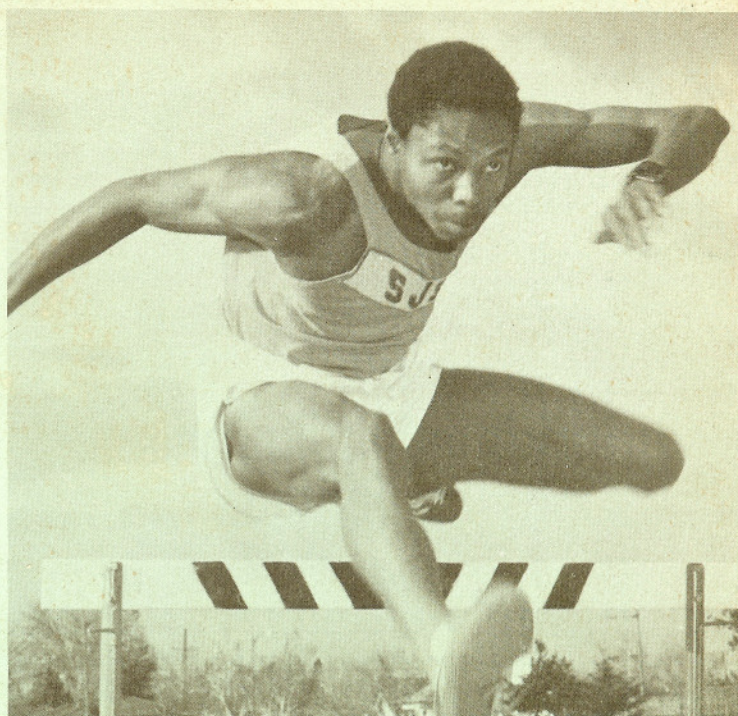

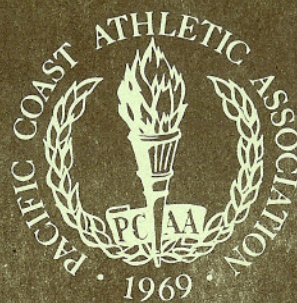

He has also had success in other field event areas at SJS, developing shot putters Richard Marks (63-10 1/2), and Greg Born (60-8), discus throwers John Powell (195-0) and Gary O'Sullivan (182-11), javelin thrower Mike Metz (254-10) and long jumper Marion Anderson (26-2 1/2).

Bullard graduated in 1959 from USC, where he took fourth in the NCAA pole vault at 14-7 and received his Master of Science Degree from Arizona State in 1961.

Don Riggs - Cross-Country Coach and Assistant Track Coach

Primarily in charge of the San Jose distance program, and now also with the short distance runners with the start of the track season, assistant coach Don Riggs was named to the Physical Education Department as head cross-country coach in September of 1972, replacing Lee Evans. He comes to SUSU with a list of impressive credentials, last coaching at the University of Oregon as an assistant coach in charge of the weight events, high jump, and running events. He attended Eastern Washington State for his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education with a minor in Language Arts, and moved to Central University for his Master's. Once completing his work there, he transferred in 1969 to the University of Oregon and received his Doctorate in Physical Education. Besides extensive college coaching, he has coached nine years of high school athletics in Othello, Washington where he took the head coaching position's of three sports - football, basketball, and track.

In addition to Don Riggs, Bullard will have two other assistants. Larry Livers, assistant cross country coach in his first year here, will handle the hurdlers and sprinters. Don Zile will coach the long and triple jumpers and attempt to compile a synopsis of statistics by the end of the season.

the long jump, as will Fred Wikkelling (23'5½"), a transfer from American River, and Rick Gaudinier (23'1"), who hopes to improve enough to score several points during the course of the year. Montena Terry will develop his natural jump from the triple jump to pose a threat for the top spot.

