


#### 1971 SPARTAN TRACK OUTLOOK

San Jose State hopes to move back into the position of a national track power again this spring. It could very well do so with a combination of top caliber individuals, better team balance than has been present in the past few years and an outstanding dual meet schedule.

Although the squad is small, numbering some 35 athletes, talent is evident everywhere and it will be tough for any opponent to sweep an event.

The Spartan team is built around a solid core of experienced returnees. The big difference in improvement, however, is due to the host of newcomers filling in the weak spots.

This year's schedule has also been upgraded. Dual meets have been scheduled on successive Saturday's with Pac-8 powers California, Stanford, Oregon State and Washington State. Later in the season SJS also meets the powerful Pacific Coast Club.

The biggest problem coach Ernie Bullard faces is lack of depth in some areas; therefore a few injuries in the wrong places could be disastrous.

Overall, it should prove to be an interesting and outstanding season.

The following is a breakdown of each general area:

#### SPRINTS AND 440

SJS should have one of the fastest sprint duo's in the nation (matched possibly by Cal's Eddie Hart and Isaac Curtis) with senior returnee Kirk Clayton (9.3, 20.4) and newcomer Billy Gaines (9.2, 20.6). Clayton is the world record holder at 50 yards and had a strong season last spring until slowed by injuries. Gaines, who has to get in shape after a year's layoff from competition, is the co-world record holder in the 60 (5.9) and the world record holder for 50 meters. Prospects after those two are questionable. Hurdler George Carty (9.5) and long jumper Chuck Sundsten (9.6) will probably have to fill in on the other two legs of the relay. Byron Wilson (9.7) is back after a year's layoff and could possibly help out.

#### <u>THE 440</u>

The quarter mile has improved since last year, with Elmo Dees (46.8) returning as the number one man and Tim Hayes (48.0), a JC transfer, and Jim Love (48.2), who ran for the Spartans in 1968, to back him up. Hayes is recovering from illness and won't be in shape until later in the season.

#### HURDLES

Quality in the two hurdle events is good but this is one of the areas where depth is a problem. In the 120 highs, George Carty (13.5) was a finalist in the 1968 Olympic Trials in South Lake Tahoe and can run with anyone around. But after him the situation is weak. In the intermediates, Len Gaskill (51.9) returns and should improve and Carty (52.3) will add depth when he runs the event. Gaskill (14.3) will also be called on to back Carty in the highs.

#### 880 AND MILE

The middle distances is one of the key areas of improvement this spring, with one top returnee and three JC transfers. In the 880, transfers Lee Marshall, California JC State Champion last year, (1:51.2) and Bob Stevens (1:51.7) give SJS the depth it didn't have last year. In the mile, Buck Black, who ran a 4:06.4 mile in the conference, is in fine early season condition and is being counted on heavily. Cliff Chisam, who ran the fasted JC mile in the country last year at 4:06.1, was injured earlier and won't be in top shape until mid-season.

#### DISTANCES

The distance program is also a major improvement, due mainly again to JC transfers. Gary Hanson won the PCAA six mile (30:08.6) and came back the next day to take third in the three mile (14:07.9) last spring and looks ready to run well after a strong cross country showing. Maury Greer (9:07.2 two mile) had a good cross country season while Pat Palazzolo (14:17 three mile), Mark Evans (9:04.8 two mile, 14:28 three mile) and Nick Rosner (9:01.1 two mile, 4:09.8 mile) have impressive JC statistics. Rosner and Palazzolo have both been bothered by injuries and won't be ready until later in the season.

#### JUMPING EVENTS

Overall, the jumping events are probably the strongest in terms of both quality and depth, again with help from newcomers.

The strongest single event is the pole vault. Vic Dias (17-0) finished strong last spring and took fourth in June's AAU meet. Bob Richards has already bettered his life best this winter  $(16-0\frac{1}{2})$  and could push 17-0. Frank Rock has been consistent at 15-6 and is due soon to make 16-0.

Last year's weakest event, the high jump, has been bolstered by the addition of Willie Crawford (6-11), the former Armed Services champion. In addition, Reggie Morris (6-8) returns from last year ready to jump.

The long jump appears to be at about the same level as last season, while the triple jump is improved. Chuck Sundsten  $(25-4\frac{1}{4})$  comes off a good finish last year and JC transfer Gary Moody (24-8) is a good competitor who finished third in the state last year. In the triple jump, Adrian Porter (50-10) had a good year in 1969 and hopes to return to that form this year. Moody (47-0) and Sundsten will also jump. WEIGHT EVENTS

Transfers have also been vital in improving the weight events. The discus looks to be the most improved with Gary O'Sullivan (182-11) returning and newcomers Greg Born and Tom Wilson have been coming along well. Both have already thrown over 170 feet.

