#### Winner Wobbly, **Given Treatment** Following Race

Jim Ryun won, and the crowd loved it, but the time was ridiculously slow and the future of the onetime boy wonder remains a question after his struggling three-yard decision over Olympic champion Kip Keino of Kenya in the Sunkist Invitational mile Saturday night at the Sports Arena.

Ryun, running his last lap in 56.7, finished in 4:06.8, a time he once wouldn't have accepted as a decent workout. His world outdoor record is 3:51.1 and he shares the world indoor record with Tom O'Hara at 3:56.4

Keino, the 32-year-old police inspector who upset Ryun in the 1968 Olympic Games, was timed in 4:07.3.

Ryun, wobbly afterward, was taken to the office of Sports Arena manager Bill Nicholas where he was attended by Dr. George Rhoden, former Olympic 400-meter champion.

#### Ryun 'Couldn't Breathe'

Ryun didn't receive reporters for 30 minutes, but he denied that he was suffering from exhaustion

"It isn't that I got sick after the race, "said the 24-year-old ex-Kan-san. "But I didn't have a chance to warm down and the people descend-

Jim Ryun won, and the crowd loved it, but the time was ridiculously slow and the future of the onetime boy wonder remains a question after his struggling three-yard deci-sion over Olympic champion Kip Keino of Kenya in the Sunkist Invi-tational mile Saturday night at the Sports Arena,

Ryun, running his last lap in 56.7. finished in 4:06.8, a time he once wouldn't have accepted as a decent workout. His world outdoor record is 3:51.1 and he shares the world indoor record with Tom O'Hara at 3:56.4

Keino, the 32-year-old police inspector who upset Ryun in the 1968 Olympic Games, was timed in 4:07.3.

Ryun, wobbly afterward, was taken to the office of Sports Arena manager Bill Nicholas where he was at-tended by Dr. George Rhoden, form-er Olympic 400-meter champion. Ryun 'Couldn't Breathe'

#### Ryun didn't receive reporters for

30 minutes, but he denied that he was suffering from exhaustion.

"It isn't that I got sick after the race, 'said the 24-year-old ex-Kansan. "But I didn't have a chance to warm down and the people descended on me and I couldn't breathe, "It was an exciting race and Keino

is liable to do anything, particularly after running two races in two nights and four in the last eight "There was so much noise that I
