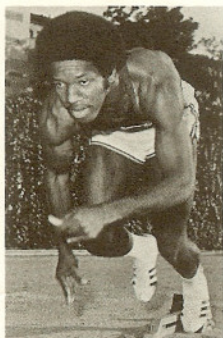


USC 35, UCLA 3: Jim Bush and his 1966 Bruins ended a long dual meet losing streak to the Trojans. In fact, USC posted 33 straight crosstown dual victories before UCLA scored its long-awaited first triumph (86-59) in the Los Angeles Coliseum on Saturday, May 7, 1966 before 9,971 fans, plus TV viewers. And now, in the past six years under coach Bush, the Bruins have split with the Trojans, winning in 1966-67-70 and losing in 1965-68-69. Can Bush & Co. make it two in a row this afternoon for the second time in this series?

USC Trackmen Roll

LOS ANGELES — (UPI) — University of Southern California came through with five seasonal world best performances, 11 personal bests, five meet records and five school records yesterday to upset UCLA, 75-70, in a Pacific-8 track and field meet at Westwood before a capacity crowd of 12,584.

Willie Deckard was the Trojans' big hero. He romped to world best times in both sprints. He blazed the 100-yard dash in 9.2 seconds

and came back to take the 220 in 20.2.

He opened his day's efforts by anchoring Troy's 440 relay team, which won by three yards in another world seasonal best, 39.3.

The Trojans' Edsel Garrison won the quartermile in a sensational 45.4, also another global best. USC's Henry Hines captured the long jump with his best-ever leap of 26-8½ inches, also a 1971 world top effort.

USC HUNGRY, UCLA MYSTERY ---MEET UP FOR GRABS TODAY

UCLA is the consensus choice of the writers, and that might be reason enough to pick USC today in the collegiate dual meet of the year on the Westwood track.

The meet starts at 1:15 p.m. with the long jump. The first race—440 relay—is scheduled for 2:05 p.m.

It's difficult to establish a favorite. There are too many events in doubt. UCLA, with greater depth in the sprints and jumps, has a better opportunity to break it open early, but USC is the hungry team and it proved last Saturday it was ready with a 92-62 romp over Oregon State while UCLA was struggling past California, 78-76.

Why is USC hungry? Last year the Bruins buried the Trojans, 100-54, at the Coliseum. That's a hard one to forget.

Key Is 440 Relay

On that basis, plus the fact that the Bruins are somewhat of a mystery today, USC is favored in The Times dope sheet, 75-70.

The key event is the 440 relay, and the big race is the 440 in which Troy's Edesel Garrison will challenge the men who had the fastest 400-meter times in the world last year, Wayne Collett (44.9) and John Smith (45.0).

In the relay, USC has the fastest time, 39.5 to UCLA's 39.7, and appears to have a slight edge on the anchor, with Willie Deckard going against Collett. But these things usually come down to which team makes the best passes.

UCLA could lose the relay and still come back to win the meet. USC could, too, but it would be a tougher uphill climb.

In the 440, Garrison must be rated at least equal with Smith and Collett off his 44.7 relay lap against California on the same track a month ago.

Also, as a freshmen two years ago, he ran 45.8 and then came back with a 20.5 in the 220 on the same track.

Later that year he ran 45.5 in the NCAA meet at Tennessee. That's better than the 45.7 bests of Smith and Collett but not quite as good as their metric clockings.

The mystery men for UCLA are James McAlister in the long jump and Frenchman Jean-Pierre Corval in the 440 hurdles.

McAlister has been given more rest in spring football practice this week, but he's in tough against USC's Henry Hines, who set a school record of 26-1 3/4 last Saturday.

Corval, if healthy, would rate as the favorite in the 440 hurdles off his best of 51.7, but he hasn't run in two months after suffering an abdominal injury. If he's still hurting today, the Trojans figure to sweep the event.

USC leads the series, 35-3, but that doesn't

mean a thing. Since Jim Bush took over at Westwood in 1965, the series is 3-3.

The Bruins haven't lost a dual meet since 1969 when the Trojans walloped them, 94-60, at Westwood. The Trojans haven't lost since the Bruins dismantled them last year at the Coliseum.

This one will be closer.