In the shot put, Born was State JC chempion last year at  $55-2\frac{1}{4}$  but has already thrown  $55-9\frac{1}{4}$  this winter and could push 60-0. O'Sullivan  $(56-2\frac{1}{4})$  will throw the shot when needed. Rich Esparza (53-9 3/4) will give the Spartans a strong third man.

Mike Metz set a new school record in the javelin last spring at 251-2, but he was inconsistent. But with a year's experience plus greater size and strength he should be a constant threat. Dave Caselli (203-4) could pick up valuable points in dual meets.

#### ERNIE BULLARD...Head Coach

#### THE COACHES

Ernie Bullard, the assistant track coach at San Jose State the past two seasons, took over the helm from Bud Winter, who retired last June.

Bullard came to SJS the beginning of the 1968-69 season from Mesa Community College in Mesa, Arizona. He arrived there in 1967 and originated the school's track and field program. In that first year, he coached Mesa CC to a second place finish in the National Junior College Association meet.

The following year, Mesa won the NCJAA meet and Track and Field News called it "one of the strongest JC track teams in the nation.

Mesa CC, with Bullard in charge, sent more track athletes to the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City than any four-year schools, with the exceptions of Villanova and SJS.

Bullard coached SJS sprinters Neville Myton, Len Gaskill and Elmo Dees when they attended Mesa Community College.

He graduated from USC in 1959, where he was an excellent pole vaulter, and won his Master of Science degree at Arizona State University in 1961.

LEE EVANS...Assistant Track and Field Coach and Head Cross Country Coach

Lee Evans, the 1968 Olympic Gold Medalist, was named assistant track and field coach and head cross country coach when Bullard was elevated to the head mentorship.

He had a tremendous start in his new career as his harriers won the Mt. San Antonio Invitational, put in a strong bid at the Sacramento State Invitational and finished third in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association Championships last year.

Evans set a new world mark of 43.8 in the 400 meters at the '68 Games, ran on the U.S. team which set a 1:22.1 standard in the 880 yard and 800 meter relay, and anchored the U.S. 1600 meter relay team which set a world's record of 2:56.1.

He also ran to a world record in the 500-yard indoor (54.5) and the 600 meter event (1:14.3). Evans also won the National AAU 440 title four years in a row.

An SJS graduate, Evans plans to complete work on his Master's Degree at Stanford. He has also been a counselor to the Silver Creek HS track team coached by Stan Dowell.

Said Bullard on Evans' appointment, "Lee was my choice for the job. He possesses the attributes necessary to be an outstanding partner in a coaching situation."

Accounting major from Sacramento.

GECRGE CARTY----one of the most versatile members of the team...has run high hurdles, intermediate hurdles, 440 yard dash, 100 yard dash, and 440 and mile relays... finalist in the 1968 Olympic trials at South Tahoe in 120 highs...has best marks of 13.5 in the 120 highs, 52.3 in the 440 Intermediates, 46.1 in the 440 and 9.5 in the 100...senior from Perth Amboy H.S., New Jersey and transferred from Odessa JC in Texas...24 years old, recreation major.

<u>CLIFF CHISAM</u>—Mile, 880...cutstanding middle distance runner from Pasadena City College...ran fastest junior college mile in the nation last year a 4:06.1... has good speed....best 880 of 1:52.7...social science major....20 year old junior.

<u>DAVE CASELLI</u>---javelin...best throw of 203-4 last year...this is only his second year throwing javelin...could pick up valuable points...23 year old senior from Winters...Marketing major.

<u>LEN GASKILL</u>---440 intermediate hurdles...also runs mile relay and occasionally 120 highs...second in PCAA in intermediates last year...best of 51.9, has also run 47 8 440 and 14.3 in 120 highs...ran for Bullard at Mesa Community College... national JC champion in intermediates in 1969...in good early season condition, should have good year...21 year old senior...English major.

<u>PAT PALAZZOLO</u>——distance runner...one of top JC cross country runners in the state at Los Angeles Valley College...was hampered this fall by foot injuries...excels at the longer distances...has run 14:17 for three miles...20 year old sociology major.

<u>ADRIAN PORTER</u>—\_\_\_\_\_triple jump...had good year two years ago when he established personal best of 50-10....fourth best triple jumper in SJS record books...is expected to have another good year...attended Willow Glen HS in San Jose...22 year old senior ...Psychology major.

<u>GARY REZOWAILI</u>---distance runner...ran 14:20 three mile at Easter Relays in Santa Barbara last year...will also run steeplechase....better at longer distances...home is San Jose...went to St. Francis HS in Mt. View...21 year old Psychology major.

TOM WILSON----discus...has best mark of 158-0, but should improve...transfer from Chabot College in Hayward...2l year old junior...Business major from Pleasanton.






