## TRACK OUTLOOK

From among his 70 track and field athletes, Aggie head coach JOHN PAPPA has but 14 lettermen with which to build a competitive team this season.

Fortunately, he has in that vital "dozen plus two" a decathlon champion, a conference half-mile king, and a potential 50-foot triple jump expert. Also around last year though not on the squad is a 190-foot discus thrower.

When he talks about strong events, PAPPA cites the pole vault, where decathlon ace CHARLIE SHATTUCK figures to clear 16'6" in the coming weeks; the 880, where "Peanut" Harms aspires to crack 1:50.0; the triple jump, where sophomore ANTHONY TERRY should surpass 50 feet; the discus, where TOM PIPES might win a national title and exceed 190 feet; the 440, where SPENCER MALYSIAK could break 48.0; and the three-mile, where JOHN SHEEHAN is a solid bet to go beneath 14 minutes.

Strength is also personified by KEN MERCURIO, a proven 1:54.0 half-miler; PETE BRUNN, a 14-6 pole vaulter; and seasoned distance and middle distance chasers DONN WELLS, *Woodside* JERRY MAYDAHL, CHRIS WALL and JIM VAN deERVE.

More points should also be forthcoming in the weight events from TOM LACHMAR, LESTER LEE and BOB REIDEL, a trio of '72 letter winners.

PAPPA must rely upon freshmen to fill many of the holes. And he has some prime yearling prospects in high jumpers GARY BALL and LARRY GAINES, high hurdler CURTIS HIGGS, discus tosser WAYNE CATRON, triple leaper PETE TAYLOR, quarter-miler GLEN BROWNING, sprinter DOUG COLWELL and distance runners JOHN HOLCOMB and ANTHONY REYNOSO.

A sprinkling of good transfers would help any cinder squad and the Aggies have several in 440 man DAVE DUKE, vaulter KARY TAYLOR and intermediate hurdler TODD SKINNER.

## GOLF OUTLOOK

More experienced than last year and just about as young, the Aggie golfers anticipate another outstanding season in 1973. Under coach JOE CARLSON, now in his sixth term at the helm, the team has captured the Far Western Conference title twice in the past three campaigns.

Tops among the six lettermen is sophomore STEVE GRADY, defending FWC medalist and an honorable mention All-American at last year's NCAA College Division Championships in Williamstown, Mass. Joining GRADY again this spring with national competition experience behind them are STEVE GEDESTAD and KELLY O'NEIL. Other veterans from 1972 are MIKE FOSTER, PAUL KNAUFF and JIM HALEY.

Heading up the crop of new recruits are BOB KNIFSEND, a transfer from Diablo Valley College, and PAT O'NEIL, a freshman and brother of Aggie regular KELLY.

## TENNIS OUTLOOK

Anxious to regain the Far Western Conference tennis crown they lost last year, the Aggies of coach WILL LOTTER appear to have the experience and depth to do just that in 1973.

Captain and long-time mainstay PAUL VODAK is back for his final fling, but he will be hard pressed to beat out heralded freshman TIM MONROE as king of the courts. And there is also JIM WILE, a much-improved player since his rookie season.

Other lettermen from last year are SCOTT CARTER, JIM CHILDRESS and VAN LONGYEAR.

MONROE is easily the best newcomer in camp, but LOTTER maintains he has good depth in the likes of yearlings DOUG ATKINSON, CLIFF MITCHELL, JEFF SAMUELS, MARK STROMBOTNE and TIM AINSWORTH.
