of the corner of my eye, just before we hit the tape. When I saw him, I lunged into the tape to beat him.

"I know Deckard is fast, but because of the bad hand-off, I knew we had them."

## 1 Mile Run--

Steve Prefontaine, Oregon - 1st place:

"I ran my own race. The pacing was just right. I waited for the other runners in the stretch, hoping we could have a three way tie, but they didn't come up.

"My feet hurt a little bit, because the track was hot, and I didn't wear socks. My race plan was to hold back in the first quarter and if it was slow, I planned on taking over and do my own pacing the rest of the way. I was more interested in winning the three mile."

## 220 High Hurdles--

Lance Babb, USC - 1st place:

"Because I'm so light, I don't like running against the wind. This effects me mentally. But I thought I ran a relaxed race, and I was satisfied with the good time. My main competition, I knew, would come from Olsen, because of the way he ran in the ~~xxxx~~ trials yesterday."

## Discus--

Joe Antunovich, USC - 1st place:

"The wind kept changing all day and my throws didn't particularly take advantage of the wind. First thing, I feel very unfortunate, that the discus is stuck out of the stadium. I feel it should be a part of the track meet. But now that I know what the setup is here, I think I'll do better in the nationals. It's tough to get mentally up, when there is only ten people watching you."

## 100 Dash--

Willie Deckard, USC - 1st place:

"The wind bothered everybody. I don't like a headwind. I got off to a slow start, but I ~~am~~ used my arms as hard as I could. And I thought I ran a good last 25 yards.

"False starts take out the tension, so they didn't bother me. Also, the time for the hundred (9.7) was indicative of the wind."

Int. Hurdles---

Jim Seymour, UW 1st place:

"I started pouring it on at the start of the last turn. White chopped on the next to the last hurdle, and I thought that I could take him in the stretch.

"I ran this race a little different than the ones I had previously, since I started out faster. I was tired, since I am not in peak shape, but I will be by the time the NCAA comes up.

"It was a good race to win."

220 Run---

Wallie Deckard, USC 1st place:

"When I came off the curve, the wind made me slow up, then I looked back, saw I was in the lead, and I eased up. The track is nice, but a little hard. Hope I do better in the NCAA, and I feel that the winning time in that meet will be 20.4 or better.

"I think it will take a 9.2 or 9.3 to win in the 100."

Triple Jump---

James Butts, UCLA 1st place:

"I tried to relax on my last jump, because I was so tight. Also, I was waiting for the wind to die down, because I like it when the wind is calm. This is a good pit, and today's jump was two feet better than I had done before. Naturally, I was real pleased with my performance today. ~~am~~

Three Mile---

Steve Prefontaine, UO 1st place:

"I knew I had my hands full, and if Kardong had poured it on with three laps to go, I would have let him go. I was running on pure guts. My feet were really burning.

"It was nice to win the race, but disappointing that the team did not win the meet. This track is really hard on your feet, because the black absorbs the heat. At least with the steeplechase, we get a chance to get our feet wet. "

(note: Jim Johnson from UW dropped out of three mile due to tight Achilles tendon.)

440 Run---

Wayne Collett, UCLA 1st place:

"Yes, I did get a good workout today. I was surprised about the 440, the overall race in general. I didn't think I'd run that fast, and I was surprised about the time.

"I went out quicker today than I normally do, and the wind didn't bother me. In the NCAA, I plan on running the 440 and relays only.

"I was very concerned about the team and the title, that was foremost with all of us.

"I had no strategy at all in the 440, I just ran."

High Jump---

Larry Hollins, USC 1st place:

"I was really psyched up for this meet. The competition was good. I've been having ~~knee~~ trouble with my knee and today was the first time I've jump this high. This is my biggest win ever, and I'm really pleased."

Head Coach Jim Bush, UCLA:

"This is the best weather we have had all year. After we won the 440 relay, I felt things began turning our way. This race really ignites the kids and we had some great performances today.

"Collett was our workhorse. He pulled a cramp in the 220. Our trainers worked the cramp out before the mile relay, and then he came back and ran a 45 second leg, which was fantastic.

"Yes, I love this track, and the team will be back for the NCAA."

Pole Vault---

Kirk Bryde, UW 1st place:

"The competition and the conditions were the difference today. After my first jump at 15-6, I knew I was going to jump well today. I was using a new pole that I got this morning, and it was the first time I had tried it. The pole had more whip and got me up faster.

"It's an 80-pound pole.

"Frankly, I don't hear the crowd, so the crowd doesn't do anything to me. It was strictly the competition."

LOS ANGELES--Here are pertinent comments by UCLA's track and field coach, James Stanley Bush, following the Bruins' sensational come-from-behind victory last weekend (May 21-22) to capture their third straight Pacific-8 Conference spike championship, the fourth (1966-69-70-71) in seven years under JSB:

"Perhaps, the greatest comeback win and team effort in my entire coaching career..."

"This UCLA team still has not jelled..."

"Look for improvement from our sprinters and relay teams..."

"And we have as good a chance as anyone to win the upcoming NCAA Championships at Seattle."

Naturally, Jim Bush was elated with his team's rousing triumph by nine points (126 to 117 for runner-up Oregon) and by 24 markers over USC's third-place Trojans at 102. The Bruins trailed Oregon by 27 points (18-45) following Friday's four finals and by 43 points (28-71) after six events on Saturday.

Let's catch a few of the highlights and breakdown in the Bruins' Pac-8 victory sweep in the University of Washington Stadium, which, incidentally, also is the site of the NCAA title meet, June 17-18-19:

Scored in 13 of the 18 events, with 16 athletes contributing to the team triumph;

Showed scoring balance with four first places for 40 points, five seconds for 40 points, five thirds for 30 points, two fourths for 8 points, three fifths for 6 points and two sixths for 2 points.

Five Bruins each scored 10 points or more, including Warren Edmonson with 19 (second in 100, third in 220 and on both 440 and mile winning relay teams), John Smith with 18 1/2 (second in both 220 and 440 and on winning mile relay team), Wayne Collett with 15 (won 440 and on both winning relay teams), Mark Ostoich with 14 (second in shot put and third in discus throw) and James Butts with 10 (won triple jump);

The 440 was the Bruins' big event with Collett-Smith finishing 1-2 for 18 points but the 220 would have been even bigger if Collett hadn't been disqualified after placing third to spoil a 2-3-4-6 finish for 19 markers instead of 2-3-5 for 16;

Most brilliant single performance was Collett's 45.3 quarter-mile win for new Pacific-8, Pac-8 Meet and Stadium records, also the world's fastest time this season, to date, and a new UCLA mark, breaking Smith's 45.5 standard set against USC May 8;

And by winning both the 440 and mile relays, UCLA became the first school to accomplish this notable feat since UCLA did it back in 1966.

The Bruins now have nearly a month to get primed for a strong bid for the NCAA tiara, a title which they've won only twice in history, first in 1956 under coach Ducky Drake and again in 1966 under coach Bush.

This weekend (May 29-30), the Bruins will be represented in two meets, the California Relays at Modesto Saturday and the Southern Pacific AAU Championships at UC Irvine on Sunday. UCLA's only other competition before the NCAA's will be the Kennedy Games in Berkeley June 5.