Weight Events

The stronghold of SJSU competition for the past few years has been the weight events, although this year was uncertain with the graduation of two of San Jose's greatest. That was last fall. As of this spring, Coach Bullard has again come through to recruit top quality performers in both the shotput and discus and brought the weight events back into competition. Ken Kirschenman, undefeated last year and the 1972 JC State Shotput Champion from American River, has put the shot 56'9" and thrown the discus 165'2". He is sure of improving both of those marks this year. Scott Jenkins, back into competition last year after redshirting the previous year, made the SJSU honor roll by tossing the discus a distant 176'0" and is certain of going 190' this year. He will also take the shotput in hand this year. Dave Gherardi will also double. A 6'4", 260 pound freshman from St. Ignatius has posted several outstanding puts in last year's high school competition, and looks to be quite an addition to the program. Rich Comber, a dedicated and enthusiastic transfer from Grossmont, will toss the discus this year and provide a more than adequate back-up insurance on this strong team. He has tossed 161' and has the potential to top 170' in the first meet.

The javelin is in poor shape with only Rick Rhoades, a sophomore transfer from Grossmont, with any real experience behind him. He has thrown 225'5" and may be able to tack on an added 15' this season. Backing him up will be Jean Martinet, a freshman from Villanova with the potential to throw 175' this year, and Aldo Conji, a freshman from St. Ignatius HS.

The Coaches

Ernie Bullard--Head Track Coach

Ernie Bullard enters his second year as San Jose State head coach after working two years as assistant to Bud Winter.

He has established a reputation as one of the finest field event coaches in the country, speaking in numerous clinics. He is especially known for his success with pole vaulters, which was his specialty as an undergraduate at the University of Southern California. He has coached SJS vaulters Chris Papanicolaou (World Record Holder at 18-0), Sam Caruthers (17-1 1/2), Vic Dias (17-0), Bob Richards (16-7), Bob Slover (16-6), Frank Rock (16-1 1/2) and Russ Royal (16-7 3/4).

Bullard came to SUS in 1968 from Mesa Community College, where, in 1968 his team won the National Junior College Athletic Association championships. Included among his star athletes were half-miler Neville Myton, a member of the Jamaican Olympic team, intermediate

friend and foe alike. Rudy Krause, one of many outstanding high school prospects, has no collegiate track experience behind him, but has looked terrific in late pre-season workouts and has posted personal bests of 9:08 and 14:20, good enough to compete with the college veterans. Bob Ebert, a freshman prospect from the nationally-ranked Willow Glen cross-country team, has raced 9:08 and has already seen heavy competition when competing in the HS State Meet two years in succession. Jim Howell adds needed depth as a 9:28 two-mile best which should improve tremendously this year with the advent of speed training (he has run a 2:26:00 marathon which landed him in the Olympic trails). Backing up this foursome will be returnee Grover Prowell who could improve enough to add substantially to the program.

Jumping Events

The jumping events this year at San Jose State are tremendously good with every athlete improving as each day passes. The pole vault, traditionally SJSU's strongest field event, looks to be taking a second seat to a vastly improved corps of triple-jumpers, although the vaulters are still extremely strong. With vaults of 16'7 3/4" by Russ Royal, 16'1 1/2" by Frank Rock, 15'6" by Jack Van Kirk, and a 15'0" vault by newcomer Steve Baiocchi, SJSU could field one of the premier groups in the pole vault in California. Although the school record appears distant, it could be blasted away if one of the vaulters gets on a hot streak later on in the year.

The triple jump is by far the greatest group of jumpers in SJSU history with a trio all capable of soaring over 50' at one time. Montena Terry, a junior transfer from Stockton, has exploded for a personal best of 50'5" and will lead a talented duo of Larry Scott (49'6 1/2") and J.C. Ragster (49'4") into the recordbooks. Terry was the 1972 JC State Triple Jump Champion and could easily put together the three-step for over 51'. Scott improved 2 1/2" last year and landed on the honor roll, as did JC Ragster who propelled himself 1'5" last year over his previous year's mark. Ragster has the confidence and definite ability to cannonball over 52' and has set his hopes on closer to 53'.

It may take a New York trackman to break the SJSU high jump record of 7'0", or a SJSU veteran from Michigan may well do it instead. Greg Tinnin, the 1972 Junior College Athlete of the Year, makes his home in White Plains but has come to SJSU to compete after two star-studded years at Pasadena. He has leaped 7'0" and hopes to improve that and remain consistent enough to insure a possible spot in the NCAA Championships. That is, unless Bill Crawford, who makes his home in Flint, doesn't give him much competition; which is highly unlikely since he has flown 6'11 1/2" himself and is the defending champion. D. Jim Curtis, a junior transfer from American River, is not to be left out in the cold as he has jumped 6'10" to round out a particularly strong high jump team.

