Dear Dick,

Enclosed are results of the UCZA - Tennessee dual. The heat hindered times in the 880 on up, as nobody in the distance runs seemed anxious to set an early pace, preferring to wait for the final run to the tape. The sprints and relays were uniformly fast with seasonal beats in each event for both schools.

Reggie Robinson put on a great finish in the 100 and ran a superb leg on the 440 relay in his first start after being ineligible earlier this year. The 220 and 440 both produced thrilling finishes, and with the same cast - John Smith held off Darwin Bond's closing rush in the quarter for a half-yard win, then had to do it again in the furlong. Bond was certainly impressive and will bear watching as the season progresses. UCZA's margin in the 440 relay appeared larger than the three-tenth margin would indicate - It looked to be five or six yards. My watch and the one next to me both caught The Bruins in 39.8 with Tennessee in the official 40.4, also on both watches.

The horizontal jumps again were spectacular - medalist getting 10th on the all-time U.S. list while upping his school record to 26-6½ (and on the first jump, as usual). He passed his next two jumps, then went "only" 25-0¼ in the finals, and passed his last two jumps. Bendixen also got a PR 25-4¼, and Tennessee's Charles Ester went 24-5¾ for another PR. James Butte made his

first start for the Bruins a good one, getting a legal 51-6½, ¾" behind Denny Rogers' windy mark. Butts had a fractional foul measured at 53-5. He'll be tough in the nationals.

John Dobroth also looked good in the "special" high jump, getting PR's at 7-1¾ and 7-2½. In regular competition, Doug Huff raised his PR to 6-11.

The final meet score is somewhat deceptive, as in most cases, the running events were quite close, with UCLA getting there first. I talked with the Tennessee athletic Director after the meet, and although he was quite pleased with the overall quality of the marks, he agreed that the fatigue from travelling may have made the difference in some of the finishes.

Incidentally, I have been able to get off work May 7th, so I will be able to cover both days at Fresno.
