

SJS claims PCAA track crown

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (AP) — Sensational freshman Mark Schilling added the spice, veteran Vince Breddell salted away twin sprint triumphs and San Jose State tasted victory again in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association track and field championships.

Schilling was the big story for the Spartans, who scored 118½ points last Saturday to only 56 for Long Beach State. That gave San Jose the team title in the PCAA chase with a two-day total of 152½ points to 113 for the runner-up 49ers. Fresno State had 69, UC Santa Barbara 40½, Los Angeles State and San Diego State 37 each and University of Pacific 15.

Schilling captured the half mile in a meet record 1:50.6 and then came back for a mile triumph in 4:06.9.

Los Angeles' John Dean also turned in a creditable distance double, winning the three-mile in the PCAA record time of 13:51.0 and taking second in the mile at 4:07.7.

Breddell won the 100 in 9.7 and the 220 in 21.6 and also anchored a winning 440-yard relay team as the Spartans showed their might on the track.
