Athens Track

Hines Leaps for Olympics

Henry Hines, winner of the Athens Invitational long jump Saturday night in Oakland Arena, dangled his legs over the elevated running track and said, "I'm going to Munich, there's no doubt about it.

"Those other cats, I don't know who they'll be, can fight for the other two places on the Olympic team. I'm going; they can have what's left."

Hines is probably right. He won the Athens jump at 26-0, a good indoor leap, and has an outdoor best of 26-8 $\frac{3}{4}$. More importantly, he usually does his best in the biggest meets.

The USC jumper knows his way around the world. He is the son of a doctor and Henry "grew up mostly in Japan. Then I went to high school from Travis Air Force Base."

He enrolled at Arizona State without benefit of a track scholarship, although he jumped 24-0 as a freshman.

"I didn't like the school, socially or otherwise," said Henry, "so I transferred to Sacramento City College and then got a scholarship to USC."

The Athens was an excellent meet, which deserved more than the 7269 fans who attended.

Little Kathy Hammond, from Sacramento, set a world indoor mark of 1:04.5 in the women's 500. Shot putter Al Feuerbach pushed the ball 67 - 1 3-4, his ninth straight victory, this time by 3-4 an inch over George Woods. Randy Matson, the Olympic medalist and outdoor world record holder at 71-5 1-2, was third at 66-4.

It was Feuerbach's 10th win of the season against one loss, and the sixth straight time he has beaten Matson.

"Wait until we all get outdoors," said Woods, who was sitting beside Feuerbach, "that's what it's all about."

Some American sprinters who have suggested loses to Russia's Valeriy Borzov in the last two years have been flukes were rebuked Saturday. Borzov is not a great starter but he's a strong-legged husky who really begins to gather at about 30 yards.

He pulled away from a good field to beat UCLA's Warren Edmonson and others in 6.1 for 60 yards. He is obviously stronger at the

Olympic distances of 100 and 200 meters.

The two-mile, matching great athletes, was won by outdoor world record holder Emil Puttemans of Belgium in 8:34.2. This was slow for Emil, whose record is 8:17.8, but conditions and pace dictated the result.

Former Stanford runner Don Kardong was the surprise of the race. Don ran a best-of-life 8:34.6 for second, beating world indoor record-holder Kerry O'Brien of Australia, who has clocked 8:19.2.

Kardong, perhaps stunned to find himself so well placed in such fast company, nevertheless made an earnest, last-lap move while closing ground on Puttemans.

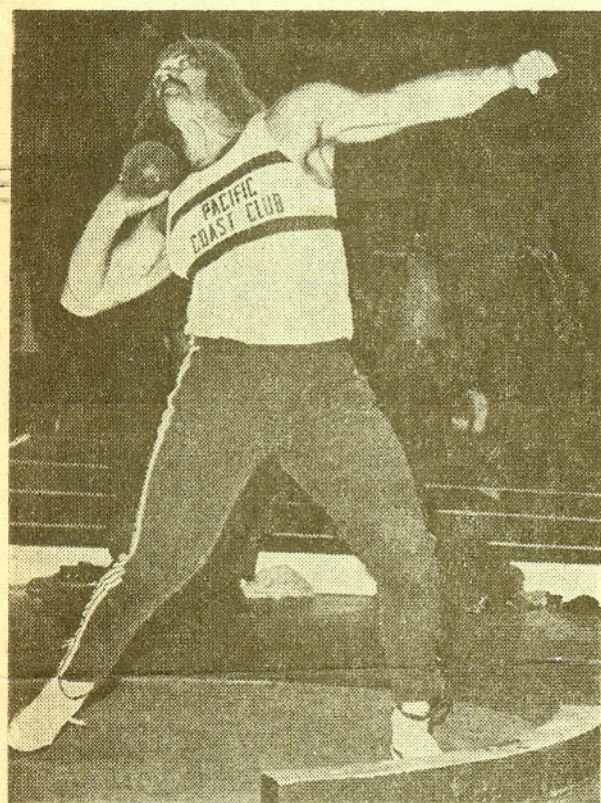
Don, who will try to make the Olympic team in the 10,000 meters, said, "Maybe I should have put the pressure on over the last three laps. My previous best was 8:38.7 and maybe I was little afraid of fading at the end. Actually I was strong." Yesterday, he won a marathon, proving his endurance at least.

Hurdler Tom Hill, who was outstanding during 1970 and then missed most of 1971 with a torn knee ligament, took the 60 hurdles in 7.1.

