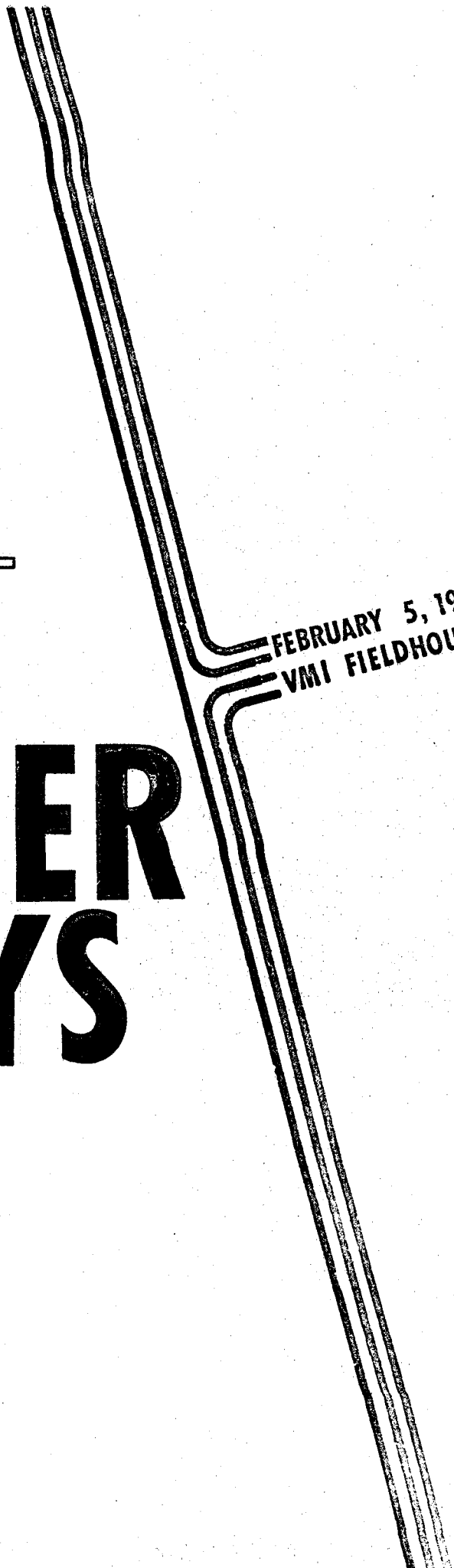

RECORD HOLDERS - CHAMPIONS RETURN TO VMI WINTER RELAYS

The Twenty-First VMI Winter Relays will see the largest list of participating schools in its history. Teams from over 50 colleges and universities as well as high school and seniors' entries will compete in a total of 21 events.

The 21 events are also the highest total in the Relay's history. On the college level there will be eleven running events and, with the new 35-pound weight throw, a total of six field events. There will be two high school and two seniors' running events.

A total of seven championship finishers, three of which set new meet records last year, will return to defend their titles.

Four of the country's top milers are entered along with the Relay's record-setting two-miler, so the distance events are assured of having competitive fireworks.

Duke University's Bob Wheeler, the NCAA indoor 1000 yard run champion, finished second to Villanova's Marty Liquori in the outdoor NCAA mile last spring. Finishing fourth in that same mile run was Mike Mosser of West Virginia. These two young men will be competing along with Reggie McAfee, a junior college transfer at the University of North Carolina. McAfee won the junior college mile and two mile titles last year and had a sixth place finish in the AAU's and a third place finish in the 1971 Freedom Games in Philadelphia behind Liquori and Jim Ryun.

Another top miler in the Relays will be N. C. State's Jim Wilkins who came in sixth in the NCAA outdoor mile.

The distance events in the Relays include the four mile relay, the distance medley and the two mile run.

Last year's Winter Relays' two mile winner, Larry Widgeon of North Carolina, will return with hopes of bettering his record time of 8:58.5. But even a greater challenge for him might be just coming in at the front of the pack. East Tennessee State University coach David Walker will be bringing a flock of Irishmen who are experienced distance runners such as brothers Eddie and Patrick Leddy and freshman Kevin Breen.

These and other Irish imports, it should be pointed out, have helped ETSU to two straight Ohio Valley Conference Championships and a fifth place in NCAA cross country this past year. ETSU also will be defending its 440 relay crown and will likely make a strong run at the 880 relay title.

Although no record is kept as to which school garners the most first and second places, North Carolina and Maryland of the Atlantic Coast Conference and William and Mary and East Carolina of the Southern Conference will have the longest entries lists in the meet and have the potential to produce several winners apiece.

One of the top duels in the field events should be between Maryland's Vince Struble and William and Mary's Charles Strode in the pole vault. Strode set a new Winter Relays standard last year with a vault of 15' 5 3/4".

Last year's winner of the "Outstanding in Field Events Award", Darryl Kelly of North Carolina will return to defend his title in the triple jump where he set a meet record of 50' 7 1/2". East Carolina will provide stiff opposition in this and other field events along with Maryland.

In the sprints, North Carolina Central University will be well represented by Larry Black, who finished second in the NCAA's 220, and Robert Ouku, the Kenyan that won the 880 in the American-Pan African Meet last year in Durham, N. C. N. C. Central's sprint medley and hurdle shuttle teams will be championship contenders.