The long jump looks weak by comparison, but sports several impressive marks. Louie Wright (24'8"), a junior transfer from Bakersfield JC, should help to overcome the inconsistencies which perennially plague

The relay team is anyone's pick, with only Maas and Leek to be a certain pick for the 4-man team. In any event, the team has promise to shatter the 3:10.0 mark and win quite a number of races, including possibly the Conference Championship.

120 High Hurdles, 440 Intermediates

Without a doubt, this year's tremendously powerful high hurdles trio of Milt Whitley (13.7), Bruce Leek (13.7 H.S.) and Greg Tinnen (14.0) will make an impression on everyone whom they come in contact with. This is the most talented and deepest of any of SJSU past teams and several one-two-three sweeps are inevitable if each performs to par. Whitley, a strong performer last year for San Jose, placed second on the all-time honor roll and has his hopes up as he sets his sights for the school record. Giving him a constant battle will be Leek, who will also show his speed in the mile relay team, and was named last year to the Golden West All-American list while at San Jose City College. Tinnen will also compete while specializing in another event and poses a threat to win anytime.

The intermediates are in good shape with the highly competitive sophomore, Frank Mercer, posting a best of 53.2 last year and will more than likely race closer to 52.5 this year. Senior Larry Glenn (51.9) may be injured and not able to compete, but taking up the slack is Lloyd Kaster, a junior transfer from Grossmont Junior College who has run 54.3, and Denny Cogburn (55.2) who has the potential to surprise a few people.

880, Mile

With the State High School Mile Champion running in the mile for San Jose this year, it appears that this year's team would be fairly strong, which, to the contrary, it may not be. Mark Shilling from Garden Grove High posted a 4:05.4 mile victory last year in the finals and looks as though he will go close to 4:02.0 this year if late pre-season workouts mean anything. He has tremendous late surging strength as evidenced by his personal best mile splits - 2:10 followed by a 1:56 - which enabled him to beat his opponent by 1/10 of a second. Joining him will be Glenn Harmatz, a sturdy and quickly improving junior transfer from Long Beach, who should be able to crack his 4:11 personal best by a wide margin.

The 880 poses somewhat of a dilemma, as three men are all gathered around 1:52 somewhere, which means that a two second improvement is needed if the runners are to place consistently. Harmatz (1:43.0) also runs this event, and will be joined by a junior college transfer from Grossmont by way of Greece, Chris Giannoulas (1:52.0) who hopes to hurtle below the 1:50 mark this season. The standout however will be Al Baker (1:51.5), if he can get himself into form after missing on improvement last year. Baker has the natural ability to drop below 1:50 and should be able to this year while carrying the major 880 burden.

Two - Three - Six Mile

The experience, talent, and willingness to compete are all here as the distance crew takes off to conquer a few SJSU rivals this year. Led by Leo DeVoe (9:15, 14:28, 19:45), an outstanding veteran and good competitor, this year's team could get something accomplished and surprise a few people,

The field events, a perennial stronghold for the Spartans, is no exception this year. Coached by head coach, Bullard, every field event, with the exception of one, is almost phenomenally strong. With the triple jump, for example lies the strongest ever as three jumpers have rocketed over 49', with the added incentive that the 52'3/4" school record may fall this season. The one exception is again the javelin, where a lot of improvising will have to take place as only one thrower is over the 200' mark.

The Spartans face another challenging school this year, with dual meets against Oregon State, Long Beach State, Nebraska, Washington, and Stanford. The invitational schedule is also representative and should supply some good competition.

Following is an analysis of each area:

100,220,440 Relay

The 1972 State Junior College 220 Champion comes to San Jose State in the form of Vince Breddell, a junior transfer from San Diego Mesa Junior College. His clockings of 9.5 and 20.9 should give some indication as to the strength of this year's sprint team - excellent, providing that everyone stays healthy. Joining Breddell are three sprinters who should prove to everyone that San Jose is back to the national spotlight in the sprints; Bobby Hamilton (9.5, 21.0), Ken Doutherd (9.5), and William Walker (21.3 relay). Hamilton, a junior, transfer from Compton Junior College, should provide adequate back-up and depth, and may pull a few surprise victories with his speed as Breddell and he will be the top contenders in the SJSU 220 spot. Doutherd, now in his senior year and second season with SJSU, will bring his speed to par with many of the conference's best sprinters, and will probably lead off the 440 Relay team.

