AL FEUERBACH, PACIFIC COAST CLUB, 24, 6-1, 250

This is a new lifetime outdoor best for me...Disappointed, I would hardly say that but I never felt so close to a 70-foot put...believe it or not, I could my hair on the last throw...first time my hair ever became a deterrent to my putting...I'm not going to clip my hair, though, unless it bothers me on all six throws...I had to get a good throw outdoors...I felt fresh and rested... I can't speak for whether or not Randy (Matson) about his marks...I was impressed with him...I'm up to 250 now and just turned 24...I had no idea it was going to be this hot...I took a break from weightlifting on Wednesday because my back hurt a little...I think it was fatigue...after putting 68 feet consistently indoors I would have been disappointed with anything under 68 today...yes, I think this is a breakthrough for me outdoors...I believe the Kansas Relays will be my next major competition, but I will take a little break from hard practice and maybe take in one more meet in Southern California before then...I didn't feel I exploded quite like I could have, but I had a number of nice throws...I didn't come into the meet looking for 70...I haven't been trying to go all-out across the ring... I've been playing it a little safe...I will definitely be going for 70 now... definitely...I held back a little on my first throw...I was a little tense, I guess. I would like to compete in an all-comers meet next week if I can find a place to stay around here...I don't believe in peaks, but I'd like to catch that big one soon...I will lay off the lifting a bit in the next three weeks.

ROD MILBURN, SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY, 21, 6-0, 180

The false starts threw me off a little...ruins the timing a bit...I felt that I had the race under control at the seventh hurdles...Babb is one of the best coming off the blocks and over the first three hurdles...I would really be great if I had his early speed...I was relieved a little to find out that Willie Davenport was not in the race (Davenport withdrew because of a funeral he was attending)...Babb, Tommy White, and Paul Gibson are all great, I know, and it was less pressure when White and Gibson were out of the race...right now I'm not concentrating on time...I think I can run 12.6 or 12.7 someday...I feel that I am capable of 9.2 or 9.3 in the 100...my present concern is getting my technique and form together and not worrying about time...I felt that it would take 13.5 or 13.6 to win today and this is what I thought I would run...I opened last year at 13.5 and ran 13-flat in Eugene, Oregon, before the season was over...I was really relaxed that day...Davenport had about 9.4 speed and I think I am faster in the 100...the track was good here, the old dirttrack was all messed up, I had heard, but this has good balance...my main goal, ofcourse, is the Olympic gold medal, then I'd like to play football at Southern this fall and eventually play pro ball...I was a flanker and defensive safety for three years in high school and I have good hands, can run good patterns, and I believe that I have more going for me than some of the other fast trackmen who have made it with the pros...I have to concentrate on form right now in track...the speed is there and the fast times will come later...the change in weather from home was really big...it was 40 degrees when I left yesterday and real cold...I had thought to bring an overcoat and brought a sweater...I thought it was 75 and hot enough, but when I was told it was over 90 here today I could hardly believe it...I'm a junior at Southern and plan to finish up there before trying pro football.



JURIS LUZINS, MARINES, 24, 6-2, 165

The time today was certainly decent...pretty slow first lap, around 57.5, which means we ran the second lap in 53...it was as good a field as you could want-- Swenson, Van Dyke, and the rest...half-mile times are notoriously slow at this time of the year...nobody runs a fast first 440...today was very typical...my next race will be the US-Russian indoor meet in two weeks in Richmond, Virginia...I will run outdoors in the Florida Relays on March 24, probably on the Marines distance medley against Club West, with Ryun, Winzenried, etc, which should be very good competition...my all-time best is 1:45.2, last year, and I think that I can run a little faster than that...my main goal is the Olympics and to compete for two more years and compete well...I'll let the times come as they may... my speed is a bit less than it was, but I have not been working on speed and my training has been minimal...I'll start my really hard training now...this track is great...Tartan is by far better than dirt and this Tartan is better than ~~most~~ most... I have 15 months left to serve in the Marines...I am a first lieutenant at Quantico, Va.,...I don't know what I'll do after that...I have been here and working out for the past 3 days and I am a little surprised and pleased with the warm weather... they have had a cold spell back East since I left...I like the opportunity to come out here to train and compete...my indoor times for the mile and 100 yards this winter have been better than last year, but not quite as good as two years ago... I feel ready for a big year.



RON WHITNEY, 29, 6-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ , 175

I am presently the headmaster of a boys' school in Calistoga, Calif., in the upper Napa Valley, called Heritage Ranch Boys' School...we have 36 boys on the junior high level, we have 100 acres to work with, and I just love it; we're doing more with the boys than you could possibly imagine...this was first race outdoors and the time (50.9) was not spectacular, but the competition was...the field was topflight for the intermediates...I've been a proponent of the Tartan track since 1967 when I ran on one at Winnipeg...it's a fast surface if you know how to run on it...it requires a certain stride for the intermediates and elongates your stride...I have converted to 14 steps between hurdles instead of 15 as has been customary for me...now I'm alternating and it's unnatural for me...I'm pleased to win anytime and this early in the year it's difficult to get a fast time...I have just resumed training with the coach and team at Santa Rosa JC after trying to work by myself for three years with little or no success...it has been pretty cold in northern California and I have just started to run outdoors...my next meet will be the Sacramento Relays...I have been running indoors, too, as you know...I'll be 30 years old on October 5...I did not do well at Mexico City and I want to make it to Munich more than ever.



JEAN-LOUIS RAVELOMANANTSOA, MALAGASY REPUBLIC, 28, 5-9, 160

This is a pretty good Tartan track...I was pleased with the time; yes, it was my first outdoor race of the season...I ran 9.5 to open up last year outdoors, but I didn't run on Tartan...I ran at Mexico City as one of four representing Madagascar, now renamed the Malagasy Republic...I hope for an Olympic medal at Munich, naturally... it will take 9.1 100 yards or 9.9 100 meters speed to win the gold medal, I think... I didn't realize I was away so fast today...at this time of the year it is hard to know where you are...I ran fewer races indoors because it will be such a long season outdoors and my first 60 yards are pretty good...I want to go gradually and not peak too soon...I had a good season indoors, all things considered...I will represent Westmont College in Santa Barbara a again during the collegiate season-I plan to graduate there this year...my next race will be the Santa Barbara Easter Relays.

TOM VON HUDEN, PACIFIC COAST CLUB, 27, 6-0, 156

I didn't know where Jim (Ryun) was or that he was far back until a few seconds after the finish...after the 880, I couldn't even hear the announcer...I am not really surprised at the time (3:56.9)...under perfect conditions I felt that I could run 3:56 today...it was a very even pace...I sometimes have to push myself, but the field moved me along...George Young kept pushing, but I knew that he hadn't run in a long time so I felt that he might not have enough left...Mark Winzenried has been training hard and I thought John Lawson would be tough...I haven't talked with Ryun since the race; when you run off your best you don't feel like talking with anybody...I saw him run 4:19 in Stockholm and 4:13 here and I think he is running without motivation right now...I don't know the reason...I will run in the Kansas Relays on April 22 vs. Ryun and I hope Marty Liquori will be ready then...there are several fine college runners to watch for in the 1500 meters...I'm completing work on my masters degree in P.E. at Oklahoma State University, have my bachelors degree in Geography...after May 20 all my competition will be on the West Coast.
