# 1971 Rose Festival Invitational

A smashing success in 1970 with a standing-room crowd of 9,000 spectators jamming the Madison high school oval, the Rose Festival track committee has again succeeded in securing a star-studded Invitational field for its second annual AAU-sanctioned track presentation.

Just as last year when no less than seven world record holders were produced by Meet Director Jim Puckett, the 1971 Festival meet will offer the avid Northwest track fan another first-hand look at champions from home and abroad. This was assured when Portland was again picked as one of the top AAU meets of 1971 to be shown on delayed national television (CBS), and when Puckett was again assigned the job of talent scout.

Two new events have been added to this year's meet, the senior's 100 and 880, bringing the number to 29, of which 20 are for men, nine for women.

Defending champions entered are world record holder Randy Matson in the shotput (66-11 $\frac{3}{4}$ ); pole vaulter Sam Caruthers (16-9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ); high jumper Reynaldo Brown (7-0); javelin thrower Larry Stuart (249-3); hammer thrower Tom Gage (226-3); and Steve Tyrer in the two-mile walk (14:54.1). Women champions returning today include Doris Brown in both the mile (4:45.4) and half-mile (2:06.5); long jump winner Brenda Eisler (19-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ); and Lynette Matthews, shot-putter (47-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ ).

Matson's 71-5 $\frac{1}{2}$  shotput in 1967 put him on top internationally; Erv Hall of the Striders is co-holder of the world standard in the 120 yard hurdles (13.2); while Lee Evans (44.9) is former king of the 440-dashers.

American record-holders present today are Mark Murro, javelin (300-0); Gerry Lindgren, three-mile (12:53.0) and six-mile; Art Walker, triple jump (55-1 3/4); Doris Brown, mile (4:42.2); and Patti Johnson, 100-meter hurdles (13.3).

**By Event:**

**LONG JUMP** — Arnie Robinson's (San Diego State) winning NCAA leap of 25-10 $\frac{1}{2}$  in 1970 is only fourth best in this talented event. Cal Track Club's Stan Whitley (26-6), Tom Smith, ex-Oregon (26-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ), and Marion Anderson, Stockton Track Club, (25-11 3/4) pose threats.

**JAVELIN** — American record holder Mark Murro (300-0) is only four feet off the world mark held by Finland's Jorma Kinnunen. Still, Murro has lost before to 1970 NCAA champion Bill Skinner, (291-9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ), also in the field. And, if either falters, any one of several 260-foot throwers, Larry Stuart, Ben Leville, Fred Luke, Les Tipton, or Gary Feldman could win.

**SHOTPUT** — Randy Matson is the greatest and he figures to outdistance a field which should hotly contest second spot. Bruce Wilhelm of the Army is the dark-horse.

**POLE VAULT** — Kirk Bryde, Washington's PAC-8 champion (17-4), is on hand to greet 17-foot vaulters Francis Tracanelli of UCLA; Vic Dias, San Jose State; Dennis Phillips, ex-Oregon State, and Sam Caruthers of California Track Club who defends a 16-9 $\frac{1}{4}$  title trip of last year.

**HAMMER** — Tom Gage won here in 1970, with OSU's Steve DeAutremont a distant second. A repeat figures.

**WOMEN'S HIGH JUMP** — Debbie Brill, one of more than a dozen of Canada's best is the only woman in the Western Hemisphere to clear six feet, and she is the strong favorite. Lots of excellent competition for second place.

**TWO-MILE WALK** — Steve Tyrer is back with a 14:26 best after posting a 14:54.1 victory march in 1970. Pacing him possibly will be Jim Hanley (14:24). Both show the SC Striders as home club.

**120 HURDLES** — This figures to be one of the day's highlights. All eight men are under 14.0, with Striders' Erv Hall, co-holder of the world record (13.2).

**WOMEN'S 100-METER HURDLES** — Patty Johnson of the Angels Track Club is American record holder at 13.3. She ran second to Chi Cheng last year in the first Festival meet.

**MILE** — Ten entries, all under 4.05, should make it interesting.

**TRIPLE JUMP** — Three of nation's best this year are ready for Rose City effort. Dave Smith (53-11) and Milan Tiff (53-10) of the Cal Track Club bid for first against Oregon State's Robert Reader. (53-10½).

**HIGH JUMP** — California Track Club's Reynaldo Brown will likely have to better his 7-0 winning mark of last June to capture victory. His best (7-3) shows he can. Other seven-foot jumpers entered are Jerry Culp, San Diego State, 7-1½; Lorenzo Allen, Arizona, 7-1; and Runion Lisby, Mesa JC, 7-0. OSU rook Mike Fleer and Estacada prepper Tom Woods have gone 6-11½.

**DISCUS** — Again, any one of a half dozen competitors could win in this one. Tim Vollmer, ex-OSU and now Army; John Van Reenan, ex-WSU; Ed Kohler and Bill Neville, Striders; and John Bakkensen, Portland Track Club; have surpassed 200 feet. World record holder Jay Silvester took the 1970 Festival meet with 202-10 compared to Van Reenan's 201-2, so you can see the problem of picking a winner. Silvester is in Europe, hence cannot defend today.

**WOMEN'S MILE** — Tremendous field, with two of the best in the world topping the list. Seattle's Doris Brown is American record holder (4:42.2), won here last year (4:45.4), but will be strongly challenged by

Fran Kraker Johnson from Boston, Mass., 1500-meter champion, 4:17.3 which is equivalent to a 4:41 mile. Watch Debbie Roth, 16-year old three-time age group champion from Eugene, also.

**WOMEN'S SHOT PUT** — Canadian champion Joan Pavelich has the best distance, 48-5, with Gresham's Dottie Barnes, national girls champion, and Norma Jordan of Argentina also entering strong credentials.

440 — Whether Lee Evans is close to his all-time best of 44.9 remains a question. On paper, pressure comes from Striders' Jim Kemp (45.1), and Ed Garrison, (45.2).

**100 YARD DASH** — Southern California Striders, Lennox Miller (9.3), Fred Kuller (9.3) and Don Quarrie (9.3), and OSU's Willie Turner, also showing a 9.3-best time, will run at USC's Willie Deckard (9.2), the PAC-8 champion.

880 — Art Sandison of the Cougar Track Club (former WSU tracksters) is one of the hottest half-milers around right now (1:45.9). Former Oregon NCAA champion, Wade Bell (1:47.6), and ex-Husky Bill Smart (1:47.4) have the best past credentials.

**WOMEN'S LONG JUMP** — Brenda Eisler is another Canadian champion and the only one in the field who has surpassed 21 feet.

**WOMEN'S 880** — Just as in the mile, Doris Brown and Fran Kraker Johnson, should both enter, figure to fight it out for first place.

440 **HURDLES**: — Ron Whitney (Striders) has long been one of the best. Wes Williams and James King of San Diego State are other good ones.

220 — Turner, Miller, Quarrie, Deckard and Ronnie Ray Smith have run between 20.1 and 20.3, leaving little margin for error in another race that should be a dandy.

**THREE-MILE** — One of the all-time greats in distance running, Gerry Lindgren of WSU-fame, gives this event a four-star rating. Three-time three-mile and six-mile NCAA king, American record-holder at this distance (12:53), Lindgren is rounding back into form in this pre-Olympic year to test his future. Capable long-range runners who will challenge Lindgren are Terry Harrison, Striders; England's 1500-meter champion, Chris Stewart; and Oregon Track Club's Dave Wilborn, a well-known miler.
