Branch's 9.3 world mark

Clifford Branch, something less than a sensation in Colorado's Astro-Bluebonnet triumph over the University of Houston less than two months ago, returned to his hometown and the Astrodome Saturday night and blazed to a new indoor world record of 9.3 in the 100-yard dash.

The performance of Branch, a former Worthing High School great, somewhat stole the spotlight from world record-holders Rod Milburn and Pat Matzdorf as the fourth annual Jaycees-Astrodome-Federation National Indoor track and field championships drug on and on before a patient crowd of more than 13,000.

BRANCH, WHO had equalled the world record of 9.4 during the preliminaries earlier Saturday, outdistanced a tremendous field to enter his name alongside those of Matzdorf and Milburn.

Starting in lane four, Branch whistled down the coral straightaway while Gerald-Tinker, a co-holder of the previous record, was running close behind two lanes away in lane six.

Tinker, former Memphis State star now running unattached, was so close in fact that many felt he had won the event but the finish judges declared Branch the winner for the second year in a row. And the time was two-

tenths of a second better than a year ago. Earlier, Matzdorf and Milburn met with contrasting success in their specialties.

ALTHOUGH THEIR paths never cross competitively,

Milburn and Matzdorf have a lot in common... and it's not all good.

They both became world record-holders within a period of eight days last summer — Milburn in the 120-yard high hurdles and Matzdorf in the

high jump.

That's great. The prestige that accompanies such accomplishments is something comparatively few athletes

have the opportunity to experience.

Milburn and Matzdorf are learning a lot about it, particularly the hazards involved in trying to accommodate a demanding public.

Matzdorf arrived just in time to clear the qualifying height of 6-5 in the high jump Saturday after spending some 14 hours en route from Paris, where he had received the International Athlete of the Year award for his 7-6½ leap last July 3.

Milburn did a little better. He arrived at 5:30 a.m. from Los Angeles, got to bed at 7 and slept for a "good" four hours before arising because of the constant pounding on his door and telephone calls. Despite their problems, both performed well.

Milburn won the special invitational 120-yard highs with a highly-respectable time of 13.4, although well off his world record clocking of 13.0 last June 25.

Matzdorf, forgiveably, didn't fare as well. He failed to clear 7-1 and Chris Dunn of Colgate, with his long hair and odd-colored shoes, won the event with a jump of 7-1.

Despite Previous Dollar Losses

Runners Race Around Dome

A dozen world indoor bests were hung up in the first three editions of the Astrodome Federation track and field championships. The level of performance was unsurpassed, but the gate receipts (a deficit of nearly \$100,000) were another matter.

Today's fourth annual meet, cosponsored by the Houston Jaycees, should match previous standards. Two world outdoor and six American record holders are in the cast of nearly 3000.

Most finals begin at 7 o'clock after this afternoon's prelims starting at 1. Junior college and girls trials began this morning.

With one year remaining on the meet contract, Astrodome and U.S. Track and Field Federation officials anxiously await tonight's crowd. Last year's meet drew only 15,000 for two nights.

"I just don't know," Carl Cooper, the USTFF's executive director, described the meet's future. "We'll just wait until we see the crowd. We've lost about \$90,000 on the last three meets. I've been down here about 10 times and I see people lined up for motorcycle races and demolition derbies but they haven't turned out for track. Maybe it's because they know there's no chance of anyone getting killed, I just don't know."

Hurdler Rod Milburn of Southern and high jumper Pat Matzdorf of Wisconsin hold current world outdoor marks. Willie Davenport and Erv Hall, the one-two finishers in the 1968 Olympics, contend with Milburn in a special 120-yard high hurdles race. Matzdorf, who has cleared 7-6 $\frac{1}{4}$, faces Bill Elliott of the Pacific Coast Club, Tim Heikkila, of Minnesota, Ron Jourdan of Florida Track Club and Ray McGill.

An invitational two-mile features Olympic veteran George Young, Houstonian Leonard Hilton, Villanova ex Marty Liquori, Sid Sink, Bowling Green, and Greg Fredericks, Penn State.

In last year's meet Liquori anchored Villanova's distance medley in 3:57.4 on the final mile, then won the open mile in 3:57.2 the next night. Villanova's long relays are strong again, anchored by Brian McElroy, but Illinois, Wisconsin and Texas-El Paso are prominent two-mile relay contenders.

Southern Cal's Willie Deckard and Colorado's duo of Cliff Branch and George Daniels have clocked 9.2 in the 100 with Alcorn's Willie McGee. Deckard and 45.3 quartermiler Edesel Garrison are in the USC entry which in-

cludes shot putter Doug Lane (64-4 $\frac{1}{2}$), hurdler Leon Brown (13.7) and miler Rich Carr (4:03.7).

Matchless Rodney Milburn of Southern University, track and field athlete of the year in 1971, began this Olympic season with a bombshell Saturday night.

The 21-year-old junior from Opelousas, La., streaked to the world's fastest 120-yard high hurdle time ever clocked indoors, 13.4 in the Jaycee Astrodome Federation Championships.

Milburn, who set an outdoor

world mark of 13.0 and won 23 races without a loss last season, clipped one-tenth off Willie Davenport's former indoor best.

Colorado sprinter Cliff Branch, a Worthing High ex, equalled the world indoor 100-yard dash standard of 9.3 after what was either a "rolling" start or a great one. There were some who thought Branch, who played on Colorado's winning Astro-Bluebon-

net team, beat the starter's gun by a hair.