Southern U's Rod Milburn, who set a world record of 13.0 in the 120 high hurdles last year while remaining undefeated outdoors, was not in the race. But Hill, who has never lost to Milburn, defeated Rod in 7.0 Friday night in Los Angeles.

Hill, from Arkansas State, refused to predict that he would make the Olympic team.

"After a year's layoff and the torn ligament I'm not sure I can hold up over 110 meters (the Olympic distance)," he said.

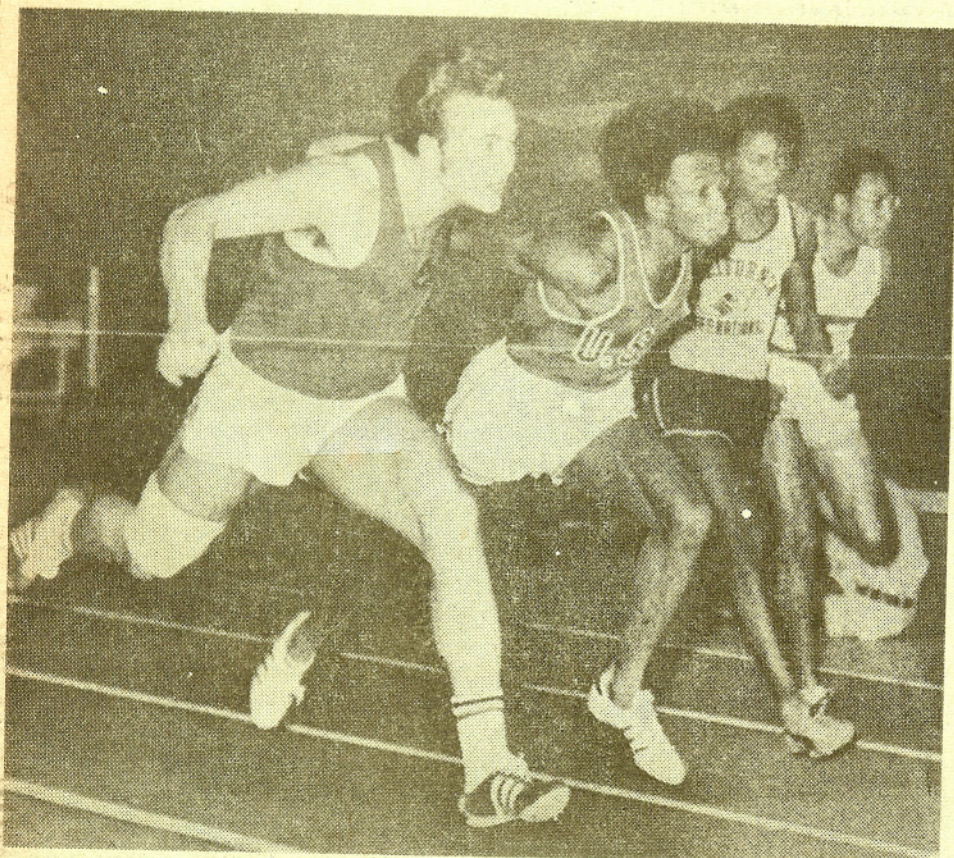
World indoor shot put record holder Al Feuerbach won with a 67-1 $\frac{3}{4}$ heave.

—to Jarvis Scott in 1:05.6. Here Kathy just ran to her own pace and was a clear three second winner over second place Nancy Mullen.

Long-haired Al Feuebach closed out his indoor season with seven consecutive victories. The winning distance of 67-1 $\frac{3}{4}$ was well below his recent world record of 69-4 $\frac{3}{4}$ ut was impressive because of the caliber of the field.

Among his victims were Olympic silver medalist George Woods, second just $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch behind, gold medalist Randy Matson (66-4 $\frac{1}{4}$) and two Russians, Rimantas Plunge and Nikolay Karasyov

Unbeaten sprint champion Valeriy Borzov provided the Russian team its first victory, holding off Warren Edmonson of UCLA in the 60 yard dash although both were timed in 6.1.

Borzov got off to a disappointing start but accelerated smoothly through the final 30 yards to overpower the field. Former NCAA champion Eddie Hart of Cal barely qualified and finished sixth.

Although slightly peeved that the field had been enlarged to four men from, Martin McGrady ran easily in claiming the 500 yard run. He led from the first 50 yards and was a clear five-yard victor over Wes Williams in 56.9.

Discus

World discus champion Fayna Myelnik of the Soviet Union had a best of 56-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ to win a specially created women's shot put event over Americans Marie Seidler and Janet Svendsen. It was not what you would call close. Miss Seidler finished 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet back and Miss Svendsen more than 10 feet behind.
