CANYON, Tex.--Sprinters Tracy Dickson and Lee Lewis sparked Saturday as West Texas State won its own invitational track meet, beating second place Texas Tech, 101-95.

University of Texas at Arlington took third in 31, while New Mexico State had 29.

Dickson, aided by a strong tail wind, raced to a 9.2 clocking in the 100-yard dash and Lewis was only a step behind in 9.3. Lewis won the 220 in 21.3.

The Buffaloes of coach Bob Kitchens won 10 of 17 first places for the victory.

In a record-breaking effort freshman Kirk Johnson of West Texas hurled the discus 172-7, only 22 inches short of his own personal best.

The Buffaloes won both relay events, taking the 440 in a 41.4 time and the mile relay in 3:24.5.

Other individual winners were Carl Brown, 120-yard high hurdles; Randy Thomas, 440-yard intermediate hurdles; Jim Childers, triple jump; and Warren Snow, pole vault.

The Buffaloes, minus Brown, will compete Friday night in Plainview against Texas Tech, Wayland Baptist College and Lubbock Christian College. No points will be kept in that four-way meet.

Brown, who has a 13.8 best this spring, is entered Saturday in the Drake Relays at Des Moines, Iowa. Among the high hurdle entries there is Rodney Milburn, world record holder.
