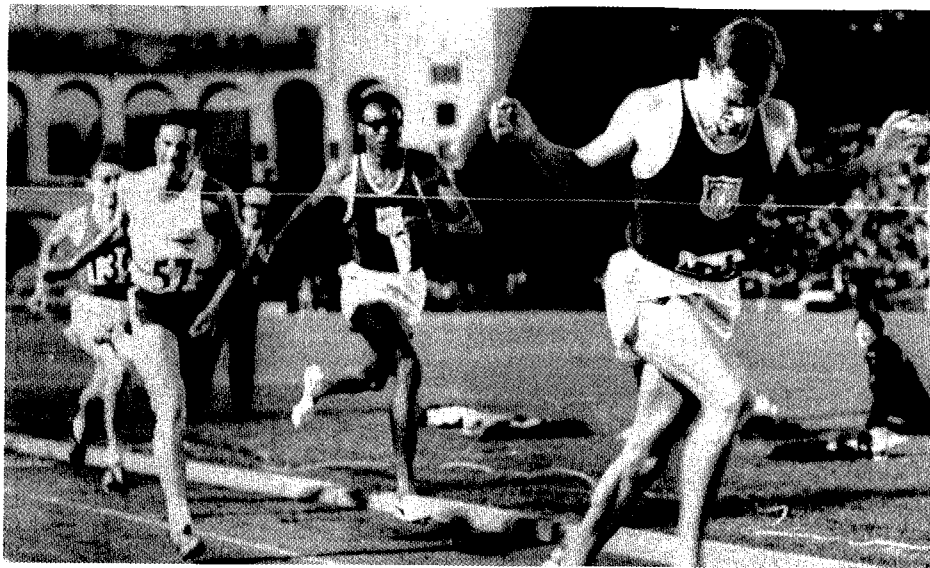
MEET REFEREE WILLIAM T. "BUZZ" SAWYER

Buzz, currently an engineer with Mack Truck in Hagerstown, Md., has long been active in track circles. His running career began at Granby High School in Norfolk. He matriculated at W & M Norfolk, now Old Dominion Univ., where he held most of the school records after his two year tenure. At North Carolina State Buzz attained Atlantic Coast Conference Championship honors for himself while he served as cross country coach.

Following his graduation from N. C. State, Buzz moved to Baltimore. He gained International honors while representing the Baltimore Olympic Club. He held all the South Atlantic long distance championships & records. He was a sub-9:00 minute two miler on the indoor circuit when the world record was just seconds better.

He represented the United States on a mideast tour in 1962.

Buzz is the creator and moving force behind the Cumberland Valley Athletic Club. He has started many young people towards successful track careers. Many Colleges and Universities have and are benefiting from the developmental program of the CVAC. Among the more remarkable events which Buzz has inaugurated is the John F. Kennedy 50 mile hike. In seven years the hike has grown from a scant 5 participants to more than 500 starters and 275 finishers in 1971. We are indeed fortunate to have Buzz as our meet referee.

LUZINS, MICHAEL RETURN TO W&M TONIGHT

Juris Luzins and Howell Michael, two of William and Mary's greatest all-time runners, return to their Alma Mater tonight to run in feature events. Luzins, one of the world's top ranked-middle distance runners, will compete in the mile. Luzins is the reigning National AAU 880 champ and is a prime US candidate for the 800 meters in the 1972 Olympics at Munich.

Michael, the only W&M runner to break four minutes for the mile, graduated last year and is, like Luzins, stationed at Quantico, fulfilling his military obligation.

Michael is best known for winning the NCAA Indoor mile, beating Marty Liquori in the picture below and winning the National AAU outdoor mile, once again beating Liquori. He will run the 2-mile.

THE NEED FOR A NEW OUTDOOR TRACK

Through the years, William and Mary has been instrumental in providing leadership for track and field in Virginia. Through sponsorship of the Tidewater High School Championship (the state's oldest continuing meet) and the State High School Championships, William and Mary has enabled many young men to grow through track and field competition at the College.

The last ten years have seen the Colonial Relays (with 1200 athletes last year) emerge as the top relay carnival in Virginia and one of the largest in the Southeast.

But the growth potential of these events has become seriously limited because of an outmoded track facility. While Virginia and Virginia Tech have forged ahead with eight-lane, all-weather composition tracks, William and Mary has fallen behind with its present four lane cinder track.

In order to expand our program of service to more youth and enhance our team's performances, William and Mary needs a wider track which can be used in all kinds of weather, both for practice and for record-setting competition at all age levels.

An all-weather, eight-lane track will permit William and Mary to regain the State AAA High School Track Championships which have been shifted to Charlottesville for 1972 to take advantage of the University's new facility.

In addition, a new track at Cary Field would make it possible to bring a meet of national championship stature to Williamsburg.

Operation BACK-TRACK'S goal is to construct an eight-lane Uniturf running track in Cary Field.
