EDESEL GARRISON (USC)---Age=21; Ht.=6'2"; Wt.=193; Lives in Los Angeles and is a student at USC...."I expected Wayne (Collett) to go out fast & like that and it didn't bother me. I feel much better now about my meet record 57.1 because it's the first time I've ever run indoors in my hometown crowd...my parents and friends were here. I use the indoor season to get into shape for outdoors and I only worked out one day this week because of finals. I use speed work and 330's as my training. There was a little jostling on the first turn because they started us in a line for the first time and everybody wanted the inside. And I started slowly, so got bumped.

TOM VON RUDEM (Pacific Coast Club)---Age: 27; Ht.: 6'0"; Wt.: 156; Graduate student at Oklahoma St..."This is my slowest time in three years. (Mark) Winzenreid and I agree this track is one of the slowest of the indoor tracks. The Tartan is a good surface for outdoors but is bad for indoors. The Pro-west is a better indoor surface. Knowing this track, you could break your back and still get a slow time. I plan to try for the Olympics in the 1500 meters. I ran the 1000 here because I like the shorter races in indoor meets.

JIM RYUN --- Age: 24; Ht.: 6-3; Wt.: 163.1. Lives in Goleta, Calif. and is an industrial photographer..."It isn't that I got sick after the race but I didn't have a chance to warm down and the people descended upon me and I couldn't breathe. It actually hasn't happened before. It was just more exaggerated this time. It was an exciting race and Keino is liable to do anything, particularly after running two races in two nights and four in the last eight days. There was so much noise that I didn't know where Keino was so I glanced over my shoulder to see if he was going to make a move, knowing that I had plenty left. I suppose both Kip and I spent ourselves and would've like to have had a faster time. But the important thing was winning the race. (Ryun continued on next page)

Ryan continued --- "I took the lead as early as I did because I didn't want us winding down to a 4:10 mile and I guess the time on the last few laps was fast enough. I know of no better way to start than with a win. I'd like to say that I'm going to win them all from now on, but it's the important one in seven or eight months that really counts (the Olympics). This was my first race and I had no time trials so obviously I'm pleased. As far as time is concerned, I had some goals earlier in the week until I heard that Keino was running and then all that was important was who won the race. I kept wondering when he'd come around (he). I'm going to run the two mile at Portland next weekend and I've never run against Prefontaine or shorter before, so I'm pretty excited about it. Tonight I think everybody was running against the man not the clock. I felt confident going into the race."

Keino, the 32-year-old police inspector who upset Ryun in the 1968 Olympic Games, was timed in 4:07.3.

Ryun, wobbly afterward, was taken to the office of Sports Arena manager Bill Nicholas where he was attended by Dr. George Rhoden, former Olympic 400-meter champion.

## **Ryun 'Couldn't Breathe'**

Ryun didn't receive reporters for 30 minutes, but he denied that he was suffering from exhaustion.

"It isn't that I got sick after the race," said the 24-year-old ex-Kansan. "But I didn't have a chance to warm down and the people descended on me and I couldn't breathe.

"It was an exciting race and Keino is liable to do anything, particularly after running two races in two nights and four in the last eight days.

"There was so much noise that I didn't know where Keino was, so I glanced over my shoulder to see if he was going to make his move, knowing that I had plenty left. I suppose both Kip and I spent ourselves and would've liked to have had a faster time. But the important thing was winning the race."

Keino, forsaking his usual pace-setting role, ran dead last in the early going and at one time trailed Ryun by 30 yards. But when Ryun broke away after the half mile, run