The relay team at this time appears to be Doutherd, Breddell, Hamilton, and probably Walker, and has a great opportunity to crack the 41.0 mark if all goes well. If any injuries occur, Dennis Maas (21.5) may be called on to compete in the relay team.

440, Mile Relay

This year's quarter-mile squad is so talented, that room enough to compete will be hard to find as Dennis Maas (47.5), Tom Spunk (47.3), and Ron Hickerson (47.5) lead a six-man group capable of surprising quite a few people this season. Maas, a senior this year after transferring as a junior from Golden West, placed third in the 1972 PCAA Championships. He generally starts the season slowly, and gradually builds toward its end, but this year has his sights set on good performances from the start. Sprink, a junior transfer from Pasadena, has the ability to run away with a few 440 races this season, and a great chance to make the SJSU honor roll. Hickerson, a member of the same team as Sprink last year, is looking forward to garnering a few points this year. Among the rest of the talented sextet is Roger Stewart (48.1), who ran his personal best at Modesto Junior College and was hampered last year by several injuries, is expected to be back in form and ready to race. Bruce Leek (48.5 relay leg) and Louis Wright (47.6) are also expected to see plenty of action in both the open quarter and the mile relay.

1973 SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY PREVIEW

San Jose State's 1973 track prospects look much brighter this year in lieu of last year's dismal, and better forgotten, season; and may even prove bright enough to capture the PCAA championships in May, that is, providing that certain key personnel perform to their potential.

Most of SJSU's hopes of returning to the spotlight lie in several outstanding junior college transfers, although a handful of experienced veterans and promising high school trackmen also combine together to form a solid nucleus for this year's team. Head coach Ernie Bullard did an outstanding job in luring some of California's premier junior college athletes, while assistant coach Don Riggs has molded a distance crew from some of the best high school prospects in the nation. From this depth in performance, it is easily seen how SJSU plans to win a conference title from Long Beach State, the trophy-carriers the past two years.

This major emphasis in rebuilding this year was in the weight events, where last year, graduates Chuck Sherman and Greg Born carried the burden, and in the distance races with the loss of the services of SJSU greats Mark Evans, Maury Greer, and Gary Berthiaume. It appears that the effort proved successful, as the aspiration was to not only provide quality, but good depth in quality as well. In the weight events, several returnees coupled with a high school prospect and an outstanding junior college transfer should provide all the muscle needed to pick up important points during the meets. The distance program, although not overpowering in cross-country, still possesses three veterans and two very promising high school newcomers, enough to strengthen a depleted roster.

One area which appears considerably strengthened is the sprints, with the 100 yard dash sporting three sprinters at 9.5. Barring inconsistencies, the 220 may be strong if a trio of transfers can improve and stay healthy, with the 440 relay team carrying the definite possibility of performing under a clocking of 41.0. The quarter-mile, with injuries blazing away at last year's team faster than a few of the actual times, have five men capable of consistently running 47.5 or better with the advent of some new blood in junior transfers from around the state. All in all, this should combine a four-some capable of breaking the 3:10 mile relay barrier consistently, that is, barring further bad luck.

The middle distances are definitely one of the weaker spots on the SJSU team, although several harriers, transfers and high school prospects alike as well as veterans, have a chance to glory if times improve. Leading the 880 men is veteran Al Baker at 1:51.5, with another veteran and a junior college transfer right behind. The mile run introduces to the San Jose campus the 1972 State High School Mile Champion; but the race itself lacks depth on the roster. The steeplechase will introduce two newcomers to the program, with hopes of placing on a regular basis when the event is run.

One of the strongest fields in SJSU history in the high hurdles unveils itself shortly with a trio of very capable runners all capable of placing on the all-time hurdles honor roll. The intermediates pose a slight problem as the difference in personal bests of the four-man squad vary greatly, but they should be able to consistently place high in all of the dual meets if the honor roll placers, sophomore Frank Mercer and senior Larry Glenn, can stay healthy and compete well on an even par.