Milburn was voted the outstanding performer, followed by Villanova's Brian McElroy and Branch.

Illinois matched the fastest indoor two-mile relay time in history 7:19.8 before three-time Olympian George Young stepped onto the 352-yard plywood track, largest in the world. Young's closing kick was too strong for a class field as the 34-year-old school

teacher from Casa Grande, Ariz. handily won the invitational two-mile in 8:28.1.

Marty Liquori, the world's No. 1 miler last year, was third in 8:31.5 behind Sid Sink of Bowling Green (8:29.6).

In an impressive display, the tanned Young, running in a peppermint striped shirt, covered the last mile at 4:07.8, the final half in 2:01.7 and the closing 440 in 57.9.

Rice's Dave Roberts, the na-

tional collegiate outdoor champ, won the university pole vault at 17-0 and had a near miss at a meet record 17-4.

A crowd of 14,000 attended the fourth annual meet which ran more than an hour late.

Less than an hour before Milburn's wizardry, Jerome Howe of Kansas State clocked a 3:56.5 mile as the Wildcats took the university division distance medley in 9:33.8. Howe's mile time was the fastest ever in Texas, indoor or outdoor.

Jerry Wilson of Southern California won the university hurdles in 13.7 and Reid Fischer of Highland Park set a high school mark of 4:10.3 in the mile.

Kansas State's distance medley relay got the meet off to a smoking start with its 9:33.8 winning time, second fastest ever indoors or outdoors. The Wildcats overhauled Villanova, whose 9:31.5 here last year is the fastest in track history.

Brian McElroy's 2:52.7 on the three quarter mile portion sent Villanova ahead by 12 yards before Howe came on the scene. Running easily, he made up ground steadily on Villanova's John Hartnett, passing him on the last backstretch.

Preceding Howe's 3:56.5 on the anchor mile were half-miler Clardy Vinson in 1:53.8, quarter-miler Fred Merrill in 47.8 and Rick Hitchcock on the three quarter mile in 2:55.7.

Illinois' two-mile relay team matched the fastest-ever indoor mark compiled here last year by Wisconsin. Robert Margo (1:51.9), David Kacmer (1:49.8) Lee Labadie

(1:51.4) formed the Illini quartet.

Labadie's third leg gave Phillips enough of a lead to fend off a 1:49.4 anchor by Villanova's McElroy.

In the featured invitational two-mile, University of Houston ex Leonard Hilton set the pace most of the first mile, then John McDonald led to the final lap.

Then Young, the American outdoor record holder, took the lid off his reserve tank. He opened a 10-yard lead starting the gun lap, and Sid Sink and Liquori had too much of a margin to overtake. The first five finishers broke the meet record of 8:34.2. Hilton faded and was next to last.

Southern Cal's Edesel Garrison led a mass assault on the

meet 440-yard dash record of 46.9, bettered by the first five finishers.

Leading all the way in the inside lane, Garrison blazed to a 45.7, just one-tenth of a second off the indoor best held by Prairie View's Fred Newhouse. Ed Roberts and Texas Aggie ex Curtis Mills, former world record holder, followed at 46.2 and 46.5. Behind them were Dave Adkins, Florida Track Club, 46.5; Beauford Brown, Florida, 46.6; and Ralph Kennedy, Lamar, 46.9.

His long hair tied in a pony tail, Chris Dunn of Colgate surprised to win the high jump at 7-1. World record holder Pat Matzdorf of Wisconsin was fourth at 6-11. Rice sophomore Glen Ray also cleared 6-11 for a school record.

HOUSTON — World record holder Rod Milburn of Southern University and Cliff Branch, University of Colorado sprinter who hails from Houston, lived up to their advance billings here Saturday night in the Astrodome Federation Track and Field meet but world record holder Pat Matzdorf of Wisconsin was upset.

Milburn, who holds the world record of 13.0 in the outdoor 120 high hurdles ran the fastest time ever recorded indoors in the same event in a brilliant 13.5.

Branch, who had tied the Astrodome record of 9.4 in Saturday afternoon's prelims of the 100 yard dash, nipped Gerald Tinker of Memphis St. in

9.3 with Tinker tying the old record of 9.4.

Matzdorf, who has cleared a world record 7-6¼ in the high jump, saw Chris Dunn of Colgate win with 7-1 as the Wisconsin ace finished fourth on fewer misses at 6-11. Ron Jardin of Florida Track Club and Glen Ray of Rice were second and third, also at 6-11.

Milburn nipped 1968 Olympic champion Willie Davenport, who had a 13.5.

Three-time Olympian George Young defeated Sid Sink of Bowling Green in the heralded two-mile run with Marty Liquori, currently the world's hottest miler, third.

Dave Roberts, Rice's NCAA champion, won the pole vault with a leap of 17-0, missing three times at 17-4.

The University of Texas Longhorns of coach Cleburne Price, who doubled as the meet director, could do no better than third in any event.

This was turned in by Gordon Hodges in the University 120-yard high hurdles in 14.1 behind the winning 13.7 of Jerry Wilson of Southern Cal. Texas freshman Randy Lightfoot finished fifth in the fast company in 14.3.

The Texas distance medley relay quartet of Ed Wright, Craig Brooks, Bill Goldapp and Ricky Yarbrough finished fourth in 9:43.3, almost ten seconds behind the winning 9:33.8 of Kansas St. which got a fabulous 3:56.5 mile anchor from Jerome Howe.

Villanova was second in 9:37.1
