RELAYS RESULTS

UCSB competed as a University Division entrant in the 1970 Easter Relays and failed to place although scoring three points. Javelin thrower John Tobin took 4th with a 218.5 effort and the 880 Relay team took 4th with a 1:26.9 clocking (Roger Vignocchi, Dan Madden, Carey Williams and Sunny Hatten).

At the Mt. SAC Relays Carey Williams won his high hurdles race in 14.9; John Tobin took third in the javelin (228-9); the 440 relay team (which ran 450 yards) took first in its race (43.6) and the mile relay team took second (3:18.4). The 440 team consisted of Jim Randolph, Dan Madden, Sunny Hatten, Wayne Snyder and the mile team was comprised of Jim LaVelle, Wayne Snyder, Sunny Hatten and Roger Vignocchi.

John Tobin was the PCAA javelin champion with a throw of 232-9. Mike Macy took a 4th in the 880 (1:53.7) and Wayne Snyder took a 4th in the 440 (48.3). All three marks were lifetime bests. The 440 relay team took a fifth with a 41.9 clocking (Randolph, Madden, Hatten and Williams).

THE NCAA'S

Javelin thrower John Tobin and jumper Jim Randolph each qualified for the NCAA finals, but failed to place in their respective events. Randolph jumped 24-7 to earn his bid and Tobin threw the javelin 232-9 to get his.

HEAD COACH SAM ADAMS

Sam Adams, a nationally recognized decathlon expert and former University of California track star, launches his eighth season as head track and field coach at UCSB.

He optimistically faces a building year after his Gauchos won but one dual meet last season, yet Adams is anything but discouraged as he enthusiastically accepts the new challenge for 1971.

Adams assumed command of the Gaucho spike program in January of 1964 following the retirement of veteran mentor Nick Carter who retired from the UCSB staff last June as an instructor in physical activities.

During the past seven years Adams' teams have twice taken second place in the NCAA (College Division) finals and the energetic young track coach has produced a number of All-Americans including three national champions, Jay Elbel (quarter-mile); Jerry Durfee (long jump) and Jerry Wygant (triple jump).

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Adams has been the assistant meet director of the Santa Barbara Easter Relays for the past 11 years and he also teaches in the UCSB physical activities department.

A former "weight" star at Cal, where he was coached by the late Brutus Hamilton, Adams has been extremely instrumental in luring to the Santa Barbara community the world's finest decathlon stars including Bill Toomey.

Adams was one of three coaches selected from throughout the United States last summer who served on the staff of the U.S. Decathlon Olympic Training Camp in Boulder, Colorado.

The UCSB track and field coach has authored several articles for national sports publications including "Decathlon: The Ultimate Test" and "The Javelin: Fundamentals and Drills" which appeared in COACH & ATHLETE magazine.

After his graduation from Santa Ynez High School in 1949, Adams distinguished himself on the Berkeley campus not only in track, but in a variety of extra-curricular activities in which he devoted much of his spare time.

Same was named Cal's "Outstanding Track and Field Athlete" in 1953, the same year he captained the Golden Bear team. In his junior and senior seasons he placed in the javelin finals of the NCAA championships.

Adams was a Lieutenant in the U.S. Army from 1954 to 1956. While in the service he competed in the All-Army Track and Field Championships, in which he placed second in the javelin and third in the shot put. While he was stationed in Europe he entered the All-Army European Championships and placed first in the javelin and second in the shot put and discus.

At a meet in Greece he competed against representatives of thirteen countries, under the auspices of the Consul of International Sport Military (CISM); winning the shot put, taking second in the javelin and third in the discus.

In 1954 he won the John Muir Decathlon in Pasadena, and in 1956 he was the SPAAU decathlon champion.

Adams also competed in two Olympic decathlon trials; in 1952 he placed sixth and in 1956 he placed fifth. Perhaps his greatest feat as decathlon competitor is that of holding the second best "triple" ever recorded, second only to Olympic Champion and "1960 Athlete of the Year", Rafer Johnson.

Adams and his wife, Sue, live in Goleta and they have two children, Wendy and John.

ASSISTANT COACH GERRY MORO

Gerry Moro, former University of Oregon All-American and 1964 Olympian, starts his first year as assistant to head track and field coach Sam Adams.

Moro will be working in the field areas, "where he is extremely knowledgeable," said Adams. "Gerry is quite progressive in his ideas and has already made a fine contribution to our team."

The 27 year old native of San Martino, Italy moved to British Columbia in 1950, became a Canadian citizen, represented his country in the Tokyo Olympics and twice was a competitor (1962 and 1966) in the British Empire and Commonwealth Games.

Moro is currently the Canadian decathlon record holder.

Upon his graduation from Oregon in 1965, Moro went on to earn his master's degree in physical education from Cal Poly of San Luis Obispo where he served as an assistant coach.

After completing his graduate studies, Moro worked for the Canadian government, traveling to over 200 cities and visiting 500,000 young people while developing an athletic Olympic program. "It was a combined effort to keep the kids off the street corners and prevent their involvement in drugs," Moro related, "and it was truly a tremendous experience."

Moro, a decathlon expert who specializes in the pole vault (he was a 16-footer at Oregon), has been on the staff of the Canadian Legion International Coaching Clinic held in Geulph, Canada.

He was destined for the 1968 Olympic Games (Mexico City), but an Achilles tendon injury forced his withdrawal from competition that year.

Moro is a bachelor and resides in Santa Barbara.
