We had the inaugural of something called the "Seafair Track Festival" last week. Not much of note to report, except that it is a late-summer meet we plan to keep holding. The Canadians always like to compete, so it could become a decent meet in the future.

There was an age-group meet Thursday Aug. 5 (one world age-10 record set; Jack Shepard has it), a marathon Friday evening, a decathlon Thursday and Friday evenings and an open track meet for men and women all day Saturday.

Weather has been quite hot here the past two weeks, so marathon suffered: Scott Daggatt, Bellevue HS grad headed for U-Oregon and representing Oregon TC, won in 2:37:34.6 (he's run 2:29).

Open meet was not quite of the quality you're interested in, but here are a few highlights: Ken Elmer (Richmond B.C.) 1:53.8/4:11.0, Barry Jahn (Eastern Washington State College) 9:14.6 and pulled 16-year-old Bill Glad (Bellevue HS junior) to American age record (9:30.2n(2)); Steve Geiver, Snohomish TC 15:46.8 2-mile walk; Jerry Tighe (Vancouver Olympic Club) 4:11.7n(2)/1:58.3n(4); Gary Shumski (June grad of Mountlake Terrace HS) 54.8 440IH first ever; Pat Tyson (Tacoma) and Sam Ring (Snohomish TC) 14:16.4 3mi tie; Roger Rowe (Tacoma) PR 48-8 3/4 legal; Barrie Johnson (Vancouver Optimist Striders) 46-9 1/4(3) in his first jumping since a pull several months ago; Jack Ernst, who will be teaching at Lake Washington High School, Kirkland (Seattle suburb) this fall, has been vaulting around here this summer, but not very well--here he was 14-6(2) as Eldon Colombo (Tacoma) again made 15-6 easily but could not quite make 16-0; June high-school grad Dana Le Duc (Parkland, headed for Kansas) had excellent international-weight double: 53-9 1/2/155-4(2) PRs; Gary Quitslund (Husky Spike Club) 226-0, Ken Johnson (Husky Spike Club) 222-2!

The most quality part of the three days was the decathlon, as 6 of the 16 finishers broke 6000, three of those in their first-ever decathlon. Steve Gough and Bill Spaet both dropped out after the high jump: Spaet complained of bad knees; Gough said he hurt a knee in the Olympic training camp, then here he had a shot land on his heel, and he seemed just generally fatigued--though he had scored 3149 in the first four events despite not attempting another height after high-jumping 6-2!

Dave Aungier, who plans to attend grad school at U. Wash. this coming year, looked like the winner until he blanked in the disc: two throws barely out of the sector, and a scratch. With a disc score he was almost sure to break his PR (6796) and might have gotten his present 7000 goal.

Winner Putzi, 28, a tool-and-die maker from Richmond, was pleased with his performance though it was short of his best (6733).

Ray Colombo also was short of his best (high 65s), and he was displeased, particularly in the hurdles, disc, vault and long jump. He had a bare scratch at 23-6!

Daunais, Fink and Haslam are all new at this stuff. Daunais, short and chunky, did remarkably well in some things, and he seems intent on getting a lot better; he's a sophomore at Olympic College (JC in Bremerton) and was Wash high-school shot-put champion two years ago.

Fink is in the Navy and stationed here; he is from IA and went to high school with Jim Seymour. He was happy with his score, wants to put work in in the weights.

Haslam supposedly was a member of Washington's track team this past spring, but he did little. He has great decathlon potential, but he doesn't work at the weights at all so probably never will develop.

Prep Cornell has a year left at Mt. Tahoma High School. He showed great scoring balance for his first decathlon, ~~he~~ shows signs of ~~an~~ improvement everywhere.
